Sterling College is a four-year, Christian liberal arts college located in Sterling, Kansas.



Several have mentioned that this should be a good spring for wildflowers. With that in mind I



QUESTION: When women get depressed, what specific complaint or irritant is most commonly related to the condition?

Sympathy is extended to the family of Virginia Barkley Renfro, 87. Her obituary is elsewhere in this issue.

Virginia was a part of a family whose imprint is left on practically every civic and Christian endeavor in Hansford County since the early part of this century. Her parents were Mr. and Mrs. A.F. Barkley.

It is believed that Virginia was the oldest person still living in the county who was born at Hansford.

So on Monday morning at Hansford cemetery, the cycle was complete. On a hilltop in the peaceful valley where she was born, and played as a child, she was laid to rest beside her parents and other relatives.

What might have been a catastrophe was averted Friday by the timely work of the Spearman and Waka fire departments. A gasoline loaded 5000 gallon tanker truck caught fire three miles west of Waka on Highway 15. It was owned by Midcon Gas Company and driven by an Oklahoma driver. Assistant Fire Chief Ron Antalek said apparently the hose ruptured and the drive lines on the pavement sparks ignited it. 
