
Spearman Swimming Pool To Open

Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- · the value placed on your property
- · any exemptions that may apply to you
- · the cancellation of an agricultural appraisal
- · the taxable status of your property
- · the local governments which should be taxing your · any action taken by the appraisal district that

Informal Review

The first option a taxpayer may use to protest a value is to visit with the chief appraiser or a staff member. Records on individual properties are available for review by every taxpayer. This informal review is to the benefit of the taxpayer, as many protests are resolved at this

Review by the Appraisal Review Board

adversely affected you.

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present eveidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 709 West 7th Street, Spearman, Texas, 806-659-5575. Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARb members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your casse before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at \$1,000,000 or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order.

You can get more information by contacting your appraisal district at 709 West 7th Street, Spearman, Texas. You can also get a pamphlet describing how to prepare a protest from the appraisal district or from the State Comptroller's Property Tax Division at P.O. Box 13528, Austin, Texas 78711-3528.

Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB*

Usual Deadline

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have a good

Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

Special Deadlines For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

*The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it fails on a weekend or holiday.



Coalition Advocates Good Health On the Texas High Plains

"Good health doesn't start with doctors, nurses or hospitals. It starts with people," says Lee Persefield, executive director of the Coalition of Health Services, Inc.

Regional hospitals, including Hansford County Hospital, combined resources in 1997 to form the Coalition of Health Services. Awareness of region-wide health needs motivated these healthcare providers to form a region-wide organization. Coordination and cooperation among individual health organizations are critical for issues affecting the entire area. Twenty regional hospitals are included in the Coalition's membership with the organization serving 29 counties of the Texas High

Diabetes education and awareness is an early example of region-wide needs addressed by the Coalition. Health statistics identified diabetes as a major health factor (approximately 40,000 are diagnosed as having diabetes in the 29 county Coalition service area and another 20,000 are believed to be diabetic but have not yet been diagnosed). It would have been impossible for each individual hospital to implement the kind of education and awareness needed for wide-spread early identification and treatment. The Coalition created a program that serves the entire area and works in close cooperation with health care providers. For people and families affected by diabetes, this translates into longer and healthier lives. In all, the Coalition currently administers 15 specific programs addressing health issues including equitable access to primary and preventative health care, prenatal care, childhood immunizations, early childhood preventative care, health education, and

The Coalition maintains a constant awareness that health is about people, Persefield reports. Since the organization works closely with health providers but is not directly involved in offering services, the Coalition can take that "step back" to view healthcare from the viewpoint of the people served. In striving to meet the needs of the people, the Coalition works to encourage and coordinate a seamless continuum of care from health education programs, to local primary care, to

coordinated services with regionwide health facilities and medical specialists. The Coalition advocates "user friendly" health programs for everyone, no matter what their personal or family budgets.

"If it takes free hot dogs to get people motivated to apply for health insurance that fits their family's budget, we'll give free hot dogs," Persefield said.

The Coalition and its hospital affiliates work hard to create an environment where the general public feels comfortable and welcome. During the 1999 high school football season, the Coalition launched the use of its CareVan which travels to area communities to conduct health education, health screening and free immunizations. Tiny footballs and megaphones given away at Friday night football games helped remind people to care for their children's health. By attending high school sporting activities, the Coalition strives to meet people "where they live." The same is true with health education programs offering a presence at community parades or in the parking lot of the local grocery store.

None of this would be possible without the support and cooperation of member hospitals. Local healthcare leaders created the Coalition because of a growing awareness that the effectiveness of healthcare in today's world requires coordination of efforts. One project recently implemented by the Coalition is an electronic communications hub for healthcare providers. As funds become available, this will include placement of telemedicine equipment in area hospitals so that diagnostic tests from remote sites can be viewed by medical experts, permitting better diagnosis and treatment of rural patients. This technology can better enable patients to stay close to home and family while obtaining specialized care.

Telemedicine equipment is being placed in hospitals in five communities (Childress, Perryton, Canadian, Memphis and Amarillo), and the Coalition will continue to seek funding for placement at hospitals





throughout the region. The project also involves public access to computers and the Internet, offering an opportunity for local healthcare facilities to work with area educational institutions in providing dis-

tance learning opportunities for all. Public awareness and education have been a crucial part of Coalition services from the very beginning. With the recent implementation of the 2Care for Kids project, the Coalition is working to inform the public of health insurance for children that fits into the family budget. The local effort is part of the statewide TexCare Partnership, an effort to match families with uninsured children in Texas to a health insurance plan at rates that families can reports a TexCare Partnership news release,

The Coalition is expanding its public awareness effort to help nurture positive communication between healthcare providers and the people they serve. Efforts include a series of fund raisers" to be held at two sites in the Panhandle. 9-1-1 Rural Addressing Project

The Panhandle Regional 9-1-1 Network is currently working on the Rural Addressing Project for Hansford County. The project involves assigning city type addresses consisting of street names and numbers to homes and businesses in rural areas. Citizens living within an incorporated area are not affected by this project.

The project is a combined effort Hansford County Commissioners Court and the Regional 9-1-1 Network of the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission. These agencies share the common goal of providing the best 9-1-1 services for the citizens of Hansford County.

The purpose of the rural addressing project is to provide emergency service personnel such as fire departments, ambulance services, and law enforcement with a more efficient way of locating 9-1-1 callers. By assigning physical addresses to homes and buildings, emergency personnel will no longer have to depend on "local knowledge" to find a person needing help. For example, when responding to a 9-1-1 call outside of town, having an address such as "10408 County Road Z" is much more useful to an ambulance driver than "two miles west of the old Smith place'

The first phase, the naming of county roads and installing signs, has been completed. The signs bear the name of the county road as well as the associated block number of that section of road.

The Panhandle Regional 9-1-1 Network needs your help in comeleting the next phase of the project. In the coming weeks, the 9-1-1 staff will be working to verify address locations throughout the county. This phase involves locating where rural residents live and determining their current mailing address so that they can be notified of their new address when it becomes available.

These activities may include door to door and telephone solicitations to confirm addresses. Residents may receive a phone call asking you to confirm your location, route and box number, or post office box number. People who live outside the city limits and use a post office box are encouraged to call 1-800-687-791 1 to make sure their homes and businesses are on the list to receive a 9-

The U.S. Postal Service is also assisting 9-1-1 districts with the rural addressing project. Once completed, the new physical addresses will become the new mailing address for those customers who currently receive mail by route and box delivery. This, according to the USPS, will help with the automated processing and sorting of mail. The mailing address for those rural customers who receive mail by post office box will not change; however,

their homes and businesses will be assigned a physical address for 9-1-1 purposes.

A physical address has other benefits beyond 9-1-1. Utilities, such as electric, telephone, gas and cable companies are beginning to require a physical address to start a new account or service an existing one. Similarly, insurance companies often require such information about the property for which they are providing coverage

Upon completion of the project, residents will receive a letter informing them of their 9-1-1 physical addresses.

Property Owners Send Appraisal Letters For Tax Year 2000

State law requires county appraisal districts to notify property owners about changes in their property's value. On May 15, 2000, Hansford Appraisal District mailed property owners letters showing their 2000 pro-

Alice Peddy, chief appraiser of the district, reminds property owners that the letter of appraised value is not a tax bill. "Please do not pay -- this is not a tax bill," Peddy said.

Peddy emphasized the importance of this letter and the key information that it contains. "A property owner has the right to appeal to the Hansford Count Appraisal Review Board on any disagreement with the property's value, exemptions, ownership and other areas," she said.

The appraisal review board, more commonly called the "ARB," is an independent panel of citizens responsible for hearing and settling protests from property owners who disagree with some action by the appraisal district. The notice includes instructions on how and when to file a protest and protest form.

What should a property owner carefully review? "Look at the proposed value for 2000," Peddy said. "The letter states the land's value and any improvement value for the property for the current year." An improvement

is a building, structure, fence or any other type of fixture to the land.

The appraisal letter also includes current year information on exemptions granted on the property. It provides last year's value, too.

Homeowners that qualify for property tax homestead exemptions have a limitation on their homes' appraised value, beginning with the second year that they qualify their home for homestead exemptions. The appraisal district may not increase their home value by more than 10 percent for each year since the last reappraisal year. A homeowner's letter gives both the market value for the home and the limited home value.

Letters to property owners also will include "estimated" taxes. These estimated" taxes are based on the new taxable value and last year's tax rates. Taxing units will set final 2000 tax rates in August and September. final tax amounts may vary from these "estimated" amounts.

Peddy asks property owners to check the legal description and mailing address to be sure that there are no mistakes. "If the letter has an old address, please let the appraisal district know. The post office forwards mail to a new address for a short time, and tax bills do not go out until October,

A property owner is responsible for informing the appraisal district of the correct mailing address. A property owner is liable for additional penalties and interest on a tax bill that is not paid on time.

Peddy added, "If you did not get a letter and want 2000 information about your property, please call the appraisal district at (806) 659-5575 or 1-800-372-5411. The deadline for protesting to the ARB is before June 15th for this year.


