| Texas Crop \& Weather <br> The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors: The northern part of the region received rain, wind, hail and tornadoes. An exact appraisal of the damage was not yet available. Wheat was heading out, and was expected to be ready for harvesting in two to three weeks. Depending on the county, corn was 75 percent to 100 percent planted and 25 percent to 100 percent emerged. Cotton was 25 percent to 100 percent planted, and warming soil temperatures should help it emerge, said AgriLife Extension personnel. Soybeans were 100 percent planted with 50 percent emerged. Sunflowers were 80 percent planted, and sorghum was 20 percent to 65 percent planted. Rangeland was in good to excellent condition.
