Lending Cooperatives Offer Scholarships for **Young Farmers**

Agricultural producers 35 years old and younger are eligible to attend the Texas Cooperative Extension's next Master Marketer session for half price Master thanks to AgTexas Farm Credit Services and Great Plains Ag Credit.

These West Texas lending coop eratives have teamed up to offer the price break to young farmers in an ongoing effort to support the area's young and beginning farmers. Tuition for the intensiv marketing and risk managemen education program is \$250, so each scholarship reduces a young farmer's cost to \$125.

The first of four 2003 Master Marketer Program sessions begins January 22nd in Lubbock and sign-up is still under way although registration is limited Participants in the program will learn how to identify and evaluate marketing opportunities, and then design and follow, through with sound marketing plans.


Credit System and represents the



She married Oscar Doshier March 30, 1934. He died in 1995. She con-

tinued to reside on the family farm before moving to Spearman, Texas in 1996





These birds have not been ones I identified, but now I will look for these light colored birds. They are most easily seen close-up when the snow is on the ground but melted back from the sides of the road.
