# Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures 

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You
dures if you have a concern about:
the value placed on your propert
any exemptions that may apply to you
the cancellation of an agricultural appraisal the cancellation of an agricullaret the local governments which should be taxing your property
dy action taken by the appraisal district that adversely affected you.

Informal Review
The first option a taxpayer may use to protest a value is to visit with the chief appraiser or a staff member. Records on individual properis to the benefit of the taxpayer, as many protests are resolved at this level.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board
If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal dis(ARB)

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a
notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative will be asked to present eveidence about your case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at 709 West 7th Street, Spearman, Texas, 806-659-5575. Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARb members outside of the hear ing. The taw requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your casse before the ARB hears it
Review by the District Court
After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. If the appraisal district has appraised your property at $\$ 1,000,000$ or more, you must file a notice of appeal with the chief appraiser within 15 days of the date you receive the ARB's order

## Usual Deadline

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later)

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have a good cause
Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records
more information.

## Special Deadlines

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of he determination was mailed to you

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a notice of the determination was mailed to you

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARe de whether a required notice was mailed to you
