

Weekly Update
Texas, August 20 - Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have risen 3.8 cents
per gallon in the past week averaging

per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.53/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has increased 2.1 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.70/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were 7.4 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 22.3 cents per gallon higher than a month ago. The national average has increased 21.9 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 11.8 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"The national average has finally begun to cool off after rising nearly every day since the start of July," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "As the West Coast and Great Lakes see refining issues in the rear view mirror, as well as the end of the summer driving season approaching, we may see a new downward pattern develop which could see average prices falling-especially after mid-September, a pattern that could dominate the gas pump until the holiday season," DeHaan said.

Texas Crop & Weather

The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors for August 21, 2012: Temperatures were lower and scattered rain eased some drought pressure, but the region still faced short to very short soil-moisture conditions. Producers were preparing for harvests and planting wheat. The condition of cotton was widely mixed, with some of the northern counties seeing good to fair stands, while others reported poor stands or had abandoned fields to crop-insurance adjusters. Corn was in fair to good condition in most areas. Some sorghum and stressed corn was being harvested as silage. Generally, grain sorghum was in good to fair condition, but was beginning to look moisture-stressed. Livestock producers were still providing supplemental feed to cattle on pastures. Some were selling cattle as feed prices continued to rise.

The FBI has a warning about a computer scam aimed at extorting money from its victims.

The virus known as, reveton ransomware, installs itself when you click on a compromised website.

It then locks the user's computer and displays a fake message from the FBI stating the user has violated federal law associated with child pornography websites or other illegal online activity.

Victims are told that in order to unlock their machine they must pay a fine using a prepaid money card service.

If you receive this message, contact a computer professional to have the virus removed.







Words from Faith & Grace

by Cecil R. Biggers, Lutheran Lay Minister

In the thirteenth week of the Season of Pentecost, we seek to answer the question, "Whom will you serve?" We study Joshua 24: 1-25, Psalm 34: 15-22,

Ephesians 6: 10-20, and John 6: 56-69.

The people of Israel have strayed from God, Joshua call them to choose. He calls them to Shechem, the place where Abraham received the promise of the gift of the land and where Abraham built the first altar to God. Joshua calls the elders to stand before the people; the representatives of the presence of God with Israel. It was also at Shechem where Jacob called upon the people to 'put away" the gods that they had worshipped in Macedonia and in Egypt. The people then recite their own story of God's presence and protection of them. The people declare, "Far be it from us that we should forsake the Lord to serve other gods..." Joshua then warns the people that if they serve foreign gods, the Lord will not forgive them. The people insist that they will be faithful. So Joshua makes a covenant with the people that day and made statutes and ordinances for them.

The Psalmist sings of God's passion for those oppressed. Verses 15-16 show us that God vindicates the righteous but totally 'erases' the evil-doers. Lest we believe in a "prosperity gospel", verses 17-20 show us that even the righteous will have many afflictions, but they are promised that God will deliver them from all. "The Lord redeems the life of his servants; none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned." So whom will you serve?

Paul calls upon the Ephesians to be strong in the Lord by putting on the armor of God to resist the wiles of the devil. Using a metaphor based upon the combat gear of the Roman soldier, Paul advises the Ephesians to "fasten the belt of Truth around your waist, put on the breastplate of righteousness. For shoes use whatever will allow you to stand for the gospel of peace. Take up the shield of faith to quench the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the spirit, which is the word of God. Note that the armor of God is completely defensive except for God's Word. The belt was placed to raise the toga so that the warrior was flexible and could fight unrestrained. The breastplate turned aside the cuts of a hostile blade. The shield of faith allows the Spirit to shield us from sin. The helmet of salvation alludes to our baptism when we were 'marked' as a child of God. Our 'weapon' is the Word of God which is a weapon for peace. Whom then should we serve?

We reach the end of the "Bread of Life" discussion in John 6. When many of Jesus' disciples hear his call to 'drink his blood", they leave him. This is because of the strict command in Leviticus 17:10-18 not to eat the blood of any creature. This prohibition is because the blood was sacred to God for it is the life of all creatures To the practicing Jew a command to eat the blood was anathema. When the twelve are asked the same question, they admit it is a hard teaching; but, Peter declares "Lord to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life." Whom then should we serve?

May the Holy Spirit enable you to put on the armor of God to enable your faithful service.
