Dillow \& Sons were hired to build the church and its benches and the

to paint the building. The structure was finished just in time for a two-week-long revival on
May 15, 1921 , led first by the Morton sisters and then by by the Morton Detroit, Mich. Union Church historians estimate over 1,000 people attended one of the revival's sunday services (this at a time when Spear-
man boasted a population of only 250 ) man boasted a population of only 280 men and boys in a garage while
