Through November 16, 1999 the Department of Agriculture will
provide producers an opportunity to participate in the Request for Referendum on the Soybean Promotion and Research Order at local FSA offices. Producers may request a referendum by mail,
FAX or in person at County FSA offices until November 16th. To be eligible to request a referendum, you must have been a "person" engaged in the growing of soybeans in the United States who
owns, or shares the ownership and risk of loss of such soybeans from January 1, 1997, through November 16, 1999. The term als with a join
