## Hansford Manor Maintains High Record

\*In an attempt to kill a fly I drove into a telephone pole.


\*I had been shopping for plants all day and was on my way home. As I reached an intersection a hedge sprang up, obscuring my vision and I did not see the other car.





The first is clearly no panacea: parents can become so involved in schoolwork that the child has no choice but to do To make this possible, the school must expend additional effort to communicate assignments and progress to the parents—Junior is certainly not going to carry the message! Adolescents, particularly, will confound the communication

between school and home as much as possible.

In one of the high schools where I served, for example, students had a 20-minute "homeroom" session each day. This time was used for the flag salute, council meetings, announcements, and related matters. Very little opportunity for studying occurred there, yet each day, hundreds of parents were told that all homework was finished during that session. The naive parents were led to believe that the homeroom period

was a two-hour block of concentrated effort. Parents must know what goes on in school if they want to reinforce their child's academic responsibilities. They should provide support in areas where self-discipline is needed. The evening study period should be highly structured with routine hours and a minimum of interferences. To do this, parents must know what was assigned and how the finished product should look. Finally, negative attitudes should be withheld from the learning situation. Berating and criticizing an underachiever will not make him work harder.

I must hasten to say that this procedure is not an easy solution. It rarely works for more than a week or two, since many parents also lack the required self-discipline to continue the program. And when they quit, so does Junior! There must

the program. And when they quit, so does junior: There must be a better way, and I believe there is.

An underachiever often thrives under a system of immediate reinforcement. If he is not challenged by personal satisfaction and motivators usually generated in the classroom, he must be fed some artificial incentives in the form of rewards applied to small units of behavior.

Instead of gifts or other desirable objectives being offered to the child for earning an A in English at the end of the semester, he should be given 10 cents for each properly diagramed

The use of immediate reinforcement serves the same function as a starter on a car! You can't drive very far without it, but it gets the engine going much easier than pushing.

For the idealist who objects to the use of extrinsic motivation (which is often inaccurately called a bribe), I would ask this

question: "What alternative do we have, other than to let a child grow out of his problem?"

My aunts reasoned that if a baby gets too big for the bottle - it is high time to get a bottle too big for the baby; and they decided to do something about it. They gave me a bottle so big I had to drag the darn thing around, a sport I found utterly fascinating since our Tabby cat enjoyed the contents with me! It was so much fun to press this big red nipple (I'm sure it must have been a big calf nipple used for baby calves) on the bottle and squirt milk into Tabby's mouth; and she enjoyed the game as much as I - maybe even more so! That method of weaning - for very obvious reasons, was very soon abandoned; and I was allowed only the big red nipple to carry around as my pacifier.

My family always made all of their own stuff - from lye soap to sausage making; and just about everything else. My aunts and Nannie were grinding away making home-made sausage, and I became deeply engrossed in the process - and when Nannie's back was turned just for a moment, I very hurriedly stuck the nipple which was the exact color of the sausage, into the grinder, not anticipating the result of its being ground into sausage! I must have meant to retrieve it - but the pull of the grinder took it on through and it was ground into the sausage without my aunts and Nannie having suspected.

It so happened the next Sunday that two very distinguished gentlemen were invited for Sunday dinner. They may have been Baptist ministers, "Who" they were was of no importance to me; but I remember my aunts were very eager to impress them; consequently after the meal there was much speculation as to "why"

one of the guests suddenly gagged and exhibited a very peculiar portion to the side of his plate. In fact, he ate very little else - and this was a most unusual occurrence; for almost everyone who came to dinner or supper at the Beaty's or Hillman's house always cleaned their plates and asked for seconds or even thirds for all of the girls were gourmet cooks. After the company left, the aunts began a very thorough examination of the plate - and rubber - hardly distinguishable from the sausage!

The curiosity and embarrassment of my aunts and Nannie finally led to further inquiry which resulted in the "solution" of the case: for I very casually and "without remorse," confessed I had put the nipple into the grinding machine for the sausage. That experience "broke" me completely of the bottle habit and I might add it could have been a very contributing factor in the fact to this day I have never liked anything out of a bottle!! Several years later - when I was

a senior and teenager and was fixing to graduate from high school (class of '66) - we had then what was called class nites - all parents and town came. Our class will was read and our history and what we'd be doing 30 years from then - and was also a time when amusing stories were told about each of us seniors and about to graduate young adults. When my name was called (I might add the huge old Auditorium was packed wall to wall with people) they said, "Who got their nipple caught in the sausage grinder at age of 3?!" As I was halfway down to the floor in my seat, of course everyone very quickly guessed who the "who" was! The laughter that filled that huge old auditorium brought deep red to my cheeks and completely jarred my dignity - to say nothing of my self-esteem!

Soo - you see, what you sow you are sure to reap and I was reaping that long ago day some of the humiliation my dear aunts and grandmother must have felt back a long time ago! Aren't memories wonderful things!

Soo - for now I leave you once again in Sam's Corner. I hope everyone has a fun filled and safe summer and if I dare, may I say: If you drink don't drive; and if you drive, don't drink. Be safe


