WHAT KNOT TO DO - Every angler searches for the perfect knot that will not break under the pressure of a really big fish. The prob-

fessional fishermen like fessional fishermen like Jimmy
Houston and Roland Martin have told me that they use the palomar knot because it will tie a lure at close to $100 \%$ of the strength of their line.
But it took talking Tommy Biffle of Wagoner, Okla., to finally conperfect knot and start building my confidence in the palomar. Biffle, who invented long distance pitching, explained this easy-to-tie knot

in terms that I finally understood.
