O'Loughlin Center Receives Grant

The Spearhead Corporation was recently granted a \$50,000 matching grant from the Amarillo Area Foundation. These funds would apply toward the \$86,366 improvement project to the Corporation's non-profit community center.

Improvements cannot begin, however, until 100% of the funds needed to complete the project are in hand. Currently, an additional \$15,000-\$20,000 needs to be pledged or collected by March 1, 1998 in order for the Spearhead Corporation to utilize the \$50,000 grant.

The improvement project is composed of two improvements. One is the installation of acoustical panels and a permanent sound system for the center's multi-purpose room. The second is additional paving and enlargement of the loading/unloading area in the rear of the building.

The project can be completed in less than a year from the time the full-funding is available. Proposed acoustical/sound improvements will cost \$16,796. To date, \$7,000.00 has been contributed specifically for these improvements. The paving project will cost \$69,570. To date, contributions of \$7,600.00 have been made toward the paving project.

The Spearhead Corporation was founded in 1990. It's purpose was to construct and operate a 13,800 square foot building, a gathering place for the community's events and the community's organizations. Facilities for such gatherings were few, antiquated, and too often inadequate for even simple events. The community building which Spearhead proposed was essential to our town's quality of life. Now completed, our building provides a permanent home to Golden Spread Center, the local senior citizen's organization, as well as providing meeting facilities for many groups in our community.

Generous grants from the Amarillo Area Foundation, The Meadows Foundation, and the Mabee Foundation along with gifts from several smaller foundations, and from numerous corporations and local individuals made the construction of a debt-free facility possible. By design, the building was to meet a variety of needs for the community, including fitness, recreational, social and educational. Overflow parking for large events would be provided by the nearby swimming pool parking lot.

Soon after its summer 1994 opening, it was apparent that, although the majority of the facility is meeting the goals for its use, (1) the acoustics in the multi-purpose room fell far short

S. BRANDT STREET of requirements, and (2) the parking was inadequate. The large size, smooth wall surfaces and lack of an appropriate sound

system in the multi-purpose room create echoes which make it difficult to understand speakers. This short-coming limits the use of this room for events with pubic speakers and inhibits the enjoyment musical* entertainment. In addition, the parking and rear access for loading and unloading are inadequate to meet the needs of the large crowds attending many functions at the center. The use of the facility has


exceeded our expectations. We have been pleasantly surprised. School functions are even held in the facility because of the convenience of decorating prior to the events. However, the limited access to the rear of the building creates a traffic hazard, and the lack of sufficient parking near the front of building is an inconvenience for all groups, especially for our senior citizens.

The proposed improvements, installation of acoustical panels for the walls, the installation of a permanent sound system and expansion of the parking lot and rear access will substantially benefit those who sponsor and attend the many functions held in the center. Since it is the only area facility which can host community events, these improvements will have a direct, positive impact on the community's use of the center, especially to the Golden Spread

The proposed expenditures outlined above will have no impact on the operational budget of the facility other than increasing the earned revenues possible from the rental of the multi-purpose room. Community opinion has assured us that improved sound equipment, acoustics in the multi-purpose room and improvements to the parking lot will stimulate increased rentals of this space.





Focus On The Family

QUESTION: Must I act like a teenager myself in dress, language, tastes and manners to show my adolescent that I understand him?

DR. DOBSON: No. There is something disgusting about a 40-year-old "adolescent has-been." It wasn't necessary for you to crawl on the floor and throw temper tantrums to understand your 2-year-old; likewise, you can reveal an empathy and acceptance of the teen years without becoming an anachronistic teenybopper yourself.

In fact, the very reason for your adolescent's unique manner and style is to display an identity separate from yours. You'll turn them off quickly by invading their territory, leading them to conclude, "Dad tries hard, but I wish he'd grow up!"

Besides, your teen will still need an authority figure on occasion, and you've got the job!

QUESTION: Should I punish my son for bedwetting?

DR. DOBSON: Absolutely not! It is never appropriate to punish a child for any involuntary action. To punish someone for something he simply cannot avoid doing is to set him up for serious problems

Of course, if you have reason to think that your son is awake and simply lies there in bed and urinates because he is too lazy to get up and go to the bathroom, that is another matter. However, true enuresis is totally involuntary.



Jim reports a few fishermen on the nicer days, but the fishing is slow. Red Byrd of Spearman is a cold weather fisherman who is really enjoying his recent retirement. He has bought a boat that he can take in the Gulf.

Jim had fun watching six eagles with the scope on Saturday morning. They were in the big dead cottonwoods on the west side of the Lake. The two mature eagles were adding to a nest in one of the trees. One brought in a rather long limb and had trouble getting it in the nest but finally did. It was a comical sight to

watch the bird work at it. My apologies to James and Ada Joyce Stedje for placing them in the northeast corner of the county instead of the northwest where they live. Our granddaughter Amy Harris also saw a Magpie about the time Marian Tomlinson did. Since she lives in the southwest corner of the county, there would have been over 20 miles between the sightings.

When Marian reported this rare bird sighting to Kenneth Seyffert, birdman of Amarillo, he said he had been looking for 34 years for a magpie in the Panhandle without success. These black and white birds, larger than jays and smaller than crows, are found fairly close to us in northeast New Mexico and Colorado. Their iridescent black tails are longer than their bodies. One of my bird books said the only other North American land birds with tails longer than bodies were the Scissor-tailed and the Fork-tailed flycatchers.

Rosalie Cator called with a suggestion to talk to Jerry or Dean Sparks about starting the first pheasants in Hansford County. Jerry told me that he and Dean had raised pheasants when they were school boys living west of Gruver in the early 1950's. They had some cocks and hens and a little incubator, and they did turn quite a few young pheasants out near their home. He said they didn't start the pheasants, because a wild cock would come up to their pens and try to fight with the tame roosters. By placing some chicken wire just right, they were able to capture this wild

This puts us back to Marian Tomlinson's theory that they worked into the area, but adds that Jerry and Dean improved the number of birds.

The Hansford County 4-H Livestock Judging Team just completed their most successful year ever with a trip to the National 4-H Livestock Contest in Louisville, Kentucky. The team represented Texas by virtue of winning the state championship in June. Only one team from each state is invited to compete in the national contest, so this is quite an accomplishment. Although the team members and coaches were somewhat disappointed in their finish, they can all look back with pride. Not only did they make it to the National Championship, they beat all but 6 teams in the NATION! With a finish like that, the team members are assured of many college coaches offering scholarships to judge at the collegiate level upon graduation.

Recently, because of our landfill problems, questions have arisen about recycling and how trash customers of the City of Spearman can help cut down the solid waste expense of everyone in the City.

Currently the City of Spearman is equipped to handle several recyclable materials. Of the recyclable materials, cardboard material takes up most of the space in dumpsters and landfills. An estimated 10 to 15% of the materials going into dumpsters and the landfill is cardboard.

The City has a cardboard baler and does have a company that regularly picks up the baled cardboard. This material not only saves landfill space, but also escapes the 90 mile round trip to the Borger Transfer Station, saving time and money for

Other recyclable materials the city accepts include type I plastic, aluminum drink cans, steel and tin cans, glass, and most paper material.

With the recycling companies currently available in the Panhandle and 100% cooperation from homeowners, our total waste stream could be cut up to 25% according to the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission. This number could increase if more recycling companies find more end uses for solid waste.

While recycling is not the entire answer for our solid waste concerns (for now anyway), we can still all work at keeping our natural resources out of the landfill. If you have questions on how you can help recycle call me, Robert Patrick, City Manager at 659-2524.





The Postal Service is working with postage meter manufacturers to phase out mechanical meters and replace them with electronic or digital meters. This action is being taken to stop postage meter fraud which costs millions of dollars in losses per year. Fraud caused by tampering with mechanical meters represents the greatest share of this revenue

Recently developed electronic and digital meters have proven less vulnerable to tampering than outdated mechanical meters. For these reasons and more, the Postal Service wants everyone to change meters. The time for some to change is over a 3 year period. I have heard stories from customers saving the Postal Service is making them buy another meter. This is not true.

We are encouraging anyone getting a new meter to get an electronic one. We are working to phase out the mechanical meter. I will explain how it's done.

If you have a mechanical meter process mail for a fee, or provide metering and mailing services, such as private post office box outlets, letter shops, or mailing

houses, you need to convert by March 30, 1997. Mailers using mechanical meters which pull the letter through and place the meter directly on the envelope are asked to convert by December 31, 1997. If you have a mechanical meter and all it produces is meter strips, you are asked to convert by March, 1999. As you can see, this is taking place over a three year period.

We do encourage you not to wait until the last minute.

It will be hard for meter manufacturers to meet the demand if they have to replace these meters in the last six months. The closer customers wait to the March, 1999 deadline, the greater their risk of not getting a meter in time. Meter manufacturers are offering incentives to encourage their customers to convert early. I have had a business that has converted, and they say it's saving them time in the mail room. This is good, if that's what you are wanting.

The important thing to remember is the Post Office is not saying you must change meters now. We are asking you to work toward this over a three year






