| Hansford County hospital held a simulated emergency training exercise on Tuescay, November 11, 2008. The mannequin was programmed to train the doctors, nurses and staff in the emergency delivery and post-delivery care. <br> The simulation was performed with a high fidelity, tetherless simulator capable of imitating labor \& delivery, respiratory distress and many other real-life scenarios. moel, the mannequin, was manufactured in Miami by Gaumard Scientific. It has a pulse, heart and lung sounds, is able to talk and respond, and can even be "shocked" with a defibrillator if it goes into cardiac failure. This particular simulator is the only one programed to deliver a baby. |
