Hounds - State Bound

How sweet it is! After knocking on the state tournament door numerous times in recent years, the Hounds busted through that door with a 63-59 win over Whiteface. For the first time in 30 years, the Hounds will be in the state tournament as one of four elite teams representing Class A.

For fans and players, it was every bit as wonderful as had been imagined. Following the game and the regional trophy presentation, fans cheered and "Houndball, Houndball." A group of high school girls, donned in T-shirts bearing the players numbers, began a rousing a cappella rendition of the Gruver fight song that never sounded sweeter.

The jubilant crowd remained for the traditional net cutting and cheered for each player as they held up their snippet of net. Fans lingered in the Texan Dome to congratulate players and coaches and bask in the victory before braving the wintry storm awaiting them outside.

After knocking off number-oneranked Paducah on Friday night, state playoff dreams were already on the minds of many before the Whiteface game began. The game itself started in traditional Hound fashion with a Jim Potts' tip, this time to Brant Armes who promptly put the ball

usual fashion as Gruver's shooting turned cold, and Hound players were quickly called for several fouls. Senior Buster McLain was tapped for two fouls in the period. The game suddenly began to take on a ominous look for the Hounds which was reflected in Whiteface's 10 - 6 lead at the conclusion of the first quarter.

The second quarter went better for the Hounds when the cold shooting that plagued the first stanza of play wore off, and five players added to Gruver's tally. The Hound's luck in the foul department though did not change, and Potts, Jared Johnson, and McLain were forced to spend some time on the bench.

At this point, Dallas Henson came in the game for McLain to assist in ball-handling duties. Henson was able to nab a rebound and add two for the Hounds with his put-back shot, Bray Armes came in to score three in the form of free throws, and Jason TeBeest swooshed in a long two.

In the waning seconds of the half, senior post Johnson tied the score with a quick put-back under the basket. With the score knotted at 24, fans were assured that Houndball was alive and well and anxiously awaited the second half.

At the beginning of the third quarter, Gruver suffered a bad blow early as McLain was called for his third foul of the game, and Johnson, also, was called later on his third. The first five minutes found the Whiteface Antelopes in the lead by two to four points until McLain took a lightning pass from Brant and nailed a lay-up to tie the game at 2:30.

With the second of his threepointers of the night, Brant then put the Hounds in the lead by three. A steal culminating in a

(for want of a better description) backwards scoop shot by Brant capped off the third quarter with the score Gruver 38, Whiteface 35.

The final period again began on a downbeat for the Hounds when McLain and Johnson both were pegged early with their fourth fouls and Potts with his third. Gruver quickly accumulated 9 fouls to Wniteface's one which gave the Antelopes a huge advantage in the free-throw department.

But just at a time when Lady Luck seemed to be frowning again on the Hounds, Potts made a timely three-point play, and a rocket in the form of Brant Armes ignited. With a blazing display for artistry on the floor and a relentless aerial attack, Brant fired four three-point bombs on target leaving Whiteface players, coaches, and fans in a state of unbelief.

At 1:42, big post Johnson, who played a big part in the Hounds' defense, fouled out and was replaced by Bray Armes. Ironically, the Antelopes sought to use the device which had hampered the Hounds all night, fouls, to get them back into the game. Since Whiteface only had two team fouls late in the fourth. they were able to use the device to their advantage awhile before setting up a one-and -one situation. With the Hounds in the lead by four with 48 seconds The remainder of the first remaining, Brant missed the front quarter, however, was not in the end of the first one-and-one for the Hounds, and Whiteface was still viable.

Although Brant netted two points in the next one-and one, the Antelopes answered with a three and made the score Gruver 59, Whiteface 56 with 42.6 seconds

In two more one-and one situations, senior Armes picked up two more points, and sophomore Armes added one. Gruver was then up by six, but the Antelopes, formidable foes to the end, netted a quick three at the eight second

A final chance to tie the game was squelched when Brant sealed the Antelope's fate with a pass interception near mid court.

The final buzzer sounded, and the Gruver Greyhounds were the Region 1 Champions. The Hound bench joined the players on the court in a frenzy of celebration as Gruver fans celebrated in the stands. And, yes, it was everything we had thought it would be, and more.





Focus On The Family

QUESTION: My little girl is sometimes sugarsweet, and other times she is unbearably irritating. How can I get her out of a bad mood when she has not really done anything to deserve punishment?

DR. DOBSON: I would suggest that you take her in your arms and talk to her in this manner: "I don't know whether you've noticed it or not, but you have two 'personalities.' A personality is a way of acting and talking and behaving. One of your personalities is sweet and loving. No one could possibly be more lovable and happy when this personality is in control. It likes to work and look for ways to make the rest of the family

"And all you have to do is press a little red button, 'ding,' and out comes the other personality. It is cranky and noisy and silly. It wants to fight with your brother and disobey your mom. It gets up grouchy in the morning and complains throughout the day.

"Now, I know that you can press the button for the neat personality or you can call up the mean one. Sometimes it takes some punishment to make you press the right button. If you keep on pressing the wrong one, like you have been today, then I'm going to make you uncomfortable, one way or the other. I'm tired of that cranky character, and I want to see the grinny one. Can we make a deal?'

When discipline becomes a game, as in a conversation such as this, then you've achieved your purpose without conflict





Hounds Defeat Paducah

Hounds Slay Dragons by Harletta Carthel

The Gruver Greyhounds went into their game with Paducah Friday night knowing three factors about the Dragons: they were tall, they were fast, and they were number one in the state. At the conclusion of the game, the Dragons were still tall and fast, but they were no longer number anything. For the second year in a row, the mighty GHS dragon slayers eliminated Paducah from regional competition.

The semi-final game with the Dragons began with Paducah getting the tip ball and quickly shooting an unsuccessful lay-up followed by an even quicker putback. The Dragons did indeed look menacing.

Upon their first possession, Gruver used a spread offense which greatly slowed down the Hounds' usual pace. In the close first quarter of play, Brant Armes hit two three-pointers, Buster McLain hit a scoop shot under the basket and two free throws, and Jim Potts put up a basket for two.

Due to the Dragons' height advantage, it was surprising to see them attempting several outside shots in the period. The score at the end of the first quarter was Gruver 11, Paducah

The Dragons scored quickly in the opening seconds of the second quarter. McLain then scored on a good second effort play by netting two when he rebounded his own blocked shot and followed with a free shot. Brant Armes then hit a long two, and Jared Johnson snagged a nice jump shot.

The Dragons experienced a setback when guard James McGrunder suffered a leg injury at

the game. The halftime score found Gruver down by two, 23-25.

The Hounds were true to their game plan when they returned to the court and continued in their slowed flex offense. Even so, much of the third quarter found Gruver down by two to four points.

At 1:35, sophomore Lance Hallum hit a two to even the score. McLain then made a high baseline shot over a much-taller defender to put the Hounds up by two. The Dragons sought to tie the score, but neither of the two long shots in the final seconds of the third quarter found paydirt. The Hounds, themselves, were unable to get a shot off before the buzzer, and the period ended with Gruver 31, Paducah 29.

The decisive last eight minutes of the game began with a two under the basket by Hallum following a great pass from Brant. The Dragons next efforts were thwarted by Potts blocking a shot, and Johnson stealing the ball. The Hounds tallied on the other end with a lay-up by McLain.

In the Hounds next possession, McLain, amazingly dribbled the ball through a hard trip and fall to maintain Gruver's control. He then passed to Potts under the basket who drew a foul and chalked up two free throws, making the score at 6:08, 37-29,

Paducah narrowed the margin with a three by Jason Poteet. Potts retaliated with a beautiful jumper from the center of the paint.

Potts scored again when Brant found him alone under the basket and blitzed a long pass. The fierce Dragons still had fire in their

The Hounds were then beset by two missed shots, a lane violation call, and a foul assessment. Although Paducah's Brad Flemons missed both free throw shots, the Hounds' bad luck was not over. McLain was called on a walk, and Potts was nabbed for a foul. This time the Dragon shooter swished both free shots, and the score at 1:32 stood Gruver 42-39.

When Gruver took possession again, the Hounds, in their spread offense, began to move the ball around to tick time off the clock and wait for the perfect shot. The expert ball-handling by the Hounds resulted in two fouls called on the Dragons but one less than enough for a one-and-one shot. At 45.4, the score remained

Finally, at 33.5 seconds, Paducah garnered their seventh foul, but Brant was unable to hit the first shot. A surprising moving pick call on Gruver at 27.2 turned the ball over to Paducah, and the tension became nearly unbearable.

The feeling was mutual, though, and a high pass to a Paducah post waiting by the basket, gave the ball back to Gruver. As soon as Brant caught the in-bounds ball, a foul was called on the Dragons. Brant again was unable to hit the front end of the situation, and Paducah regained the ball. The Dragons, though, were called on a walking violation and then a foul.

For the third time, Brant stepped up to the line and calmly pegged the shot that gave Gruver the assurance that even a threepointer would be of no avail to the

In the final four seconds, the Gruver players clustered near mid court and did not challenge the Dragons as they made a long pass to an awaiting player who put up an unsuccessful three. > Much of my research on Hansford County history before the twentieth century, has fallen on the area of the Park or the part of the county north east of the Park. Ira Neff, indicted for the first murder, the Rifle Pits, and James Harry McGee, first sheriff, were all near each other. At the time Ira Neff and J Harry McGee were neighbors, John DeLong had bought the improvements of the 777 Ranch, which my research points to being the same spot as the Rifle Pits, or at least very close to it.

For you that are not familiar with the Rifle Pits, that seems to be the name given to the site where in the winter of 1868-69 General Carr out of Fort Lyons, Colorado with a force of some 700 men made a semipermanent camp for the headquarters of a winter campaign. Buffalo Bill Cody was chief of Scouts and one account says saved the command from

starvation by locating and killing

a small herd of buffalo. That spring Carr and his men were called back to Fort Lyons. They had to leave some equipment, because they had lost too many horses to take it all back. For some reason the site became the Rifle Pits--perhaps the soldiers had dug rifle pits for protection against the Indians. Some seem to think the soldiers buried rifles and thus the name Rifle Pits.

J. Evetts Haley mentions the Rifle Pits twice in his biography of George Littlefield, whose herd in 1877 came down from Dodge City by way of the Rifle Pits and Zulu. In Dec. of 1877, Phelps White was sent to Dodge City for food for the Panhandle ranches. He spent a night at the Rifle Pits with some men hunting wild
