

Texas shoppers get a break from state and local sales
taxes on August holiday. Lay-away plans can be used again this year to take advantage of the sales tax holiday. As in previous years, the law exempts most clothing
and footwear priced under $\$ 100$ from sales and use and footwear priced under $\$ 100$ from sales and use $\$ 100$ they spend. Backpacks under $\$ 100$ and used by elementary and secondary students are also exempt. A backpack is a pack with straps one wears on the back.
The exemption during the sales tax holiday includes The exemption during the sales tax holiday includes
backpacks with wheels, provided they can also be worn on the back like a traditional backpack, and messenger bags. The exemption does not include items that are reasonably defined as luggage, briefcases, athletic/duffle/gym bags, computer bags, purses or framed
backpacks. Ten or fewer backpacks can be purchased tax-free at one time without providing an exemption certificate to the seller
The 81 st Texas Legislature recently passed HB 1801

emption from Texas state and local sales and use taxes during the annual sales tax holiday in August. Effective this year, in addition to clothes, footwear and some backpacks, Texas families also get a sales tax break on most

The average taxable value of a residence homestead in City of Spearman this year is $\$ 36,926$. If the goveming body adopts the effective tax rate for this year of $\$ 0.515203$ per $\$ 100$ of taxable value, the amount of taxes imposed this year on the average home would be $\$ 190.24$
