He sat on a college board of trustees that encouraged fiim to continue attending meetings as long as he was able. One of the Goard members drove Bill to the meetings and brought him back home afterward. This continued even after he fiad lost his ability to remember names, track a conversation or participate in any meaningful way.
His wife knew that hie remained a board member in name orly, and that their decision to include fiim was made solefy out of compassion. But Bill seemed to enjoy himself at the meetings and she reasoned that they were probably good for Fim. After hie returned from one such meeting of the trustees, his wife asked fim, "Did you fave a good meeting, Bill?" He thought for a moment before replying. Then he answered quite honestly, "I don't know." After a pause, he added this heartfelt comment: "But they still think I'm a people."
"To them, he was somebody. To them, he mattered. He was a stilf a person of value and worth. He could no longer read or write or do any of the things which fiad been important earlier. But he was still "a people."
