Ahmed Iqbal, M.D. is Board Certified in Interal Medicine. He has been practicing medicine in Hansford County for one year. Born in Pakistan 35 years ago, he is one of seven children and has four brothers and two sisters.

Dr. Iqbal's home town was very small, and the people had to travel long distances for medical treatment. He was studious and had always known he wanted to be a physician. It is his nature to be caring, and he loves to help people.

He went to medical school in Karachi, Pakistan, and completed a residency at Texas Tech School of Medicine in El Paso, Texas.

Dr. Iqbal met his wife Azmat in medical school, and they became study partners. They married in 1987. 

The Bricklayer's Story

Dear Sir, I am writing in response to your request for additional information in Block #3 of the accident reporting form. I put "Poor Planning" as the cause of my accident. You asked for a fuller explanation and I trust the following details will be sufficient.

I am a bricklayer by trade. On the day of the accident, I was working alone on the roof of a new six-story building. When I completed my work, I found I had some bricks left over which when weighed later were found to weigh 240 lbs. Rather than carry the bricks down by hand, I decided to lower them in a barrel by using a pulley which was attached to the side of the building at the sixth floor.

Securing the rope at ground level, I went up to the roof, swung the barrel out and loaded the bricks into it. Then I went down and untied the rope, holding it tightly to insure a slow descent of the 240 lbs of bricks. You will note on the accident reporting form that my weight is 135 lbs. Due to my surprise at being jerked off the ground so suddenly, I lost my presence of mind and forgot to let go of the rope. Needless to say, I proceeded at a rapid rate up the side of the building.

In the vicinity of the third floor, I met the barrel which was now proceeding downward at an equally impressive speed. This explains the fractured skull, minor abrasions and the broken collarbone, as listed in Section 3, accident reporting form.

Slowed only slightly, ascent, not stopping until the fingers of my right hand were two knuckles deep into the pulley which I mentioned in Paragraph 2 of this correspondence. Fortunately by this time I had regained my presence of mind and was able to hold tightly to the rope, in spite of the excruciating pain I was now beginning to

At approximately the same time, however, the barrel of bricks hit the ground-and the bottom fell out of the barrel. Now devoid of the weight of the bricks, the barrel weighed approximately 50 lbs.

I refer you again to my weight. As you might imagine, I began a rapid descent down the side of the building. In the vicinity of the third floor, I met the barrel coming up. This accounts for the two fractured ankles, broken tooth and severe lacerations of my legs and

Here my luck began to change slightly. The encounter with the barrel seemed to slow me enough to lessen my injuries when I fell into the pile of bricks and fortunately only three vertebrae were cracked.

I am sorry to report, however, as I lay there on the pile of bricks, in pain, unable to move and watching the empty barrel six stories above me, I again lost my composure and presence of mind and let go of the rope.





Focus On The Family

QUESTION: Do you ever favor removing a child from one school to transferring him to another? Dr. Dobson: Yes, there are times when a change of

schools - or even a change of teachers within a school can be in the child's best interest Educators are reluctant to approve these transfers, for obvious reasons, although the possibility should be

considered when the situation warrants.

For example, there are occasions when a young student runs into social problems that can be resolved best by giving him a "clean start" someplace else. Furthermore, schools vary tremendously in their difficulty; some are located in higher socioeconomic areas where a majority of the children are much more intelligent than would ordinarily be expected. The mean IQ in schools of this nature may fall between 115-120.

What happens, then to a child with average ability in such a setting? Although he might have competed successfully in an ordinary school, he is in the lower 15 percent at Einstein Elementary.

My point is this: success is not absolute, it is relative. A child does not ask, "How am I doing?" but rather, "How am I doing compared to everyone else?" Little Johnny may grow up thinking he is a dummy when he would have been an intellectual leader in a less competitive setting.

Thus, if a child is floundering in one academic environment for whatever reason, the solution might involve a transfer to a more suitable classroom.




On Sunday came the announcement that Mideast countries were donating 300 millions dollars worth of arms to the other side-so again it is unequal.



Quite a few farmers and ranchers did cut the beargrass and bring it in. It made an excellent feed, high in protein, and with enough moisture that he often saw piles of it steaming as it began to

Howard also told of Dillard Easterwood who lived north of Guymon cutting Russian thistles for hay. He then suggsted I call Jim Deakin, a relative, and see what he might add as a relative of Dillard.

Jim had not heard these stories, but added some from his own experience. When he was young, his family had a dairy near Guymon. When the yucca bloomed the dairy cows were wild about the blossoms, runing from plant to plant to eat them, but they gave the milk an off taste. He also said his folks sometimes cooked the young Russian thisles for greens, lambsquarter, in the spring as many of us did, and still
