

Weekly Update

Texas, November 14- Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have risen 1.3 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.22/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has fallen 1.1 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.43/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were 53.6 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 3.2 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 4.4 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 54.4 cents per gallon higher

than this day one year ago. "Even as crude oil comes close to \$100/bbl, retail gasoline prices have held their ground and spot prices for gasoline have given up gains," said Patrick De-Haan, GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst. "We certainly have some shifts going on in the market as diesel production is favored over gasoline, meaning refiners will boost production of distillate at the cost of gasoline production. Diesel and middle distillate demand remains strong while gasoline demand is somewhat weak, causing gasoline to seemingly disconnect from the upward trend of the crude oil and distillate market,"

DeHaan added. GasBuddy operates, TexasGasPrices.com, and over 225 other local gasoline pricetracking websites that fol-low prices at over 125,000 gasoline stations in the United States and Canada. GasBuddy also uses Facebook (facebook.com/gasbuddy) Twitter (twitter.com/gas buddy), and phone apps to keep motorists ahead of changing gasoline prices.

Words from Faith & Grace

We end the Season of Pentecost with Christ the King Sunday. We see the glory of Christ and the love of God as we study Ezekiel 34: 11-24, Psalm 95: 1-7a, Ephesians 1: 11-23, and Matthew 25: 31-46.

In the first ten verses of the thirty-fourth chapter of Ezekiel, the Lord God condemns the "shepherds" of his people--the king, the religious leaders. These "shepherds" have neglected the sheep by exploiting the poor and ignoring the pleas of the marginalized. God declares that "I myself will be the shepherd of my sheep, and I will make them lie down...I will seek the lost, and I will bring back the strayed, and I will bind up the injured, and I will strengthen the weak, but the fat and the strong I will destroy. I will feed them justice." God promises to judge between the sheep and care for those who are of his flock. These verses hold hope for those who are poor. powerless, and oppressed. The wayward leaders shall be punished. Take heed Christian, faith in Christ is found in action. In Hebrew justice is "misphat" and this word is exemplified by action! Justice is what God expects from us who believe because of what he has done for us. If we do not actively take up the cause of the poor, the widow, the orphan, the marginalized, we do not belong to Christ the Good Shepherd

The Psalmist sings a song of the reign of God. God is our Mighty King! He sittges For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.

Paul writes a hymn of Thanksgiving for the wonderful work of God in the Ephesians. Paul prays that God will give the Ephesians a "spirit of wisdom and revelation" as they come to know Christ the King. These words are praise to God and the very hearing of them is reas suring and inspiring to the believer.

Matthew shows us Christ the King returned in glory Christ judges between his sheep (similar to the passage in Ezekiel). Christ says to those on his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." The righteous do not remember doing these things for Christ the King, but Jesus tells them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." We dear Christian are children of God; we are family. Can you look upon the face of the homeless, of the hungry, of the ill, of the desperate poor and not see the very face of our Lord and King? Justice (misphat) Heb.) is part of our disciple life; it is action to relieve those in need in the name of our King.

May the Holy Spirit enable you to see the face of Christ the King in those who are in need as we celebrate this season of Thanksgiving.



Hansford County Library **Needs Your Help**

One of the earliest libraries in antiquity was the Library of Alexandria, Egypt, that was established in the third century B.C. The documents consisted entirely of papyrus scrolls. There are reports of other libraries whose documents were clay tablets with cuneiform writing. As soon as man was able to record his thoughts, ideas, and feelings, it became important to have a place to store them so they could be saved and accessed by others. If every new generation had to start over in their search for knowledge without having the discoveries of previous generations to build on, we would still be learning how to build a wheel and start a fire to cook our meals.

The most famous library in the United States is the Library of Congress located in Washington DC across the street from the Capitol Building. Originated in 1800, it was burned by the British in 1814. Thomas Jefferson sold his personal library to Congress soon after the original books were destroyed. He received \$23,940 for his collection of 6,487 books, many of which were extremely rare. Today the Library holds 144 million items and is the largest library in the world.

Andrew Carnegie was a Scottish American who became a leading entrepreneur and led the expansion of the American steel industry in the late 19th century. He is regarded by many as the second-richest man in history after John D. Rockefeller. Carnegie became a philanthropist in his later years and especially believed in the importance of education which could be obtained through reading. Between 1883 and 1929, Carnegie made grants to assist in the building of 2,509 libraries of which 1,689 were in the United States. One of the conditions of the grants was that the city must agree to provide 10% of the cost of building the library in operating funds for the library each year.

As a child before school age, I recall my mother, Ethel Pittman, taking me to a library in Spearman sometime during the early '50s. She received a teaching degree from Panhandle A&M College and believed strongly in the value of education. Not only did she teach her two sons to read, but also her seven grandchildren before they started to school. Most nights when I went to bed, my father, Erlis Pittman, was still up reading. Your education continues throughout your life and having books available to read or listen to is

Spearman is fortunate to have a wonderful library that provides not only books, but audiobooks, DVDs, interlibrary loan book service, Spanish language books, and perhaps most important in this century, six public use computers. Not everyone can afford a computer and there are many things that you cannot do today

without a computer. Spearman needs a healthy library. The Hansford County Library is an independent 501-C3 corporation and is not a division of the city or county although they each provide about 35% of the operating expenses of the library. The school no longer rents the second story of the library for alternative school for \$6,000 per year. The State of Texas no longer provides the Lone Star grant of up to \$5,000 per year. The Thriftshop, which has provided in excess of \$6,000 per year for many years to the library, was recently renovated and has not provided funding for some time. The Thriftshop is now open, and will hopefully provide a service to the community and operating funds to the library. In the mean time, the library is behind on its budget. I am asking that you join me in making a tax deductible donation to the Hansford County Library. Our Library needs help



He is a 2011 graduate of Spearman High School.


