Gruver Health Fair Nearing

Take charge of your health and attend the Gruver Health Fair. The fair will be held Thursday, November 7, from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at Medical Clinic in Gruver. Hansford County Hospital District will be sponsoring the event.

Medical screenings will include blood pressure, hearing, and the SMA-20 blood screen. Anyone wanting to have the SMA-20 blood screen should fast overnight. Flu shots and mammogram coupons will also be available. Persons who are Medicare eligible will not be charged for any of the services. Charges for those not on Medicare will include: \$20.00 for the SMA-20 blood screening, and \$10.00 for a flu shot.

Coupons for mammograms will be distributed entitling participants to a \$48.00 mammogram, if appointment is made by November 30. This price is a 50% discount off of the regular price charged for mammograms and does include the radiologist fee.

The Hansford County Doctor Retention Committee sponsored a recognition/anniversary luncheon in honor of Dr. Iqbal and Dr. Tamayo on Thursday, October 24th.

Ahmed Iqbal, M.D. is Board Certified in Internal Medicine. He has been practicing medicine in Hansford County for one year. Born in Pakistan 35 years ago, he is one of seven children and has four brothers and two sisters.

Dr. Iqbal's home town was very small, and the people had to travel long distances for medical treatment. He was studious and had always known he wanted to be a physician. It is his nature to be caring, and he loves to help people.

He went to medical school in Karachi, Pakistan, and completed a residency at Texas Tech School of Medicine in El Paso, Texas.

Dr. Iqbal met his wife Azmat in medical school, and they became study partners. They married in 1987. Azmat was a gynecologist in Pakistan, but now that she is in the United States, her interests have turned to working in family practice some day. Right now, she stays very busy taking care of their three children. Their son Kamran is eight years old and in the third grade. Kamran has two younger sisters: Kanwal, who is three years old, and one year old Nida.

Dr. Iqbal enjoys jogging, fishing, and tennis; his wife loves reading, studying medical books, and jogging.

The Iqbal family find Hansford County to be "a wonderful place with nice, gentle, respectful people -- the kids are happy -- it is nice not to have to worry about them when they go out to play." The Iqbals are especially impressed with our school system.

Raul C. Tamayo, M.D., a Board Certified Pediatrician, came to Hansford County a year ago from Chicago. The 43 year old physician was born in the Philippines and raised in Calasiao, a town about the size of Spearman. He has four older sisters, three of whom live in the United States.

Her hobbies include the piano, interior decorating, and orchid gardening. Dr. Tamayo also enjoys gardening and reading.

When asked about his impression of Hansford County, Dr. Tamayo said, "The community has been very receptive. I also appreciate the quiet, the climate, and all the nice people." Dr. Tamayo's goal is to build a flourishing pediatric practice and a fully-developed well-child program in Hansford County.

The Gruver Greyhounds gave the Vega Longhorns a good old fashioned pounding Friday night at the Greyhound Stadium. The final score was a shutout 48-0, bringing the Greyhounds to a 2-1 District 1-1A record.

The Greyhounds got off to a fast start with two touchdowns in the first quarter of play and did not slow down for the rest of the game.

Gruver posted 310 yards rushing and 125 yards passing for a total of 435 yards, compared to Vega's 89 yards. The Hounds gathered 26 first downs while Vega had only

John Duncan brought home a touchdown on an 11 yard run in the third quarter and Victor Luciano wrapped it up with touchdown on a two yard run in the fourth.

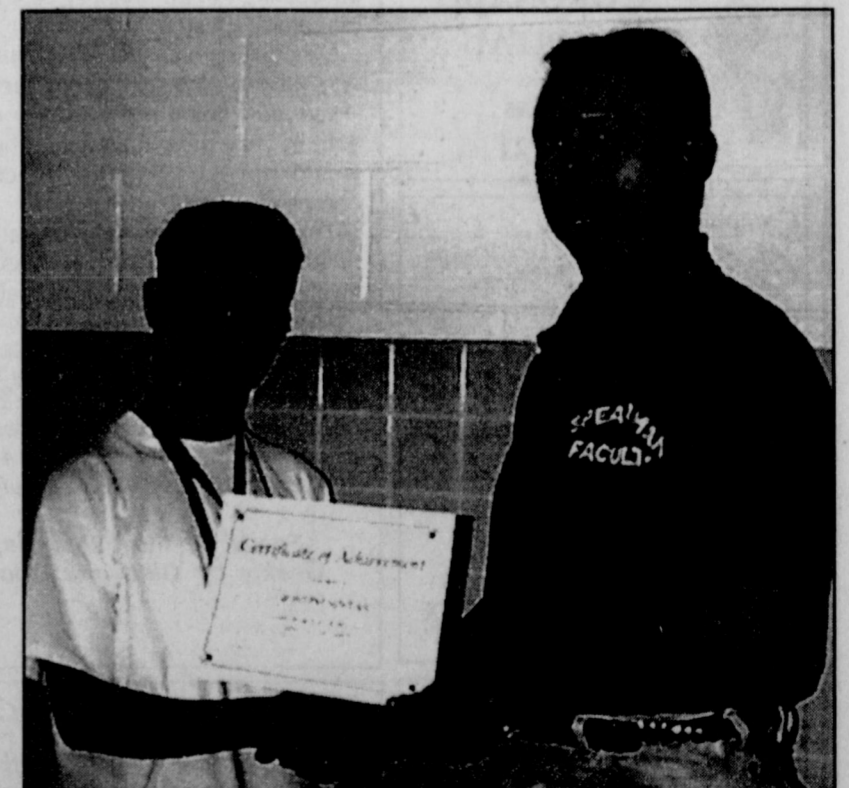

A bricklayer filed for workman's compensation. This is an addendum to his application.

The Bricklayer's Story

Dear Sir,
I am writing in response to your request for additional information in Block #3 of the accident reporting form. I put "Poor Planning" as the cause of my accident. You asked for a fuller explanation and I trust the following details will be sufficient.

I am a bricklayer by trade. On the day of the accident, I was working alone on the roof of a new six-story building. When I completed my work, I found I had some bricks left over which when weighed later were found to weigh 240 lbs. Rather than carry the bricks down by hand, I decided to lower them in a barrel by using a pulley which was attached to the side of the building at the sixth floor.

Securing the rope at ground level, I went up to the roof, swung the barrel out and loaded the bricks into it. Then I went down and untied the rope, holding it tightly to insure a slow descent of the 240 lbs of bricks. You will note on the accident reporting form that my weight is 135 lbs. Due to my surprise at being jerked off the ground so suddenly, I lost my presence of mind and forgot to let go of the rope. Needless to say, I proceeded at a rapid rate up the side of the building.

In the vicinity of the third floor, I met the barrel which was now proceeding downward at an equally impressive speed. This explains the fractured skull, minor abrasions and the broken collarbone, as listed in Section 3, accident reporting form.

Slowed only slightly, I continued my rapid ascent, not stopping until the fingers of my right hand were two knuckles deep into the pulley which I mentioned in Paragraph 2 of this correspondence. Fortunately by this time I had regained my presence of mind and was able to hold tightly to the rope, in spite of the excruciating pain I was now beginning to experience.

At approximately the same time, however, the barrel of bricks hit the ground and the bottom fell out of the barrel. Now devoid of the weight of the bricks, the barrel weighed approximately 50 lbs.

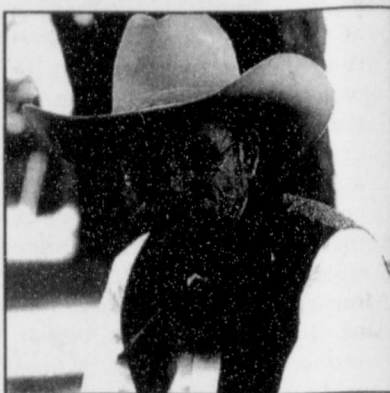
I refer you again to my weight. As you might imagine, I began a rapid descent down the side of the building. In the vicinity of the third floor, I met the barrel coming up. This accounts for the two fractured ankles, broken tooth and severe lacerations of my legs and lower body.

Here my luck began to change slightly. The encounter with the barrel seemed to slow me enough to lessen my injuries when I fell into the pile of bricks and fortunately only three vertebrae were cracked.

I am sorry to report, however, as I lay there on the pile of bricks, in pain, unable to move and watching the empty barrel six stories above me, I again lost my composure and presence of mind and let go of the rope.

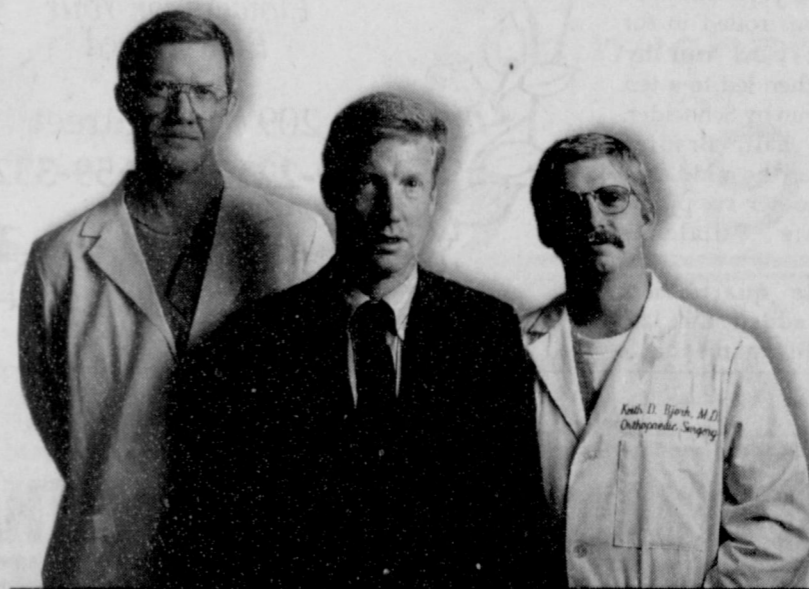

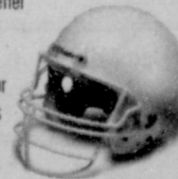

Out At The Lake

Lake Depth--October 28, 1996--47 feet and 3 inches

Last week we were down 10 inches, but this week we are only down 8 inches.

Jim reports a very slow week with only one R.V. The eagles are still around, and the ducks are increasing daily. Sandhill cranes are being seen in the fields, but they are not stopping at the Lake. Today, when I was in Spearman, I forgot to check the playa lake just east of Spearman, where they were so thick last year.

Howard and Mickey Nash loaned me the book by Judge F. Hiner Dale of Guymon, *An Oklahoma Lawyer*, that I quoted from last week about the prairie dogs being sold as pets in 1913 and 1914. When I asked them about the soapweeds that were being cut and sold in the same drouthy years, they hadn't heard anyone mention why, but Howard told me a soapweed story of the early 1930's when the drouth began and the dust storms rolled in.

Ed, Orville, and Howard Nash were partners in the Nash

Brothers Implements at Guymon at that time. Orville suggested that they advertise that they would grind soapweed for cattle feed with their John Deere Letz grinder for a nominal price. Quite a few farmers and ranchers did cut the beargrass and bring it in. It made an excellent feed, high in protein, and with enough moisture that he often saw piles of it steaming as it began to ferment.

Howard also told of Dillard Easterwood who lived north of Guymon cutting Russian thistles for hay. He then suggested I call Jim Deakin, a relative, and see what he might add as a relative of Dillard.

Jim had not heard these stories, but added some from his own experience. When he was young, his family had a dairy near Guymon. When the yucca bloomed the dairy cows were wild about the blossoms, runing from plant to plant to eat them, but they gave the milk an off taste. He also said his folks sometimes cooked the young Russian thistles for greens, lambsquarter, in the spring as many of us did, and still do.

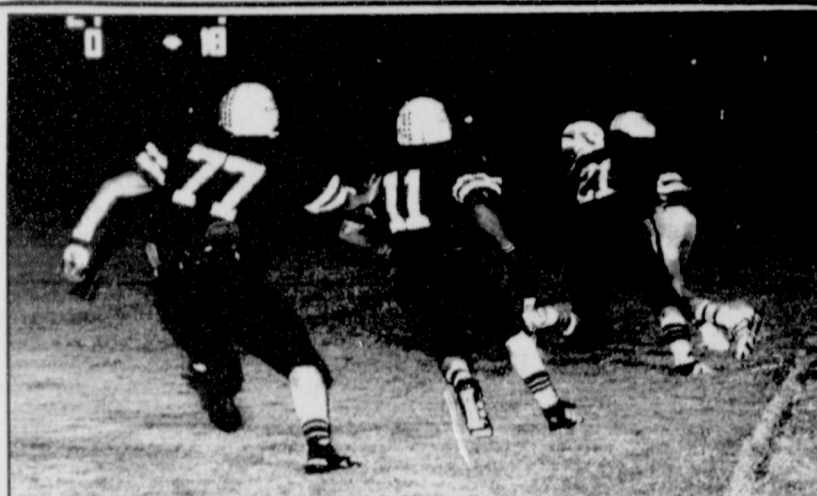
Michael Witten carried the ball 14 times for 71 yards. Michael Lusby picked up 10 yards on 4 carries. Britt Savage had 3

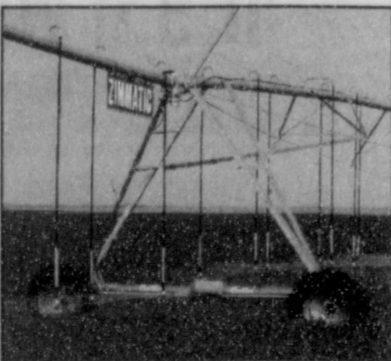

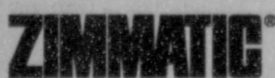
