The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors: The region did not receive moisture, and temperatures were above average most of the week. Soil moisture levels varied from very short to adequate, with most counties reporting short. A few fields of corn remained to be harvested. The cotton and sorghum harvests were ongoing. Wheat growers needed moisture to plant and for already planted. Rangeland was mostly in poor condition. High winds and no moisture created a high potential for wild fires. Cattle were in good condition, with producers providing supplemental feed in most areas.

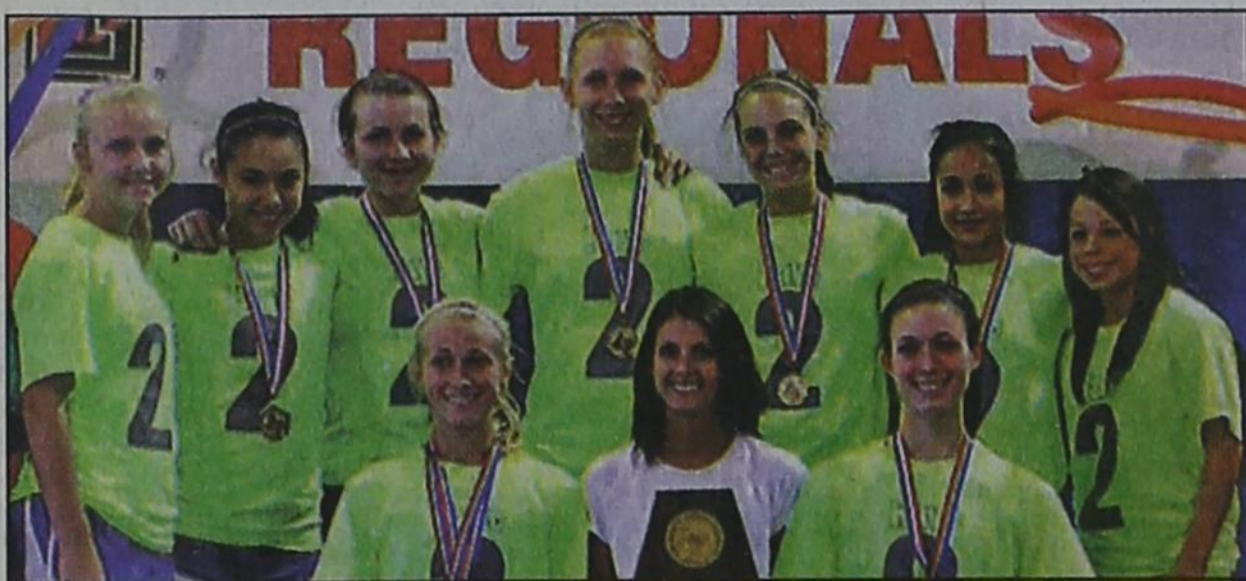
Spearman, Gruver Girls Repeat as Regional Champions

Luis Mendoza of Gruver came in 4th, becoming Gruver High School's first male cross country qualifier.

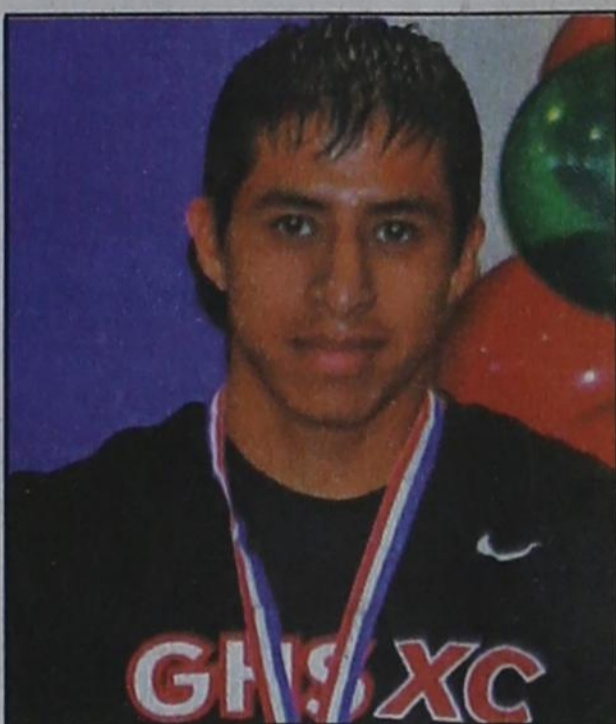

Hunters Warned: Quail Carry West Nile

Researchers have discovered the West Nile virus in scaled quail in the Texas Panhandle.

Last month in Potter County, Brad Dabbert, a researcher and professor at Texas Tech University, and his team recovered the carcass of a scaled - or blue - quail, whose bloodstream contained antibodies created during infection by the West Nile virus.

"This is the first known case of West Nile in scaled quail," Dabbert said.

So far, Dabbert said, "there is no known, measurable effect on quail populations in Texas. However, it is something we must look at out of prudence."

To do this, Dabbert and his colleagues in the Quail-Tech Alliance plan to set up quail ranches in each of the 38 Rolling Plains counties, including Taylor County. At these ranches, quail will be trapped, examined, tagged and released.

With quail season opening Saturday, what does this mean for hunters?

It's too early to tell, experts said, but hunters are advised to take precautions to avoid exposure to the disease. Being a blood-borne pathogen, it is difficult for the West Nile virus to pass from an infected bird to a human, health experts said. However, the process of cleaning the downed quarry could provide a possible vehicle for transmission.

The first step, then, is simply to avoid infected fowl, officials said.

If a bird is "flying normally, the bird is probably healthy," said Kathy McGinty, an Abilene-based Texas Parks and Wildlife biologist.

Qiang Xu, an assistant professor of biology at Abilene Christian University and an expert on mosquito-borne illnesses, agreed, saying that "usually, infected birds

are not as active."

The second step is to "wash your hands and wear gloves when cleaning," McGinty said.

The third line of defense is in the kitchen.

McGinty said that "cooking meat properly will usually kill the virus; mourning doves contract it as well, and there hasn't been too much of a problem."

About the virus itself, Xu said, "The West Nile virus is serious, but it is not as terrible as many think."

He noted that "95 percent of infected humans will not show symptoms; 4 percent will show cold-like symptoms: headache, fever, etc., and only 1 percent will show significant symptoms, such as meningitis or encephalitis."

Furthermore, he said the virus cannot be transmitted from one human to another and is "much more likely to be transmitted from a mosquito that has fed on an infected bird," than from infected game.

HISTORICAL MUSINGS

It is always appropriate for us to remember why we observe November the 11th as Veterans Day. In 1918, on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day in the eleventh month, the world rejoiced and celebrated. After four

years of bitter war, the Allied powers signed a cease-fire agreement (an armistice) with Germany at Rethiondes, France on November 11, 1918, bringing World War I to a close. The "war to end all wars" was over.

November 11, 1919 was set aside as Armistice Day in the United States, to remember the sacrifices that men and women made during World War I in order to ensure a lasting peace. On Armistice Day, soldiers who survived the war marched in a parade through their home towns. Politicians and veteran officers gave speeches and held ceremonies of thanks for peace they had won.

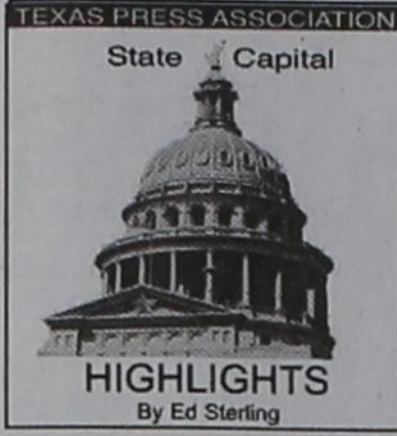
Armistice Day officially received its name in the United States in 1926 through a Congressional resolution. It became a national holiday 12 years later. Congress voted Armistice Day a federal holiday in 1938, 20 years after the war ended, but Americans realized that the previous war would not be the last one. World War II began the following year and nations great and small again participated in a bloody struggle. After the Second World War, Armistice Day continued to be observed on November 11.

In 1953 townspeople in Emporia, Kansas called the holiday Veterans' Day in gratitude to the veterans in their town. Soon after, Congress passed a bill introduced by a Kansas congressman renaming the federal holiday to Veterans' Day. Beginning in 1954, the United States designated November 11 as Veterans' Day to honor veterans of all U.S. wars. 1971 President Nixon declared it a federal holiday on the second Monday in November. Most groups continued to observe it on the actual 11th, so in 1978, congress restored the federal holiday to November 11th.

Americans still give thanks for peace on Veterans' Day. There are ceremonies and speeches and at 11 a.m., most Americans observe a moment of silence - remembering those who fought for peace.

After the United States' involvement in the Vietnam War, the emphasis on holiday activities has shifted. There are fewer military parades and ceremonies. Veterans gather at the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial in Washington, D.C. to place gifts and stand quiet vigil at the names of their friends and relatives who fell in the Vietnam War. Families who have lost sons and daughters in war turn their thoughts more toward peace and the avoidance of future wars.

At present we think and pray for the veterans of the Persian Gulf War and hope for peace and withdrawal soon. A salute to all Veterans and Servicemen. God Bless!



Republicans enjoy swath of victories on Election Day

AUSTIN — Republican candidates in the Nov. 2 election picked up 21 seats in the Texas House of Representatives and voters "rehired" incumbent Gov. Rick Perry for a third consecutive four-year term.

Perry outpaced former Houston Mayor Bill White, a Democrat, with a 13-point margin of victory, claiming 55 percent of the nearly 5 million ballots cast to White's 42 percent.

Now, the GOP claims 99 seats in the 150-seat Texas House to the Democrats' 51. No incumbent Republican House member lost their seat. Here is the list of incumbent Democrats who lost their seats to Republican challengers, as follows: Stephen Frost of New Boston, to George Laveland; Mark Homer of Paris, to Erwin Cain; Jim McReynolds of Lufkin, to James White; Solomon Ortiz Jr. of Corpus Christi, to Raul Torres; Abel Herrero of Robstown, to Connie Scott; Yvonne Gonzalez-Tourelles of Alice, to Jose Aliseda; Patrick Rose of Dripping Springs, to Jason Isaac; Valinda Bolton of Austin, to Paul Workman; Donna Howard of Austin, to Dan Neil; Diana Maldonado of Round Rock, to Larry Gonzales; Jim Dunnam of Waco, to Marva Beck; Joe Moody of El Paso, to Dee Margo; Joe Heflin of Hale Center, to Jim Landtroop; Paula Pierson of Arlington, to Barbara Nash; Chris Turner of Arlington, to Bill Zedler; Robert Miklos of Mesquite, to Cindy Burkett; Carol Kent of Dallas, to Stephani Carter; Kirk England of Grand Prairie, to Rodney E. Anderson; Allen Vaught of Dallas, to Kenneth Sheets; David McQuade Leibowitz of San Antonio, to John V. Garza; Kristi Thibaut of Galveston, to Jim Murphy; and Ellen Cohen of Houston, to Sarah Davis.

In the 31-seat Texas Senate, the GOP's edge over Democrats in the Senate remains at 19-12. No incumbent lost to a challenger, and Democrat Jose R. Rodriguez of El Paso won the Senate District 29 race to succeed a retiring Democrat, Sen. Eliot Shapleigh.

They've indicated that Straus, who enjoyed ample support from Democrats in the 2009 legislative session, did not push the Republican agenda hard enough to suit them or a number of conservative interest groups.

Paul is an apostle, an evangelist, but he works to support himself and his ministry. This is not because Paul is not entitled to be supported by the Church, but because Paul wants to be an example to his congregations. Paul repeats a command, "Anyone unwilling to work should not eat." Dear Christian, work is ministry, it reflects who you are and whose you are. Paul exhorts the Church in Thessalonica to not be weary in doing what is right. So too, he speaks to us, dear Christian. We quite often do not see immediate results to our work in ministry. Those of us who are result-oriented may lose heart; thus, Paul warns "do not be weary in doing what is right."

Jesus is warning his disciples of the trials to come. Jesus never promised that following him would be easy. Jesus did not teach a 'prosperity gospel'; he did not tell us that if we just follow him we will be rich and all our lives will be wonderful. Jesus did teach that he will be with us always, in whatever circumstances we find ourselves to be. Jesus warns his followers of the "Day of the Lord" but warns them not to follow false prophets who claim to be "Jesus" or claim to know God's timeline for the Coming. Dear Christian the person who follows Jesus Christ may well lose their life, but will never lose their soul.

May the Holy Spirit enable you to work to show yourself as a worthy servant of Christ.



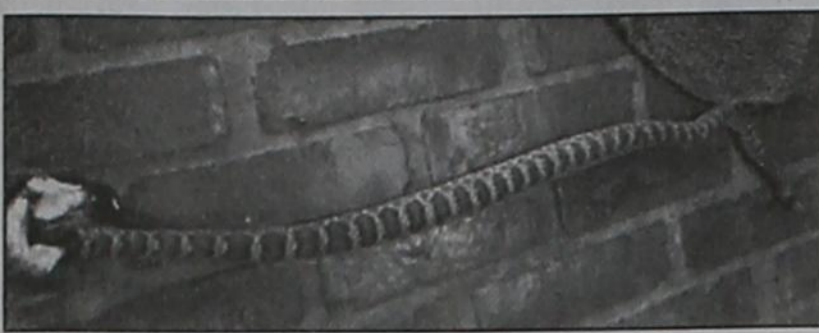

Steve thinks he has found the point of entry and had plans when I talked to him for turning back any

more such visitors.

Tracy, a teacher in the Gruver Junior High, loves old houses. The McClellan house had been built in 1911. When she first explored it, she could see how to make it a home again.

In 1903, Lee Smith McClellan sent his wife and six youngest children to her parents in Mount Calm, Texas while he moved a cow herd and two wagons with their possessions to Hansford County from Greer County, Oklahoma with the help of his two oldest sons Lee, Jr. and Dave. They found land, dug a large dugout and soon had the family reunited. Later, a wooden floor was added to the dugout, and next a parlor and bedroom were built above it.

Times became better, and Mr. McClellan began to raise wheat. He hauled two wagon loads at a time to the railroad. When he crossed the Coldwater Creek, the slope going up was too much for a two horse team to pull the wheat loaded wagon. He would park one wagon, and take the team from it to add to the other wagon. Once it was up the slope, he had to go back and repeat the drill. When he returned home, he had a backhaul because he was taking lumber back for a new house. He now had ten children.

He had the help again of Lee and Dave. Elmo would have been 13 when the house was finished, so we can imagine he helped, too. The house was a ten room two-story frame house. This musical family liked to entertain, so it was a happy day when two mules were traded for an organ.

Later, Elmo and Elizabeth McClellan raised their six children in the home. The parents died, and the children had other homes or moved away, and the old house waited for Tracy and Steve.

Help for this story came from Steve's visits with Elmo, Jr., my visit with R. L. McClellan, and Vol. 1, Hansford County History.

Spearman, Gruver Claim Regional Titles

A spectator at the Region I Cross Country Championships at Mae Simmons Park on Saturday joked: "They run fast in the Panhandle because the towns are far apart and there is nothing to do."

The dominance by the area's Class 1A and Class 2A runners was no joke:

- The Spearman Lynxettes and Gruver Lady Greyhounds repeated as regional champions.
- Five of the six 1A teams advancing to the state meet are from the area.
- Shamrock senior Melissa Velazco won the 1A girls individual crown.
- Highland Park's Quinlin McGregor claimed the 2A boys individual title despite a sinus infection.
- Seven of the top eight finishers in the 1A girls race are from the area.

"How about this?" Gruver coach Rod Beeen said. "It shows how good the top of Texas is in cross country."

Velazco, the 1A state champ in 2008, was clocked in 11 minutes, 49.50 seconds, well ahead of second-place Meghan Bass off Crosbyton (11:58.55). Macy Davis of Wellington finished third.

Last year's champion, Taylor Sparks of Wheeler, finished fourth. Clarendon's Audrey Shelton was fifth, Gruver's Shelly Gibson was sixth, Farwell's Chelsea Bass was seventh, and Panhandle's Mary Cate Neeley was eighth to give the area six 1A girls individual state

qualifiers.

Gruver defended its title with 80 points ahead of Wellington with 100 and Panhandle with 105.

"We were missing a runner with appendicitis," Beeen said. "I'm proud of them. It's not easy to win when you have the pressure of being the defending champion."

Panhandle, which moved to 1A in this year's University Interscholastic League realignment, was fourth in the 2A regional last year.

"I think this is the first time for the school to take a girls team to state," Pantherettes coach Kurt Richardson said. "I'm not absolutely sure, but we think so. We ran well. It always comes down to the fourth and fifth runner. We put our fourth and fifth runners ahead of Sundown's, and we're going to state."

Wellington is making its first appearance since 2000, and girls athletic director Dane Richardson thinks the Lady Rockets' 1600-meter relay state appearance in the spring might have been the difference in the team staying focused on cross country.

"When the relay got to state in track, the girls realized how much fun it is and decided they wanted to go to Round Rock."

While the area's girls Class 1A teams swept the podium, the boys did well, too.

Carl Hulen in fifth place and Joe Teachout in 20th place - the only two Boys Ranch Roughriders who had run cross country be-

fore this year - led their team to second and a ninth consecutive state meet appearance.

While Sundown captured the boys Class 1A title with 51 points, Boys Ranch had 87, and Bovina, whose seven team members also play football, was third with 90 points, giving the Mustangs the school's first state cross country meet berth.

Boys Ranch coach Kenneth Brown was thrilled for his young, inexperienced team.

"I told them winning in cross country is a tradition on the Ranch, and they believed me," Brown said. "I've never been prouder of a group."

Luis Mendoza of Gruver, Claude's Kevin Griffin and Sunray's Zach Lechner finished fourth, sixth and seventh, respectively to earn state berths.

With all the class 1A success, Spearman showed it is still the best team in the region in class 2A.

The Lynxettes, led by Tylo Farrar's second-place finish, won their third consecutive team championship with 84 points ahead of Brady (90) and Tuscola Jim Ned (114).

"What did it for us was Itzel Meza and Malory Martin moving up," Spearman coach Starla Whitely said. "Malory broke 13 minutes, and she was our key because she finished fifth for us and was ahead of Brady and Jim Ned's fifth."

Lynx ride momentum of big plays

It took the Spearman Lynx less than two minutes to score on their initial possession on a busted play that produced a 45-yard run by quarterback Blayne Schroeder.

On Tulia's fifth play from scrimmage, a fumble resulted in a 56-yard return for a TD by Spearman's Cameron Meddock with just more than three minutes elapsed.

Those two big plays completely swung the game's momentum in favor of Spearman, which went on to claim a 42-7 win against the Hornets that secured a playoff berth out of District 1-2A Division II.

Tulia, which overcame a winless season in 2009 that resulted in the forfeiture of the team's final four games, played this important game without starting quarterback Zack Johnson and receiver Laith LeMaster.

Johnson, who threw for 2,000 yards this season and was the team's leader, suffered a concussion a week earlier against Abernathy, while LeMaster suffered a knee injury that will require surgery.

As a result of the two being out, the Hornets simply were never able to sustain anything offensively. They were held to 197 yards total offense and just seven first downs. They didn't score until a minute remained on a 50-yard pass from freshman John Martinez to Jeremy Garcia, who went over the 1,000-yard mark in receiving with that catch.

But by that time, the Lynx were in front 42-0 and had the game in their grasp.

"I don't know if the outcome would have been different," said Spearman head coach Steve Rodman, "but I sure think it would have been closer."

"We knew coming into the game those two players wouldn't be available. Our kids came out fired up and ready to play, and we got off to a good start."

"The fumble recovery for a TD really was a huge momentum swing for us. It gave us a two-touchdown advantage early, and our defense kind of took over."

The Lynx wound up with 341 yards total offense,

with 236 of it on the ground in 52 attempts. Schroeder completed 6-of-8 passes for 105 yards and a TD.

Justin Rindlisbacher scored on runs of 8 and 4 yards in the second quarter and caught a 40-yard TD pass with 10 seconds remaining before halftime as the Lynx took a 35-0 lead to the dressing room.

"It's unfortunate for us that Zack and Laith weren't able to play," Tulia first-year head coach Randy Scott said. "I think they would have made a big difference for us because they are such a big part of our offense."

"I can't fault the effort of our kids. They played as hard as they could and really came such a long way this season."

"For what this program went through last year, to get to .500 for the season and have a shot at making the playoffs going to the final game, it was really something they can look back on with pride."

The Spearman Lynx will play Coahoma at Greg Sherwood Memorial Stadium in Plainview on Friday, November 12th at 8 p.m. in a Bi-District playoff game. Spearman will be the visitors. Tickets at gate only. Adults \$5, students \$3.

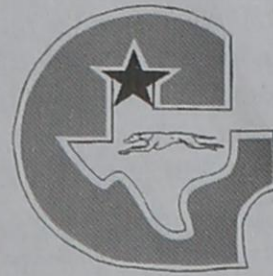

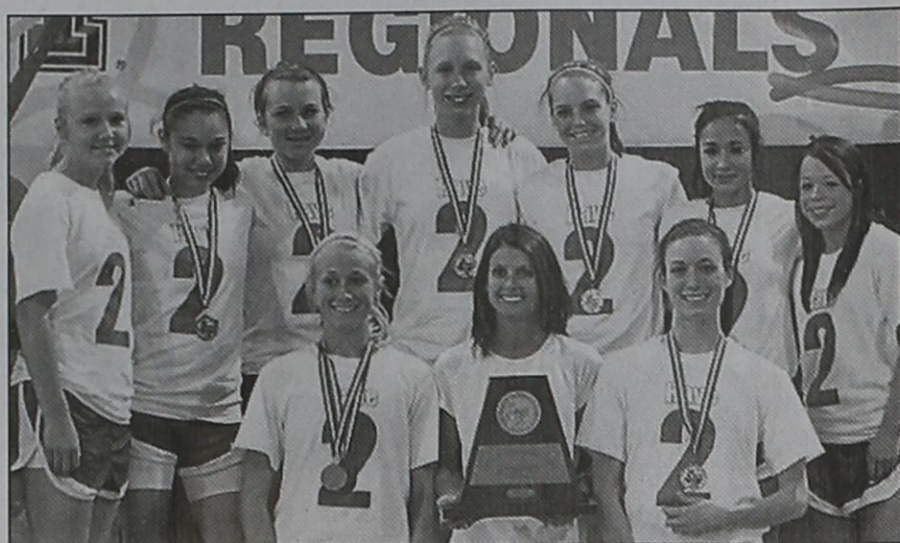

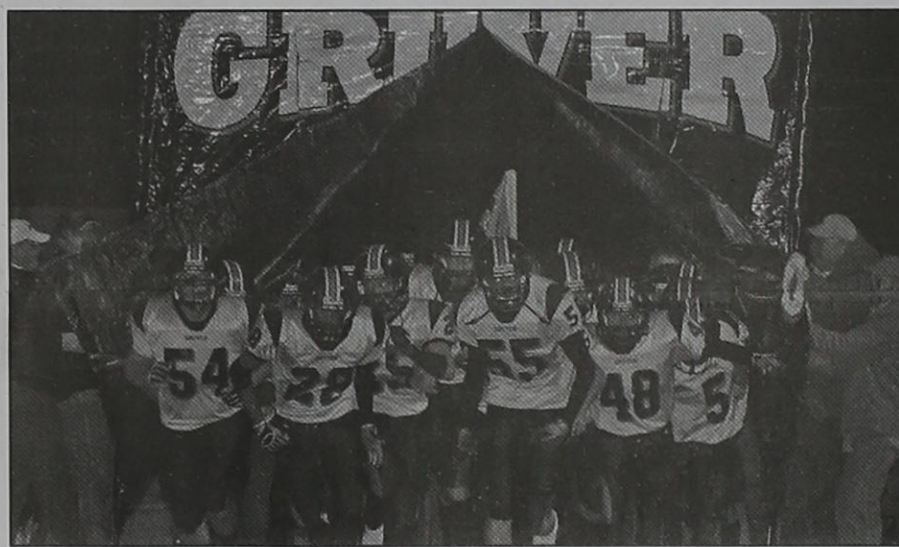
