Arrest Made In Hit-&-Run Accident

A suspect has been arrested in the July 4, 1997 hit-and-run accident which took the life of 77 year-old Eulogio Flores, Jr. of Spearman.

Steven Ross Widener, 33, former Spearman resident, turned himself into officials at the Hansford County Sheriff's

Department on Tuesday, December 30.

Widener was arraigned and charged with the felony of manslaughter, and bond was set at \$100,000 that same day. Additional charges may be filed by the Spearman Police Department when the grand jury

convenes in late January.

New Year's Day brought 2 boats from Texline. Neither owner had a 4 wheel drive vehicle, so after looking the ramp over with Jim, they gave up trying to put their boats in the water. Later, however, two local men put 2 boats in the lake, but they had one vehicle with a 4-wheel

Red Byrd of Spearman continues to fish through the cold weather. He is catching an occasional catfish but no walleyes.

The geese seem to know something about our winter, as we don't have near the numbers we had last year. The 6 bald eagles are still at the Park. Most of the deer have been staying back in the deep canyons.

The continued stories on the removal of the buffalo from the JA Ranch to the Caprock Canyons State Park at Quitaque tie in on a story set 400 years ago in the western part of the Panhandle when Onate, the governor of New Mexico sent Lieutenant Zaldivar and 60 men to capture a herd of buffalo to drive to New Mexico.

The men built a tremendous corral out of cottonwood logs with wide wings. They found a likely herd close by and started driving them to the corral. All proceeded well at first. Suddenly the herd reversed itself and ran over the Spanish explorers, killing 3 horses and wounding 40 others.

At this point they decided to capture calves. They did capture some, but the trauma of being caught caused all the calves to die. They then gave up. Years later the Mexicans who lived along the Rio Grande would come to the Panhandle to hunt buffalo. As they called the buffalo cibolo, these hunters became known as Ciboleros. They hunted from well trained horses, using long lances.

When Colonel Goodnight began an experimental herd from a buffalo cross on domestic cattle that he called cattalo, he found that beginning with small buffalo calves on Longhorn cows was a good way to start.

D.A. Cator of Old Hansford started with a bottle fed buffalo bull calf. He plans on raising beeffalo. I understand that the bull will follow him, but that he can't be driven.

. The arrest follows a lengthy investigation by Officer Bruce Goehring of the Spearman Police Department. Officer Goehring and Police Chief Larry Kenealy, who investigated the accident, obtained a paint chip at the scene of the accident and forwarded the chip to the Department of Public Safety Laboratory in Lubbock. Additional paint samples were also found on Flores' clothing, which were also sent for analysis. Officer Goehring later obtained written permission from Widener on December 18th, to take scrapings from the suspect's 1969 pick-up truck to be sent to the Lubbock lab.

Preceding Widener's arrest on December 30th, an informant gave the Sheriff's Department a statement earlier in the day relating the suspect's confession of involvement in the accident. A warrant for Widener's arrest was issued at that time, however, the suspect turned himself into authorities before the arrest was

Widener is currently the in Hansford County jail. His vehicle was delivered by Sheriff McFarland and reserve deputy Mike Davis to the Spearman Police Department on December 31st and has been impounded since that time.



QUESTION: I want to control and lead my strong-willed child properly, but I'm afraid I'll break his spirit and damage his emotions in some way. How can I deal with his misbehavior without hurting his

will. The human spirit relates to the self-esteem or the personal worth that a child feels. As such, it is exceedingly fragile at all ages and must be handled with care. You as a parent correctly assume that you can damage your child's spirit quite easily . . . by ridicule, disrespect, threats to withdraw love and by verbal rejection. Anything that depreciates his self-esteem can be costly to

made of steel. It is one of the few intellectual components that arrives full strength at the moment of birth. In an issue of Psychology Today, this heading described the research findings from a study of infancy: "A baby knows who he is before he has the language to tell us so. He reaches deliberately for control of his environment, especially his parents."

strong-willed infant. They have walked the floor with him in the wee small hours, listening to this tiny dictator as he made his wants and wishes abundantly clear.

his breath until he loses consciousness. Anyone who has ever witnessed this full measure of willful defiance has been shocked by its power. One headstrong 3-year-old recently refused to obey a direct command from her mother, saying, "You're just my mommy, you know!" Another "mere" mommy wrote me that she found herself in a similar confrontation with her 3-year-old son over something she wanted him to eat. He was so enraged by her insistence that he refused to eat or drink anything for two full days. He became weak and lethargic, but steadfastly held his ground. The mother was worried and guilt-ridden, as might be expected.

Finally, in desperation, the father looked the child in the eyes and convinced him that he was going to receive a well-deserved punishment if he didn't eat his dinner. With that maneuver, the contest was over. The toddler surrendered. He began to consume everything he could get his hands on, and

Now tell me, please, why have so few child development authorities recognized this willful defiance? Why have they written so little about it? My guess is that the acknowledgement of childish imperfection would not fit neatly with the notion that little people are infused with sunshine and goodness, and merely "learn" the meaning of evil. To those who hold that rosy view I can only say, "Take another look!"
