After hearing the protest, the Comptroller accepted Hansford County Appraisal District's value of $\$ 99.54$ per acre on the property.
"I received a call from Attorney Woodrow Menn of Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins and Mott at about 10 a.m. this morning," Mr. Hargis stated. "I was extremely pleased to hear the favorabl outcome of all our efforts. The ruling will save the district an estimated $\$ 80,000$ in equalization payments to the state in 2005 .
