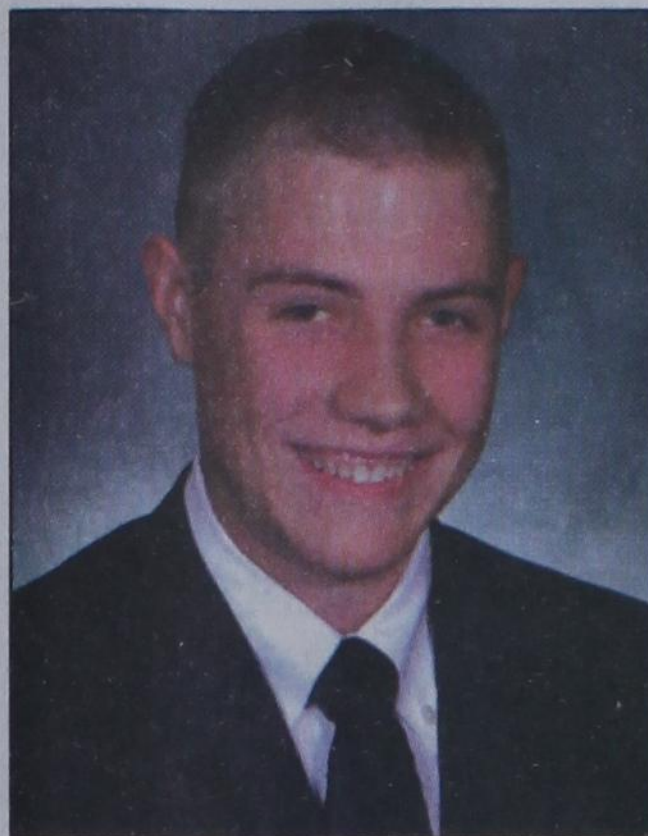

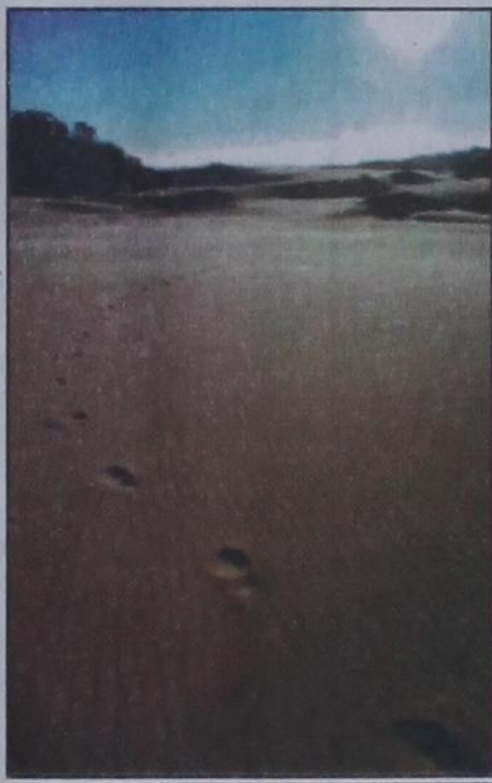
Texas Crop & Weather

The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors: Dry and windy conditions continued. Soil-moisture was mostly rated as being very short. The danger of wildfire remained high. Producers were busy in the fields: planting cotton, finishing up corn planting and actively irrigating. With no rain, winter wheat continued to decline, and producers with irrigation were reallocating water to summer crops. Rangeland and pasture conditions were mostly very poor. Drought left livestock producers with dried-out rangeland, and required them to do a lot of supplemental feeding. High fuel costs combined with high feed prices caused some producers to decide to cut their losses and sell off herds.

USDA Reminds Producers of Fast-Approaching Federal Farm Program Deadlines

Hansford County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Rick Hargrove, reminds producers that several federal farm program sign-up and reporting deadlines are approaching. The enrollment deadline for the 2011 Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) and the Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) Program is June 1, 2011.

Eligible DCP participants receive a direct payment and/or a counter-cyclical payment. Direct payment rates are established by statute regardless of market prices. Counter-cyclical payments vary depending on market prices, and are issued only when the effective price for a commodity is below its target price (which takes into account the direct payment rate, market price and loan rate).

ACRE protects producers from farm market revenue declines when revenue triggers are met for a commodity at both the state and farm level. Farms that are already enrolled in the Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP) for a crop year can elect to switch to ACRE before the end of sign-up.

Both DCP and ACRE participants must sign annual contracts to receive program benefits. All signatures of producers who will receive a share of DCP and ACRE payments must be on file by the June 1, 2011 deadline.

"Due to multiple program deadline dates in the next few months, all FSA county offices are experiencing an increase in workload, so it is important for producers to be aware of these deadlines and make appointments with our office to sign up for program benefits as soon as possible," said

Hargrove.

Below is a schedule of important FSA program deadlines to remember:

May 31, 2011 - 2010 Crop Year Final Loan Availability Date for Corn, Soybeans, Grain Sorghum, Sunflowers, Rice, Cotton and Pulse Crops

June 1, 2011 - Deadline for 2011 Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP) Enrollment and for 2011 Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) Program Election

July 29, 2011 - 2009 Supplemental Revenue Assistance (SURE) Program Signup Deadline

August 1, 2011 - Deadline to Request a 2011 Farm Reconstitution

September 1, 2011 - Deadline to file 2010 Production Reports for ACRE. This deadline was extended from the original deadline of July 15, 2011 for 2010 production only.

The 2011 Crop Year Acreage Reporting deadline for most crops and the deadline to file 2010 Production Reports for most Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) crops varies by region, so Hargrove suggests producers contact the local FSA county office to determine county-specific deadlines. Producers whose operations are located in the southern part of the state should note that acreage reporting and NAP deadlines may have already passed. Contact FSA to confirm.

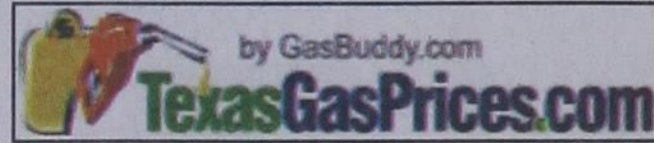

Memorial Day 2011 is a United States federal holiday observed on the last Monday of May (May 30 in 2011). Formerly known as Decoration Day, it commemorates U.S. soldiers who died while in the military service. First enacted to honor Union soldiers of the American Civil War. It was extended after World War I to honor Americans who have died in all wars.

Memorial Day often marks the start of the summer vacation season, and Labor Day its end.

Begun as a ritual of remembrance and reconciliation after the Civil War, by the early 20th century, Memorial Day was an occasion for more general expressions of memory, as ordinary people visited the graves of their deceased relatives, whether they had served in the military or not. It also became a long weekend increasingly devoted to shopping, family get-togethers, fireworks, trips to the beach, and national media events such as the Indianapolis 500 auto race, held since 1911 on Memorial Day.



Weekly Update

Texas, May 23- Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 10.9 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.73/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has fallen 8.8 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.83/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were \$1.06/g higher than the same day one year ago and are 1.3 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has increased 0.1 cents per gallon during the last month and stands \$1.04/g higher than one year ago.

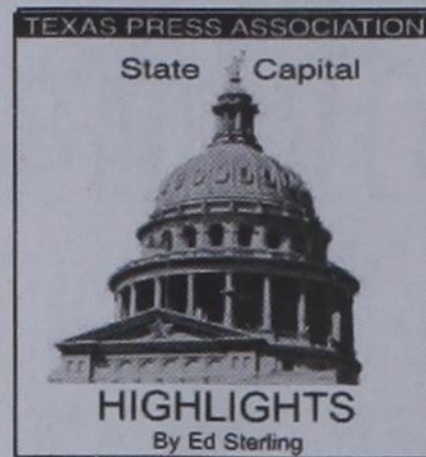

STATE CAPITAL HIGHLIGHTS

Budget close to passage in final week

AUSTIN — Actions taken by the state House and Senate point toward the possibility of completing a state budget on or before May 30, the final day of the session.

House Speaker Joe Straus and Lt. Gov. David Dewhurst, who presides over the Senate, sent out press releases late in the week indicating negotiations were going well enough to pass a balanced budget that relies on historically deep cuts.

The House did pass a Senate "fiscal matters" bill — one just for public education — but House members attached amendments to the bill. The Senate, in turn, refused to concur on those amendments. A conference committee of five House members and five Senate members has a shrinking window of time to come to an agreement on the final language. Another Senate fiscal matters bill, one that deals with budget areas other than public education, was scheduled for consideration in the House on May 23.

Texas Comptroller Susan Combs on May 17 generated optimism about the state's financial health a few days before the Legislature entered the final week of the 140-day session without a finalized state budget for 2012-2013.

"I am raising the general revenue estimate for the next biennium by \$1.2 billion," Combs said, estimating that sales tax, oil and gas production tax and motor vehicle sales tax should bring in more revenue than trends indicated earlier.

Of the projected \$1.2 billion, the largest component is \$400 million in oil and gas production tax. Whatever the real number turns out to be for oil and gas production taxes, 75 percent of those are constitutionally reserved for deposit into the state's so-called "rainy day" fund.

Even though the budget is expected to total more than \$160 billion, the rainy day fund remains a bone of contention. Some Texans say it is "raining" now, so it is time to use most, if not all of the fund to shore up cut-back public education and health care programs. And some Texans stand with Gov. Rick Perry, who said he would reject any plan that employs the fund in 2012-2013. House Bill 1 in its present form does not use rainy day funds.

Perry, now in his eleventh year as governor, recently has been mentioned as a possible presidential candidate in 2012. And although he's been shrugging off the idea while making speeches that seem national in scope, Perry's pressing task is to scrutinize the growing pile of passed legislation on his desk. He has until June 19 to sign, veto or let bills become law without his signature. Here are a few of the 180 bills the governor had signed as of May 20:

HB 15: relating to informed consent to an abortion.

HB 558: relating to pay-off statements provided in connection with certain home loans.

HB 613: relating to unauthorized harvesting of standing timber.

HB 1806: relating to fishing tournament fraud.

SB 18: relating to use of eminent domain authority.

SB 894: relating to employment of physicians by certain hospitals.

SB 1160: relating to the liability of landowners for damage or injury, including liability for harm to a trespasser.

SB 1269: relating to transportation, lodging, and meals offered to and accepted by public servants.

In other recent action, the House approved Senate-originated redistricting bills for House districts and Senate districts. Those bills may get the governor's signature, but there already are indications from certain Democratic lawmakers that

Tax holiday this weekend

State sales tax holidays put a damper on the intake of state and local taxes, but strangely enough, they survived the Legislature's revenue hunting and budget writing process.

In fact, Texas' fourth annual "Energy Star" Sales Tax Holiday is May 28-30. "You can save water and energy by purchasing efficient, ENERGY STAR appliances," said Comptroller Combs. "And during the ENERGY STAR Sales Tax Holiday, you won't pay state or local sales taxes on your new appliances."

Unemployment rate drops

The Texas Workforce Commission on May 20 reported Texas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased to 8.0 percent for April, down from 8.1 percent in March, and from 8.2 percent a year ago and Texas' total nonfarm employment was up by 32,900 jobs in April for a total gain of 254,400 jobs from a year ago.

Spearman Police Department Joins Click It or Ticket Campaign

Spearman Police Department will join local and national law enforcement officers and highway safety advocates all across the country for the 2011 national Click It or Ticket seat belt enforcement mobilization, May 23-June 5.

During the mobilization, officers will be cracking down on motorists who fail to wear their seat belts - both day and night.

Because nighttime passenger vehicle occupants are among those least likely to buckle up and most likely to die in crashes when unrestrained, nighttime enforcement has become a priority of the Click It or Ticket mobilization. Of those who died in nighttime crashes in 2009, nearly two-thirds (62 percent) were not wearing seat belts at the time of their fatal crashes.

In 2009, 11,593 passenger vehicle occupants died in motor vehicle crashes nationwide between the nighttime hours of 6 p.m. and 5:59 a.m., according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

"Many more nighttime traffic deaths can be prevented if more motorists simply start wearing their

seat belts. That's why Spearman Police Department is strongly supporting enhanced nighttime enforcement of seat belt laws during the May 23 - June 5, 2011, Click It or Ticket campaign," said Chief Robert Baker. "We will be out in force to remind drivers and occupants to always wear their seat belts - both day and night."

High-visibility enforcement such as the Click It or Ticket mobilization is credited with increasing the national belt usage rate from 58 percent in 1994 to an observed usage rate of 85 percent in 2010. Belt use saves thousands of lives each year across America. In 2009 alone, seat belts saved 12,713 lives nationwide.

"Law enforcement will be cracking down on Click It or Ticket violators around the clock. Local motorists should be prepared to buckle up. If law enforcement finds you on the road unbuckled anytime or anywhere, you can expect to get a ticket - not a warning. No excuses and no exceptions," said Corporal Jessica Kay.

Remember this May 23 to June 5: It's Click It or Ticket. Buckle up and en-

courage your loved ones to do the same. You'll save the cost of a ticket and may even save a life.

Words from Faith & Grace

In the sixth week of the Season of Easter we learn that because Christ has risen we are assured of our future regardless of circumstance. We study Acts 17:22-31, Psalm 66: 8-20, 1 Peter 3: 13-22, and John 14: 15-21.

Six hundred years before Paul's trip to Athens, Epimenides, a Cretan poet, solved a plague that struck Athens by releasing a flock of black and white sheep from the Areopagus (site of Paul's sermon). The Athenians then watched the sheep and sacrificed them on the altar nearest where the sheep lay down to rest. Some of them were sacrificed to "an unknown god". Paul presents Jesus to the Athenians as the "unknown God." Paul tells the Athenians that God is not made by human hands but God is the Creator of all things. This God guides history. This God makes us humans instinctively seek Him. Paul warns the Athenians that the days are over when blindly seeking God was enough. Judgment is coming. We can be assured that Christ is God because of the resurrection. Some of the Athenians scoffed, while others wished to hear more. Paul quoted a line from Epimenides poetry, "In Him we live and move and have our being."

The Psalmist sings a song asking the people to "come and see what God has done." He then sings that although God has tested the people, God has kept them among the living and prevented them from 'slipping'. He then sings of God's steadfast love for the Psalmist. This is a song where you can insert yourself into it and it still rings true. Peter continues to encourage the new Christians. Showing that few will harm those who are eager to do good, but if we do suffer harm for our faith, we can be strong because we know whose hand guides our history. Peter advises those who must give an account of their faith to do so with gentleness and reverence. Present Jesus in a Jesus-like manner. And, if the believer suffers, take comfort in the fact that Christ also suffered for us. The servant is not above the master.

Jesus tells his disciples, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." Remember those tough commandments: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your mind and all your strength; and, love your neighbor as yourself". We cannot alone accomplish this, but Jesus asked the Father to send another, an Advocate (Gr. paraclite), to be with us forever. This Advocate is the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit dwells within the believer. It is the Holy Spirit who works within us to lead us to faith in Jesus Christ and who through our baptism marks us as belonging to Christ forever.

May the Holy Spirit indwell in you that you may pass the test of love, obedience to our Lord, Jesus Christ.

He had climbed down before he noticed the snake coiled near him. The sprinkler had run and it was a cool morning. This made the snake lethargic. He didn't seem to notice Jim. Ramon has seen two rattlesnakes so far this spring. When the Spearman elementary students came to

the Park last week, they saw a number of snakes, but they were all bull snakes.

Last week there were 6 campers behind the dam, but this coming weekend he expects the numbers to change. Memorial Day Weekend has always been the busiest weekend of the year out at the Lake. One year he had all the RV spots full with two campers on the hookups in two places.

Jim and his crew have been busy preparing for the visitors, and I am sure they will receive many compliments on how the Park looks. Nature is doing its

part, too. There are lots of the beautiful wine cups out in Dedication Park and the surrounding area. This is a good time to look for other wild flowers.

If you are more adventurous, look on the rocky ledges for the barrel and lace cacti. They are blooming now.

A pair of Lazuli Buntings turned up at Mandy and Jim's bird feeder last week. These birds may be returnees, as I think they have had this Bunting other years. I have not seen any of the Buntings, but the Lazuli is more often found in the Panhandle than the Indigo or Painted Buntings. The Lazuli females are rather drab, but the males in their breeding plumage (sky-blue head and back, reddish breast, and white belly) are colorful.
