Each Fourth of July, we gather to celebrate our nation's independence with fireworks, street parades, backyard barbeques and other familiar rituals that mark a summer in full swing. Our vigilance has thankfully foiled such attempts on our soil, including recent bomb plots at Fort Dix and JFK International Airport. Our brave servicemen and women are fighting terrorism in Iraq, in Afghanistan and around the world so the terrorists will not be able to export their heinous crimes to America.

As we celebrate this Fourth of July, we send our special thoughts and earnest prayers to those American men and women who fight to defend our way of life. Our founding fathers pledged everything they had to secure our freedom. Today, we honor the men and women who follow in their footsteps to preserve it, and carry on our legacy of liberty.

# Words from Faith & Grace

#### by Cecil R. Biggers, Lutheran Lay Minister

In the sixth week after Pentecost, we study Isaiah 66:10-16, Psalm 56:1-9, Galatians 6:(1-6)7-16, and Luke 10:1-11,16-20. Isaiah gives comforting words to the people of Israel; telling the people to rejoice. He uses a picture of Yahweh comforting Jerusalem as a mother comforts her child, of Jerusalem comforting Israel as a mother comforts her child. The Psalmist sings a song praising God for His redemption of the faith community (Israel), in the latter portion of the psalm he sings of his individual thanksgiving.

For Paul the cross was the beginning of a "new creation", the kingdom of love. The old standards of the law, of society are gone. There is the new standard of love, of Christ crucified. Yet, we, dear Christian, are not immune from sin through the cross, rather by grace through faith, we are forgiven. All of us err on occasion; so Paul exhorts those in the faith community to restore the errant gently. This word "restore" is used in the sense of repair, of a surgeon removing a growth, a physician setting a broken bone. Paul tells that we should assist others in their burdens; yet, each of us must carry our own load. Consider that we are forgiven of our sin, yet even the cross did not cancel the consequence of our sin. We carry the scars of our wounds, even when Christ has healed them. We are responsible for our own actions. If we reap what we sow, then let us not become weary in doing good. Let us through love be a "little Christ" to others.

Jesus sends out seventy disciples to prepare the way for Jesus' visit. This is symbolic in that there were seventy elders who were chosen to assist Moses, there were seventy members of the Sanhedrin, the Jewish ruling council, and in the first century there were seventy known nations in the world. This seventy go carrying no purse, no bag, no sandals. Jesus instructs them to stay where they are invited and not to seek to better themselves. They are to heal the sick and declare that the Kingdom of God is near. When the seventy return, they are ecstatic! They tell Jesus, even the demons submitted to us. Jesus tells them that He had given them authority and power over the enemy; yet, that which should cause them pride is that their names are written in heaven. Jesus makes a cryptic statement, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. This could reflect that Jesus shares the joy of his messengers by telling them that Satan is already defeated and/or it can be a warning to these messengers against that pride which itself caused the downfall of Satan. We as Christians are called to prepare the way for Jesus' visit. May the Holy Spirit empower you to assist others in their faith while strengthening yours.



Regulus, the brightest star in Leo the Lion, is the 21st most luminous star yet pales in comparison to the brighter planets.

July 14 the Moon passes between the Earth and Sun, producing a new Moon. Two evenings later it will be a thin crescent low in the west, joining the two planets and star.

An hour after sunset, the assemblage is 10 degrees above the western horizon--the width of your fist held at arm's length. Indeed, all four objects will be so closely bunched that your fist can cover them all.

The next evening Venus, Saturn and Regulus will be in virtually the same place but the Moon will have moved to their upper left. By noting the Moon's position July 16 and then again July 17, you'll observe a "moonstride" -- the nightly movement of the Moon against the background stars.

A moonstride (13 degrees) is easily approximated by making a "hook 'em horns" sign. Held at arm's length, the distance between the tips of your index and little fingers is one moonstride. I know this is difficult for Aggies and other non-Longhorns, but under dark skies no one will see you.

## SKY CALENDAR

\* July 5 Thu .: Earth reaches aphelion, the farthest from the Sun in its annual elliptical orbit.

\* 6 & 7 Fri. & Sat. evenings: Venus is midway between Saturn (to the lower right) and Regulus (to the upper left).

\* 7 Sat.: The Moon is at 3rd quarter.

\* 9 Mon. morning: The crescent Moon is to the upper left of Mars in the east before dawn.

\* 10 Tue. morning: The crescent Moon is to the upper right of the Pleiades star cluster low in the east before dawn.

\* 11 Wed. morning: The crescent Moon, the Pleiades and the star Aldebaran form a triangle about the size of your fist held at arm's length low in the east before dawn.

\* 12 Thu. evening: Venus passes four moonwidths below Regulus.

\* 14 Sat.: The Moon is new.

\* 20 Fri. morning: Mercury is at its highest above the rising Sun, low in the east before dawn.

ASTRO MILESTONES: July 20 is the 38th anniversary of Apollo 11's 1969 moon landing, when Neal Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin became the first humans to walk on the Moon.



## PRMC first in area to implement hospitalist program

Pampa Regional Medical Center, in keeping with a tradition of providing area residents with cutting-edge health care, has in place a hospitalist program, made up of two physicians who specialize in caring only for patients during hospital stays. Dr. Nguyen completed a Bachelor of Science in biomedical engineering at Tulane University. He attended medical school and residency at Louisiana State University, New Orleans, Louisiana. Dr. Hall attended medical school at University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio, Texas and his internship and residency at the University of Texas Health Science Center in Houston, Texas. During a patient's hospital stay, the hospitalist will be in regular contact with the primary care physician to share information on their hospital stay. Hospitalists can be more available to the patients since they don't have office practices. However, patients also may feel free to speak with their primary care physician at any time during their hospital stay, and once they are discharged from Pampa Regional Medical Center, they return to the care of their physician. Dr. Robert Julian, a long-time family physician states, "The complexities and demands of care have increased both on the office and hospital side. It is becoming increasingly difficult to manage patients in both aspects of care, which explains why hospitalist physicians are in such high demand. We are pleased to partner with these physicians in an effort to provide our patients an even higher level of quality care.'
