Different year, same results.

On a cold, windy day at Old Settlers' Park that made Panhandle runners feel right at home, Spearman captured its third straight girls cross country team championship, Gruver earned its second consecutive girls team title, and Canyon took third place.

Spearman, led by a fifth-place finish from Tylo Farrar, finished with 92 points, well ahead of Cameron Yoe's total of 103, though Lynxette coach Starla Whitely wasn't sure of the outcome until the results were posted.

"When we finished, I thought we were second," she said. "Putting everything in from regionals, we knew it was going to be close, but our pack came in well and won it for us."

Gately Garnett was the second runner for Spearman in 22nd, but the performance of Itzel Mesa in 41st, Sarah Snider in 47th and Malory Martin in 52nd provided the key points the Lynxettes needed to repeat.

Spearman finished the race well, as all the Lynxettes passed competitors in the final 1,000 meters.

"We always talk about how important it is from the dam to the finish and how important it is to be mentally tough at that point," Whitely said. "The girls just do it,

Farrar ran the 3,200 meter course in 11:57. "I would have liked to have done a little better, but I'm

happy with it and excited about what we did as a team," she said. Spearman won the title with five juniors and two

I've got five juniors that know nothing other than


Gruver won its second straight title with 75 points,

beating Hamlin and Lindsay, which each had 90, and surpassing the expectations of Lady Greyhounds coach Rod Been.

"We'd been watching Hamlin all year, and we knew Lindsay had turned in some really good times from their region," Been said. "I thought if we won or if we lost, it would be five points or less."

The difference came from Gruver's last scoring runner, Makenzie Crane, who finished 38th, while Lindsay's fifth runner finished 60th and Hamlin's was 62nd.

## Texas Crop & Weather

The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors: Temperatures were near to above average early in the reporting period, with rain, sleet and snow coming to most of the region by the middle of the first week of November. By the following weekend, temperatures returned to near average or above. Soil-moisture levels were short to surplus with most counties reporting adequate. A few isolated fields of corn remained to be harvested. Wheat varied in condition from poor to good, with most counties reporting poor to fair. Rangeland varied from very poor to fair condition, with most counties reporting it to be in poor shape. Cattle were in good condition.

# Spearman City Council Passes Ordinance #826

The City of Spearman has authorized the issuance of about \$3.4 million dollars in Certificates of Obligation. These bonds will be used for the financing of some much needed infrastructure projects. Aging sewer mains will be replaced. New water wells will be drilled, along with the connection of the two ground storage tanks. These funds can also be used to assist in improvements of sidewalks, parks and the landfill.

The city earned an "A" credit rating due to its positive past fiscal performance and its current cash position. Our philosophy of paying as we go was also a point in our favor, along with the lack of debt. The interest rate for the cost of the bonds is 4.14%; the debt has a twenty year payout time line although the city has the option of paying them off early at ten years.

# words from Faith & Grace



by Cecil R. Biggers, Lutheran Lay Minister We learn to say, "My Lord, My King, and My God!

as we celebrate Christ The King by studying Jeremiah 23: 1-6, Psalm 46, Colossians 1: 1-20, and Luke 23: 33-Jeremiah brings the word of judgment upon the Shep-

herds of Israel. In this context, 'the shepherds' are the religious leaders, rulers and kings who have not cared for the sheep; the 'sheep' in this context are God's people, Israel. Leaders of the people are expected to strengthen the weak, care for the sick, seek the lost; but they have not done so. We see the judgment of God not to cause us to cower in fear, but to call us to repentance, to seek forgiveness, to amend our ways of life. Consider that as Christians we are God's sheep, but we are also sent out a shepherds to meet the needs of God's people.

The Psalmist sings a song of trust in God. He calls upon the believer to trust in God in cosmic turmoil. He sings that God tames the turmoil. He sings that God reigns. We can truly trust in our God who rules heaven and earth.

Paul is writing to the people of the Church in Colossae. These Christians are undergoing active persecution. Paul tells them that Christ has 'rescued' us from the power of darkness. The term translated as 'rescue' actually means an 'exodus'. We have been transferred to Christ's kingdom, so we should not fear an earthly one. Paul then gives us a Christology which shows us Christ as Lord, King and God. (There is more in the original language of this passage than I can comment on here.) Consider that we, dear Christian, are not what we have made ourselves, we are what God has made us. As a Christian we should live with fortitude (Greek 'hupomone), the ability to persevere in our faith regardless of our circumstances. As a Christian we should have patience (Greek makrothumia) to deal with people in all circumstances. As a Christian we should have a joy in our heart that cannot be taken from us by others. Through Jesus Christ we have been transferred to his kingdom so that we live by faith in God and with love for our fellow man.

Luke shows us Jesus crucified. The leaders mock him; the soldiers mock him. One of the two thieves he is crucified between mocks him. Yet, Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." Then the other thief asks Jesus, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Earlier Jesus had said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing". "Paradise" comes from a Persian word meaning 'walled garden'. It was an exceptional honor to be asked by a king to walk in his "Paradise". This shows us Christ the King, who even in the process of his death on a cross, reaches out to save.

May the Holy Spirit enable you to know My Lord, My King and My God!

Spearman residents Ed Whitefield and his daughter, Lisha, attended the final game of the 2010 World Series in Arlington, TX. This was the first appearance of the Texas Rangers in the World Series, and they were defeated by the San Francisco Giants, 3-1 in game 5. (The Giants won the Series 4-1.)

October was a good month for the Texas Rangers. They made history by making it to the World Series for the first time in franchise history. Their luck didn't continue through to the month of November, though.

The Rangers played game 5 on November 1st in Arlington, hoping for 52,050 seats to be filled with Ranger fans, but were greatly satisfied with the 52,045 Ranger fans who attended. Two of those fans were Lisha and her father Ed Whitefield of Spearman.

"Entering the game, we were given towels to wave high in the air, and encouraged to yell loud as the Giants were up to bat," remembered Lisha. "We waited hours in line to get World Series shirts, only to


be told they were sold out. "Prior to the game, we sat in the bleachers wondering if all these seats Bay Rays. The Texas Rangers Baseball Club has made four appearances in the MLB postseason, all following division championships in 1996, 1998, 1999, and 2010. In 2010, the Rangers advanced past the Division Series for the first time in franchise history, defeating the Tampa





the Rangers entered the playoffs for the first time since 1999, and faced the Tampa Bay Rays for the first round, which ultimately resulted in a 3-2 series victory and marked the first postseason series victory in the 50-year history of the Rangers/Washington Senators franchise. Facing the Rangers in the American League Championship Series were the defending World Champion New York Yankees, the team the Rangers failed against three separate times in the 1990s. In the playoffs, the Rangers record against the Yankees was 1-9. In a 6-game series, the Texas Rangers came out victorious, winning the first Pennant in franchise history in front of an ecstatic home Washington Senators, relocrowd.[27] Josh Hamilton cated to Minnesota and bewas awarded ALCS MVP after setting a series record for intentional walks. The ators moved to Arlington,

gled against the Giants' young pitching and eventually lost the Series 4-1, the lone win coming in Arlington on October 30. For the first time, the Rangers ended their season in the month of November.

Rangers manager Ron Washington was named the runner-up 2010 American League Manager of the Year, behind Ron Gardenhire of the Minnesota Twins. Washington guided the Rangers to their first division title in 11 years and their first trip to the World Series in franchise history.

The franchise originated in 1961 as the Washington Senators, an expansion team awarded to Washington, D.C. after the city's first ballclub, the original came the Twins. 


