September 1 at their home 18 miles northCast of Gruver, Deanna heard a noise of

found a skunk intent on killing a litter of found a skunk intent on killing a litter of
kittens near their barn. As she scared the
sk er kittens near their barn. As she scared the
skunk away from the kittens, it would run
at at her for a short distance and then return
to the kittens. Finally she got to the kittens. Finally she got the skunk in
a nearby irrigation pipe and penned it
there by stopping both ends. Rex came
her there by stopping both ends. Rex came
home as she turned to see about the kit-
tens tens. Both handled the slobbery kittens,
finding one dead and two in critical condl-
t inn ton.
Rex called Dr. Leta. A report of probable rabies gets the persons affected in a well
thought out system. The veterinarian and
and thought out system. The veterinarian and
all the others they talked to said when you
saw a skunk saw a skunk in broad day light acting in a
strange fashion you could bet it was rabid.
His strange fashion you could bet it was rabid,
His advice was to kill the skunk, being
careful not to shoot it in the head careful not to shoot it in the head, and then
to bring the remains to his office. From there it was sent by a deputy of the sheriffs department to Canyon and then
on to the Texas A\&M lab. By Wednesday,
Wed they were notified that the skunk had test-
ed positive for rabies, and they should start ed positive for rabies, and they should start
on the shots. Both Deanna and Rex had
cut cuts on their hands, making them candi-
date dates for infection. First they were given
shots of gammon globulin that are based on
body weight. shorty weight. Rex said that was the really
body
painful one. In his case the shot was bro-
ken in two parts ken in two parts because of the volume.
The actual rabies shots are more like aking a flu shot.
The sad part
The sad part of the story for Rex and
Deanna was that the state required all 24 Deanna was that the state required ail 24
of their barn cats to be killed. They were
wild. It meant someone had wild. It meant someone had to shoot them.

Gruver if he would kill them. Sam said he

The time was around 4 ppm.
