The Hansford County Livestock Show was held on Friday and Saturday, February 12 and 13, 1999 at the Hansford County Barn in Spearman.

Friday's show began at 7:00 a.m. with the weighing in of all steers and lambs. The grand opening of the show was held at 9:00 a.m. The lamb show began at 9:15 a.m., with the steer show immediately following. The weighing of pigs was held from 1:30-2:30 p.m.

Saturday began at 8:00 a.m. with the Swine Show, followed at 1:00 p.m. by the Judging Contest. The floor prices were auctioned at 6:30 p.m., with the presentation of the Showmanship and Commercial Steer Awards. Immediately following the presentation of awards, the auction began. The sell order was lamb, swine, and steer.

This year's show set a new record with sales over \$150,000.
