Official forms for a notice of protest are available at the appraisal district office. "A letter from the taxpayer " as long as it identifies the property owner and the property that is

## Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners ne right to appraisals. You may follow these procedures if you have a concern about

- the value placed on your property;
- cancellation of agricultural appraisal
- whether your property is taxable;
- which local governments should be taxing
your property; or

something else thatadversely affecied you Informal Review: 'The first option a taxpayer may use to protest a value is to visit with the chief appraiser or a staft member. Records on individual properties ar avallable for review by every taxpaper. This informa re are resolved at this level.

Rou can't resolve your Review Board: with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review

The appraisal review board (ARB) is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals and other concerns isted above. They have the power to order he appraisal district to make the necessary equest for an ARB hearing (called a notice or protest before the deadline, the ARB will se your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notification of the time, date, and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. least 15 days before the scheduled hearing date.
Peddy said that protest hearings will be held for one day and that the ARB expects to approve the final ap-
