SPS Responds To City Council Order

Responding to an order by the Spearman City Council, Southwestern Public Service Company on Wednesday filed Spearman-specific electric rate studies, which indicate an overall 13.4 percent rate increase is appropriate in Spearman -- but the utility will not pursue the increase unless the city insists on continuing a "Spearman rate case."

The higher rates would be appropriate if the Spearman City Council exercises its authority to split the northern Texas Panhandle town off, for ratemaking purposes, from the other 80 cities in SPS's Texas service area, an SPS spokesman said.

"Customers in Spearman would lose the benefits of economies of scale available to all of our other customers," said Lester Baldock, SPS manager of revenue requirements. "Also, today, many customer classes in Spearman are being subsidized by other customer classes, both inside and outside Spearman. But on a go-it-alone basis, Spearman consumers would have to pay all of the actual costs of providing service to them.

'Instead, we are again urging the Spearman City Council to allow SPS to keep its base rates in Spearman the same as our current base rates in the other Texas communities we serve, which are among the lowest in the state," Baldock said. "We are declining to seek the higher rates -- unless the city council decides to move

Perryton, Follett, Booker, Darrouzett and Higgins from Texas-New Mexico Power Co. in 1995 -- at a market price above book value. All six communities supported the purchase and contractually agreed to the surcharge.

In return, customers in the communities immediately received a 10 percent reduction in overall rates, compared to rates they had been paying. The surcharge diminishes each year through 2005, when it disappears. By then, rates in the six communities will have declined 36 percent as a result of the SPS acquisition of the TNP facilities. Only Spearman appears to be trying to alter the agreement, Baldock said.

Baldock said the "costs-ofservice" studies SPS filed with Spearman Wednesday strongly indicate Spearman should not proceed with its rate case. Generally, he explained, a utility system's industrial and commercial customers pay rates "slightly higher than their own true costs of service. Such customers effectively subsidize lower rates for other customer classes."

However, he said, such subsidies of smaller customers, "simply are not available within the City of Spearman's jurisdiction; thus, the large increases. We strongly urge the city council to forego this rate case."

Under electric utility law in Texas, each community has original jurisdiction over rates charged for service within the community. Acting on the authority in December 1996, the Spearman City Council required SPS to file rate case materials with the city by April 16, 1997. On March 6, the council set SPS's current rates as "interim rates." Any future change in rates, up or down, would be retroactive to March 6.

Baldock said Spearman appears to be using the "Spearman rate case" as leverage to try to get SPS to remove a surcharge there on base rates. The surcharge resulted when SPS acquired electric utility property in Spearman,

Baldock said Spearman also has joined in a "rates complaint" against SPS filed with the Public Utility Commission of Texas by the office of Public Utility Council. "One thing we are doing to rebut that filing," he said, "is showing that the Public Utility Commission's own staff recently reported their studies of SPS indicate our rates in Texas are just and reasonable, and among the lowest in the state."

Southwestern Public Service Company is a regional electric utility providing service to a population of about one million in eastern and southeastern New Mexico, the High Plains and panhandle of Texas, the Oklahoma Panhandle and southwestern Kansas.






Reading a financial statement has been an issue--the school system hires an accountant to explain financial benefits.
