

# Ag Outlook Conference Set for March 6 in Vernon

VERNON - Cattle producers can build their short- and long term perspectives on commodity markets and prices, current farm bill legislation and marketing techniques by attending the 200 Ag Outlook Conference slated for March 6.

"There have been a lot of ups and downs in the cattle industry/market during the past two years alone," said Stan Bevers, Texas Cooperative Extension agricultural economist. "One goal of this conference is to help provide some perspective or those past movements and take a look at where the industry might be headed in the future. We will also take a look at other commodity markets and pending farm bill legislation."

The conference site is Texas A&M University's Agricultural Research and Extension Center, six miles southwest of Vernon Registration costs \$50 per person and includes lunch and conference materials. Bevers said participants can pay at the door, but he encourages early registration to guarantee both lunch and a set of materials

This event is part of Extension's nationally recognized Master Marketer program - which helps producers learn how to market their commodities more effectively.

David Weaber, Cattle-Fax director of research and special projects, will headline the morning program which begins at 9 a.m. Bevers said Weaber will provide a cattle market outlook and an overview of prospects for the entire livestock sector.

During the afternoon session, Extension economists will cover a wide range of topics, such as: · Statewide Marketing Club Update, Rob Borchardt-Vernon. 2002 Wheat Market Outlook. Mark Waller-College Station.

· Farm Bill Update, Joe Outlaw-College Station.

The First Runner Up for Ms. Hansford Manor was Alice Kirby.



Blowin' In The Wind

Twelve! A full dozen. Maybe not too impressive a number when talking about eggs, but when one considers it's twelve windmills of Mr. Buchanan's collection that have been restored and put up, the number, at least for Southwestern Pioneer Windmill Association members, is a number that has taken a long time to reach.

The SPWA members on Friday, February 15, put up the Butler ouble-gear mill that had been taken down for restoration. There are eleven of Mr. Buchanan's mills in the park, and one was returned to his farm and erected to mark the site of the original collection and to allow Mr. Buchanan an opportunity to enjoy still having a mill.

There are three mills left of the original collection to be restored. They are a ten-foot Star, a twelve-foot Eclipse and the 18-foot Railroad Eclipse.

With about three months left before the International Windmillers' Trade Fair to be held in Spearman, the SPWA is working hard to finish restoration of the collection. All three mills have been brought to the SPWA's barn, disassembled and plans made for the restoration of them. On Friday, the pumping mechanism of the Star was taken to Ken Schneider's welding shop for intricate and critical repairs to be made. The Star has a wooden wheel and Orville Latham and Don Reed have begun plans for cutting out and assembling the wheel. Wooden tail vanes must also be built. Everything must be painted and a new tower built.

The Butler double-geared mill that was put up last had to have extensive restoration. The cast iron housing of the mechanism was badly worn by the main shaft which itself was nearly worn in two, a gear was broken, another gear was missing, and a blade in the wheel was missing. J. D. Wilbanks poured babbitt into the worn area of the housing, built a new shaft, welded the gear, the lost gear was found, Walter Woolley cut out a new blade, and Terry Schneider assembled the new blade into the wheel, painted the wheel and tips, painted the pump-ing mechanism and lettered the tail

So a mill that if it had been a horse would have been euthanized, because of its rarity and history was restored to display quality and hopefully will be around for a long time. The Butler is probably close to a hundred years old and came from Mrs. Buchanan's uncle's ranch in Oklahoma. As some of you know, I taught high school English for many years or as my students would have informed me "many, many years," so I have a built-in audience of good-natured critics who promised to grade each column. Saturday afternoon was beautiful, and that encouraged many fishermen to try their luck. Jim did not hear of any good catches. He, too, tried his luck, but he couldn't find them any better than the oth-

He began noticing the mussels at the edge of the lake. The water was clear and smooth as glass, enabling him to track a mussel. The little underwater track led to a mussel that was upright in the water, but resting on the hinged side horizontally. Something protruded from the slightly opened shell.

In July of 1998, the column carried some material on freshwater mussels, because Jim had seen a child holding mussel shells. We had been waiting for some evidence that the bivalves had moved into the Lake from Palo Duro Creek. Now they can be found in many parts of the Lake.

When this strange little creature that lives between 2 shells wants to travel it protrudes a foot and travels with it, although I am not sure how. This heavy muscular foot is also used for digging, holding-fast, and, in some species, flipping itself upright.



New name; same volunteer service organization.

Thank you, in advance, for your donation. Christmas In Action has been a cooperative community effort from its beginning, and it requires that same kind of effort to continue.

It is hard for many to imagine that there are homeowners in America who have no hot water, no electricity, no indoor plumbing and holes in their walls that are large enough to walk through. It is hard to believe because we consider such unsafe living conditions to be symptomatic of developing nations - not of a nation that is as powerful and advanced as the United States.

• 5.5 Million elderly and/or disabled Americans live in substandard housing

• Nearly half of all poor homeowners spent the majority of their income on housing in 1993

• One-third of Americans will be older than age 65 and chronically ill or disabled by the end of 2001

In 1973, caring people in Midland, Texas, led by an oil scout named Bobby Trimble, saw that many of their low- and fixedincome neighbors were indeed living in such deplorable conditions and decided to take action. Volunteers are recruited to rehabilitate deteriorating homes in their community. The name "Christmas in April" was conferred in Midland when one of the early recipients likened the help to "Christmas in April."

In 2000, the name "Christmas in April" was changed to "Christmas in Action."

Who We Help? Christmas in Action provides assistance to people who own their own home but who, because of physical limitation or income, are not able to cover the costs of home repair. Typically, these individuals have a disability and/or are elderly, but low-income families and non-profit facilities such as schools, shelters and daycare centers are also included.

When We Work? After months of extensive planning and preparation, Christmas in Action culminates on National Rebuilding Day, usually the last Saturday in April.

How It Works: Christmas in Action takes its cue from the old fashioned idea of "barn raising," with as many as 75 skilled and unskilled volunteers assigned to a particular project. Homeowners are frequently amazed at the sheer number of people who come out to lend them a helping hand. They are even more amazed at the massive amount of work that can be accomplished by caring volunteers in a short period of time!

Why It Works: Christmas in Action does more with less. Every dollar spent is leveraged with over \$4 in donated goods and services. It works because it's neighborhelping-neighbor to build safer and stronger communities.

Who Sponsors Christmas In Action? Funds come from corporations, individuals, labor organizations, foundations, civic organizations and religious organizations interested in helping build a better community.

How Are Homeowners Selected? The selection process takes place locally. Qualified homeowners are low-income, elderly or disabled, and unable to make the needed repairs themselves. Referrals come from a vari-
