field is hayed, the remaining unhayed 50 percent cannot be grazed; it must remain unhayed and ungrazed for wildlife. In addition, participants are limited to
one hay cutting and are not permitted to one hay cutting and are not permitted to
sell any of the hay. There will be a 25 persent CRP payment reduction depending on the number of acres actually hayed.
