Out At The Lake

Lake Depth--November 19, 2001--37.42 feet

The office rain gauge showed a 3 day sum of .63 in. Sunday night the storm brought a little sleet, but the moisture didn't register.

Kent Ruble caught the walleye more or less accidentally, as he was bringing in his line baited with shad when the big walleye struck it. Kent had already caught a 13.5-pound blue catfish that afternoon, but it was the walleye that excited him. A year or two ago another walleye of that size was caught.

If Kent had tied for the record, it didn't last long. Sunday while Jim was napping during the Cowboy's game, the doorbell rang. It was two men from Stinnett wanting a walleye weighed and measured. They had caught a 10-pound, 29 inch walleye.

As a 11.8-pound walleye was caught by The Texas Parks and Wildlife men as they trapped the fish a year or so ago, we know there are even larger ones in the Lake just waiting to be caught.

Campers in a tent spent Saturday night at the Park. Jim wondered if they were there to watch the Leonid meteor shower. He set his alarm and watched for

awhile. The eagles, sandhill cranes, Canada geese, and snow geese are all visible at times. Mornings and late afternoons are good times to look. This is also a good time to see the deer, as more bucks are visible.

"Black-Tailed Ferrets Scheduled For Reintroduction To Colorado" was a headline in the Nov. 15 Livestock Weekly. Most ranchers have been unhappy with the reintroduction of wolves and grizzly bears, but I think they will watch this one without getting as upset. These ferrets were thought to be extinct on the Great Plains, but in 1982, a Meeteetse, Wyoming rancher had a dead one brought to his doorstep by his dog. He called the authorities. Eighteen ferrets from his prairie dog towns were captured by the Wyoming Game and Fish Department before sylvatic plague wiped out the prairie dog colonies.

Later the U. S. Fish and Wildlife took charge of them and built an \$8 million complex near Fort Collins, Colorado, for their home. As of now, there are estimated to be 450 ferrets in prairie dog colonies in South Dakota, Montana, Arizona and Utah. The goal is to establish 1500 free-ranging adults in at least 10 populations. Out of the 3700 ferrets in captivity, they have 500 ready for release. The first group that was released in Central Wyoming was killed in a few days by coyotes, badgers, and birds. Officials now realize that preconditioning is now a must before release.

Lynx Hammer Hale Center

The Spearman Lynx traveled to Kimbrough Memorial Stadium in Canyon on Friday to play the first round of the high school playoffs in bi-district action against the Hale Center Owls. This was an absolutely perfect night for football as there was not any wind and a relatively warm night considering it is the middle of November. Little did Hale Center know, but they were in for a major thrashing from the Lynx. Spearman came ready to play after a lack luster game a week ago against Panhandle. The Lynx held the Owls to two first downs the entire game and approximately 45 total yards on offense as they crushed Hale Center 42-0 to advance to the area round of the playoffs against Hamlin that will be played next Friday in Childress at 7:30 p.m.

The Lynx won the toss and elected to receive from the north end. After making one first down, the Lynx had to punt. The Owls went three and out on their first possession and had to punt the ball back to the Lynx.

Spearman started this possession from their own 41 yard line with 8:43 left in the first quarter. They kept the ball on the ground and drove down to the Hale Center 25. On 3rd and 6 from the 21, Lynx quarterback Kevin Beedy found Lance Baker, who had beat his man deep, down the sideline for the first TD of the night with 4:03 left in the first quarter. Eduard Vasquez' PAT kick was good and the Lynx led 7-0.

After Hale Center went three and out again, the Lynx took over at their own 36 yard line. On 2nd down, Beedy found J.D. Schufeldt open over the middle, who hauled in the pass and was brought down at the Owls' 40 yard line. The Lynx stayed on the ground and moved down to the 25 with a first and 10. On 3rd and 6 from the 10, John Brock ran for a first down, down to the 4. Two plays later, Brock ran off tackle for 5 yards out for the score with 9:42 left in the 2nd quarter. The PAT failed after the

Lynx were penalized 10 yards for an illegal chop block. That made the score Lynx 13 and Hale Center 0.

Hale Center started their next drive on their own 30 yard line. On 3rd and 7 from their own 33, quarterback Jacob Rieff threw over the middle, but Spearman's Kevin Beedy was there to intercept it at the Lynx 42 and he ran it back to the Owl's 35. The Lynx were in the holiday spirit because what they take away, they give back. On 2nd and 10, Beedy was looking for Brock over the middle and Hale Center's Willie Joe Johnson was there to make the interception at the Hale Center 20 yard line with 7:55 left in the second quarter. That was about the only mistake Beedy had all night as he had an outstanding night!

Spearman started on their own 46 after the Owls went three and out again. On 3rd and 13 from the Hale Center 47, the Lynx ran a draw to Eduard Vasquez and he had a huge hole to run through. He ran to the Owl's 24 for a first down to keep the drive going. On 3rd and 10 from the Lynx 17, Spearman ran a screen pass to Brock, who had nothing but daylight and then he got a great block from Coy Herrington, and he ran it in for the touchdown with 1:08 left before intermission. The PAT failed and the Lynx increased their lead to 19-0. The Lynx were not through scoring before halftime. Hale Center had the ball on their own 15 with :59 seconds left in the 2nd quarter. On the first play from scrimmage, Schufeldt broke through the line and sacked quarterback Rieff back at the 5 yard line. On the next play, Schufeldt, Homer Munoz and Marty Miesner sandwiched Willie Joe in the end zone for a safety with :35 seconds left. That made the score 21-0 in favor of the Lynx.

The Lynx still were not through with Hale Center before halftime. Spearman had the ball on their own 31 after a nice return by Colton Miller on the free kick. Spearman quickly moved the ball

down to the 7 yard line with a first and goal. On the next play, Beedy hit Vasquez in the flat and Eduard ran it in for yet another TD before halftime. The PAT kick was good and Spearman led at the half 28-0.

The second half was much of the same as in the first half. The Lynx dominated on offense and defense. Hale Center got their first 1st down of the night with 10:25 left in the third quarter. That drive was short-lived as the Lynx held them on 4th and 3 at their own 44 yard line. The Lynx also came up short on their next possession as the Owls held them on 4th down.

Later in the 3rd quarter with the score still 28-0, Hale Center fumbled and Spearman's Colton Miller recovered at the Owl's 45 with 3:45 left in the 3rd quarter. John Brock ran for a first down on 4th and 4 to keep the drive alive down to the 21. A few plays later, Brock ran around the right end from 4 yards out for another touchdown with 10:34 left in the 4th quarter. The PAT kick was good and the Lynx increased their lead to 35-0.

Hale Center got their second first down of the night with 9:05 left in the game when they threw deep down the sideline to Larry Espinosa. This was after Schufeldt smashed the quarterback for a 7 yard loss. Big hit J.D.! On the next play after the interception, Kevin Beedy intercepted Rieff's pass at the Lynx 44. Miller broke loose on the first play from scrimmage and ran to the Owl's 31. Two plays later, Miller ran to the 8 yard line

with a first and goal. Hale Center's defense stiffened and the Lynx had a 4th and goal from the 3. Miller ran up the middle for the final TD of the night with 6:14 left in the game. The PAT kick was good and the score was 42-0 and that was also the final score.

Some of the younger players got into the game and did a great job. Clete Vanderburg broke the line and got a quarterback sack. Paul Bynum also sacked the quarterback on the last play of the game. Our offensive and defensive line did an outstanding job and deserve a lot of the credit. The Lynx played very well as a team!

We are very proud of all you and we are looking forward to the challenge next week against Hamlin.

Upon graduation, Woolley plans to teach overseas in a private Christian school.

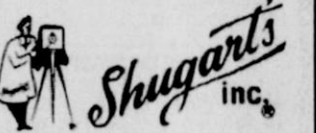

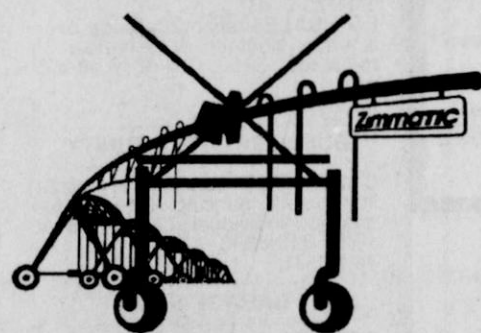

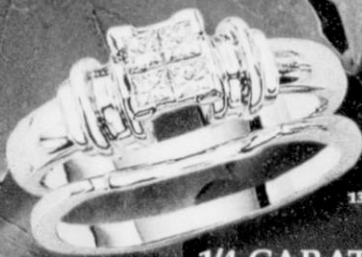
