Rep. Warren Chisum Named Legislator of the Year by TACHC Statewide Association Lauds Chisum's Work To Address Physician Shortage in Texas

health care in underserved areas of Texas in the years ahead," said TACHC Executive Director José E. Camacho. "Access to health care in both rural and urban areas remains critical as our population grows. Rep. Chisum's efforts and all those who supported the physician loan repayment legislation help assure healthcare will be available for those who need it."

During the 81st session of the Texas Legislature, Rep. Chisum led the push for creation of an enhanced physician loan repayment program. It will be available to family care physicians who agree to practice in underserved areas of the state and will assist in paying off student loans amassed during medical school training. Medical school graduates carry a debt as high as \$160,000 in student loans.

"The Panhandle, rural West Texas and other areas in need of general practice doctors now have an effective means of drawing doctors coming out of medical schools," said Chisum. "It was my honor to work with my colleagues on a bill that will have such a positive impact for health care access."

Chisum shepherded the proposal through an extremely challenging legislative session, secured funding and worked to assure the goal of bringing health care providers to underserved areas would be met. In its final version, House Bill 2154 ultimately won overwhelming support in the Texas House and Senate.

In June, Governor Rick Perry formally signed the physician loan repayment bill into law. The legislation becomes effective Sept. 1, 2009.

In 2008, 26 Texas counties had no primary care physician. More than 110 Texas counties – rural and urban – have been designated as Health Professional Shortage Areas, meaning those counties do not meet a minimum national threshold of one physician for every 3,500 people.

"As we talk about expanding healthcare in our country, it's critical we have physicians in place to meet the demand," said Camacho. "Work in this session, led by Rep. Chisum, puts Texas in better position

to meet the needs of the future."

TACHC presented Chisum his award during a formal ceremony at Regence Health Network's (RHN) Amarillo Clinic. RHN is among many Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) throughout Texas expected to attract future physicians thanks to the loan repayment incentive. "National Health Center Week is a perfect time to recognize the important work of Rep. Chisum because our health centers will benefit tremendously from this legislation," said Rick Love, CEO of Regence Health Network (RHN). "This new program will give us an excellent recruiting tool to keep our clinics throughout the Panhandle fully staffed with physicians to serve the community."

The second week of August is designated as National Health Center Week (Aug. 9-15). The week is dedicated to recognizing the service and contributions of community, migrant, homeless and public housing health centers in providing access to affordable, high quality, cost-effective health care to medically vulnerable and underserved people across the country. Texas is home to 68 such centers, including the Regence Health Network. Community health center organizations in Texas operate close to 300 health care delivery sites and serve more than 770,000 patients every year.

Texas Physician Education Loan Repayment Program Overview

- The Texas Physician Education Loan Repayment Program (HB 2154) passed overwhelmingly during the 81st session of the Texas Legislature.
- Governor Rick Perry signed the measure into law on June 16, 2009.
- Under the program, family care physicians who agree to practice for four years in underserved areas of the state will be eligible to receive assistance in paying off student loans amassed during medical school training.
- Medical school graduates carry a debt as high as \$160,000 in student loans.
- The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and the Texas State Department of Health Services are responsible for carrying out the functions of the Texas Physician Education Loan Repayment Program.
- Program rules, forms and specific application process are being developed with input from organizations such as the Texas Association of Community Health Centers, the Texas Academy of Family Physicians and the Texas Medical Association. Following a comment period, final adoption of the rules is expected in October 2009.
- The first program application period is expected to begin December 2009. Physicians will be able to apply electronically online or by submitting a traditional mail-in application.
- More than half of Texas counties – rural and urban – need more primary care physicians.
- More than one hundred Texas counties (114) do not meet the national standard of one physician for every 3,500 people.
- In 2008, 26 Texas counties had no primary care physician.
- By 2015, Texas will need more than 4,500 additional primary care physicians and other providers for the state's underserved population.
- The Texas Physician Education Loan Repayment Program is expected to attract 225 physicians each year to underserved areas of the state.

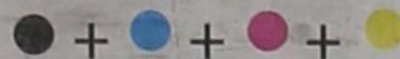

Apples are helpful for those who have problems with their stomach. If you have problem with indigestion, eat apples before meals or drink apple cider vinegar. Eating two apples a day will help reduce your cholesterol level up to 10 %.

"An apple a day could very well keep the doctor away," says Chang Y. Lee, a food chemist at the New York State Agricultural Experiment Station in Geneva, NY.

The Apple is a source of both soluble and insoluble fiber. Soluble fiber, like pectin, actually helps to prevent cholesterol buildup in the lining of blood vessel walls.

EDUCATION SYSTEM KNOWS WHAT TO DO IN ADVANCE OF SWINE FLU SEASON

Texas school officials have plans to carry out if the H1N1 "swine flu" influenza virus hits schools this fall.

ing. "Children should never be left unsupervised for any length of time in or around water, because the results can be devastating."

Here's a brief version of a set of federal/state guidelines schools are to follow if flu conditions are about the same as they were last spring:

An average of 70 children drowned each year since the agency began the count in 2005. In 2008, 82 children drowned in Texas, previously the highest annual total.

- 1. Stay home when sick
2. Separate ill students and staff
3. Wash hands frequently with soap and water and cover nose and mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing

Federal statistics show: - Children under one year old most often drown in bathtubs, buckets or toilets.

And here is a brief set of guidelines to be used if the conditions of increased severity emerge.

- Children from one to four years old drown most often in residential swimming pools.

- Most young children who drowned in pools were last seen in the home, had been out of sight less than five minutes, and were in the care of one or both parents at the time.

New stickers sport cowboy look

New Texas motor vehicle inspection stickers debuted Aug. 1, and they have a western look.

The Texas Department of Public Safety said images of cowboys will appear on different types of inspection stickers.

"We wanted to present a new certificate design that was immediately identifiable as being Texan," said JoJo Heselmeyer, director of vehicle services for the DPS.

Texas issues 10 different inspection certificate designs, dependent upon factors such as the age of the vehicle, whether it is designated as a commercial vehicle and whether

emissions testing is required.

TxDOT uses social networking

On Aug. 3, the Texas Department of Transportation announced it is using Twitter, Facebook and YouTube to communicate with the public.

TxDOT Executive Director Amadeo Saenz said, "It has already proved to be helpful in communicating important emergency information, traffic updates and lane closures and we intend to continue using this technology in the future."

Perry-Hutchison debates planned

Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison in late July said she plans to resign in October or November to run for governor.

Last week her exploratory committee said she will participate in live debates with Gov. Rick Perry. Perry's people said the governor has committed to two debates to be televised before the March 2 Republican primary.

The Dallas Morning News and four television stations, all owned by A.H. Belo Corp., will host and air the debates.

O'Neill decides not to run again

Texas Supreme Court Associate Justice Harriet O'Neill on Aug. 6 announced she does not intend to seek reelection when her term expires in 2010.

O'Neill was elected to her first six-year term in 1998. She is second in seniority on the present court.


ence will take place at Lake Tanglewood making it the only open water swim triathlon here in the panhandle. The swim, bike, and run course will challenge athletes with panhandle views.

community," said Barry Lynch, Tri To Make A Difference Race Director.


The Tri To Make A Difference triathlon is limited to just 200 entries and is sanctioned by USA Triathlon.
