Suicide case turns to possible homicide
Last week, Hansford County residents were shocked when they heard about the sudden death of Cynthia Howell, a Spearman business woman. Howell, who was
found in a ravine near Skellytown last Monday, was believed to hav an autopsy report and several unanswered questions, investigators are loo
cide.
Although investigators do be lieve that Howell's death was hom cide, no suspects have been arrested
at this time. "We are continually at this time. We are continually questioning people, but we have
certain suspects at this time," stated Carson County Sheriff Loren Brand.

The autopsy reports did sho that Howell died from two gunshot wounds to the chest. However, both bullets did exit her body, but only one was found at the location. handgun that was found at the scene may not have been the wespon thet fired the two shots. If the homicide proves true, this would be the first homicide in Carson County in several years. As of now, Danny Howell, her husband, who was flown to North west Texas Hospital in Amarill after stabbing himself in the abdo-
men when he heard about his wife's death, has been recently released.
