Wildlife Packets Help Establish **Habitat In Hansford County**

Managing land for wildlife is gaining interest with Texas landowners. Whether it's deer in central Texas or quail and pheasant on the Plains wildlife seedling packets produced by the Texas Forest Service West Texas Nursery in Lubbock are available to assist landowners in creating

"Now is the time for landowners in Hansford County to order wildlife packets from West Texas Nursery before preferred species are sold out,"

says Brian Scott, Texas Forest Service forester in Amarillo.
Four wildlife packets are available: Quail/Pheasant, Deer, Turkey and Squirrel. Each packet contains 100 bareroot deciduous trees and shrubs that cater specifically to the habitat needs of their labeled species.


Each packet includes the following trees: Quail/Pheasant: Russian live, aromatic sumac, nanking cherry flameleaf sumac, bur oak and fourwing saltbush; Turkey: hackberry, bur oak, aromatic sumac and honeysuckle; Squirrel: little walnut, shumard oak, osage orange and bur oak

Texas Forest Service recommends planting wildlife packets in blocks on grasslands, at right angles on dry corners, in "motts" along playas, or parallel to irrigated cropland.

For example, on a dry corner five wildlife packets can be used to produce a four-row right-angle wildlife planting. The outside angle, that farthest from the circular crop land, would contain 1,250 feet (625 feet on each "leg") of plum trees; the second angle, Russian olive; the third inside angle, aromatic sumac; and the fourth angle, the closest to the cropland, nanking cherry.

For best results, it is recommended 10- to 25- foot spacing between each deciduous tree within a tree row; 6-foot spacing between each shrub within a shrub row; and 20-foot spacing between each row of

Blowin' In The Wind

Southwestern Pioneer Windmill Association put up two mills the first week of December, one at North Plains Insurance, and the other one across the street in the mall parking area of Lowe's Supermarket.

The Woodmanse mill at North Plains Insurance was obtained for the SPWA through the efforts of Walter Woolley, who found the Woodmanse Airmaster abandoned on a tower north of Beaver, Oklahoma. Walter contacted a Mr. McGrew at Guymon, who agreed that the SPWA could have it, and after it was brought to Spearman, Walter restored the mill. Woodmanse mills were very popular at one time throughout this area and around Beaver. The SPWA has an earlier model Woodmanse (the Model S) on the cable tower at First National Bank

The mill erected at Lowe's on Saturday of last week is a mill in which I take much personal interest. It is a Chandler eight-foot steel wheel mill, open-geared that had fallen with its wooden tower and damaged the wheel severely.

I have known of this mill for years because it was owned by two bachelor brothers on a farm about 2 miles from where I was raised near Adams, Oklahoma, in the Oklahoma Panhandle. My brother Maurice, who farms in the area, alerted me to the windmill being down and wondered if the SPWA wanted it. He contacted the present owner who was very willing to give it to the SPWA. Buchanan, Burl Buchanan and I, with my brother's help, managed to jack up the tower and head, back a trailer under it, and get it to Spearman where it awaited restoration.

Terry Schneider of the SPWA has spent several hours restoring the mill, and it is mostly through his work that the mill is now back in its original appearance and working condition.

This particular Chandler mill is unique in that windmill collectors thought that all Chandler mills were built by the Red Cross Manufacturing Windmill Company, but this particular Chandler was built by Butler Manufacturing Company, the same Butler manufacturers that today is known principally for granaries and other farm buildings.

The memories that I associate with the mill are of the owners, Lester and Jimmie Duckett, who each Sunday morning, as dependable as the sunrise, would go by our house in a Model A car, green and black with spoke wheels, to First Baptist Church of Adams where one was pianist and the other songleader. They did that for years until, for some reason of which I wasn't privy or have forgotten, they were voted out of their positions, quit the church, and, of course, no longer went by the

The Ducketts in themselves were a very interesting family--five brothers and a sister who all lived on almost adjoining farms, none of whom ever married but of absolute bedrock dependability and work

Some of the readers of this column might have been privileged, as I was, to visit the Ducketts' country home where they displayed their alabaster carvings, and if you were a really wide-eyed lad with an interest in Indian artifacts, you could get to go to their basement and see the countless arrowheads they had picked up as they farmed their fields behind teams of horses.

Those carvings and arrowheads were bequeathed to the Panhandle Historical Museum at Goodwell, Oklahoma, and can be viewed there. The last of the Ducketts passed away in the late 1970's or early 1980's, but they live on in the memories associated with the windmill that pumped their water and is now a part of our collection.

One additional personal note, the Ducketts all did many carvings in alabaster, but Eunice Duckett, the sister, was the only one who carved alabaster into necklaces, broaches, etc. The Ducketts would not sell, nor give, that I ever knew, any part of their collection to anyone, but one day Eunice picked a brooch pin up off the bedspread where she displayed her collection and presented it to my very surprised mother. I today have that pin, and I prize it greatly.

I have wandered far afield in telling about the Chandler mill, but that is its importance to me in that it reminds me of its two brother owners and their siblings who were representative of the men and women who lived in the area during the difficult time of the Depression, Dust Bowl, and the years that followed.
