Perry backs efforts to retrieve education jobs funding AUSTIN - Gov. Rick erry on Sept. 14 praised Central Texas congressional representative's
amendment to the recently passed federal education U.S. Sens. Kay Bailey Hutchison and John Cornyn
teamed up to write and file teamed up to write and file
legislation repealing legislation,
S.3768, and U.S. Rep. Michael Burgess, R-
Lewisville, led Texas' GOP House delegation in offer-
ing a House version, H.R. 6108 , to strike the amendment from H.R. 1586.
The amendment authored by U.S. Rep. Lloyd
Doggett, D-Austin. require Doggett, D-Austin, requires
the governor to make assurances about how Texas
would spend its $\$ 830$ million share bill's $\$ 10$ billion
in jobs funding. If the assurances are not made, Texas will not get the
money. Gov. Perry called money. Gov. Perry called
the requirement, which ap-,
plies only to Texas, "unfair" plies only to Texas," "unfair"
and "anti-Texas." The U.S. Department of
Education rejected the Education rejected the
Texas Edication Agency's
appation for the $\$ 830$ application for the $\$ 830$
million on Sept. 9 , because the application lacked the
required assurances from required assurances from
the governor. Perry, in re-
sponse to the rejection, arsponse to the rejection, ar-
gued that the state constitution and state laws
prohibit him from entering prohibit him from entering
into binding commitments
about future budgets or about future
funding levels.

He was member of the 336th Tactical Fighter Squadron and piloted F4 Phantoms. His electronic weapons systems of ficer was Captain John J. Smallwood of Marietta,
Georgia. On June 16, 1973, during his third tour of duty Sam's F4 was hit by hostile fire and crashed in Cambo dia. No parachutes were seen and no emergency beeper signals to indicate that the crew had ejected safely were Major Cornelius and Captain Smallwood were listed as MIA, and their bodies were never recovered.
