Genlynx School Celebrates 2nd Anniversary

Two years ago on January 28, 1998, Spearman Independent School District opened Genlynx School. The purpose of this school was to ovide an educational environment that was different from the tradional classroom for certain students. This school provides an opportu-ity for those students to graduate from school or to receive their GED. Students are required to apply to enter the program. To qualify a stuent must meet one of the following criteria: be at least 17 years old: married; be one or more years behind in school; have a need for tra hours of employment; be a pregnant or parenting teen; be a chool dropout; or have some other situation in which there would be greater chance of school success away from the main campus.

The school, in partnership with NovaNET Learning, Inc., provides tudent instruction in state required courses such as English, Math. cience, and Social Studies, as well as a variety of electives. Each ourse is aligned with the Texas Essential Knowledge Skills. Through direct link to the NovaNET mainframe at the University of Illinois in hampaign-Urbana, these courses are offered on computer. Each stulent works at his own pace, completing one course at a time. Once al equirements for graduation are met, the student no longer comes to chool, but may return to participate in graduation.

Some students feel that passing the GED will meet their educational needs. Those students work on topics specifically designed to help hem prepare for the GED test.

The school has also held summer school for credit recovery. Credit cceleration has been implemented this year. This means that a student from the main campus, who needs just one credit to graduate, may ome to Genlynx at the end of the regular school day

Since Genlynx opened in 1998, 65 high school students have been erved. Sixteen students have completed requirements for graduation (including four already this year), and 12 have received their GED and left. Five of the graduates and two who passed the GED test were high school dropouts

The school occupies the upstairs of the County Library. The students attend one of two sessions per day. The morning session is from 7:30 1:30 a.m. and the afternoon session is from 12:30-4:30 p.m. upervision and off-line instruction are provided by Myrna Biggers Myrna stresses that this is NOT a discipline program; it is an alternative way of providing instruction. The implementation of this program as been a benefit not only to students but also to the school and the mmunity





Mother's father worked as a carpenter. On this particular day, he was building some crates for the clothes his church was sending to some orphanage in China. On his way home, he reached into his shirt pocket to find his glasses, but they were gone.

When he mentally replayed his earlier actions, he realized what hapvenes, the glasses had slipped out of his pocket unnoticed and fallen into one of the crates, which he had nailed shut. His brand new glasses were heading for china!

The Great Depression was at it's height and Grandpa had six children. He had spent \$20 for those glasses that very morning. He was upset by the thought of having to buy another pair.

"It's not fair," he told God as he drove home in frustration. "I've been very faithful in giving of my time and money to your work, and now this."

several months later, the director of the orphanage was on furlough in the United States. He wanted to visit all the churches that supported him in China, so he came to speak one sunday at my grandfather's small church in Chicago. The missionary began by thanking the people for their faithfulness in supporting the orphanage.

"But most of all," he said, "I must thank you for the glasses you sent last year. You see, the Communists had just swept through the orphanage, destroying everything, including my glasses. I was desperate. Even if I had the money, there was simply no way of replacing those glasses. Along with not being able to see well, I experienced headaches every day, so my coworkers and I were much in prayer about this. Then your crates arrived. When my staff removed the covers, they found a pair of glasses lying on top

The missionary paused long enough to let his words sink in. Then, still gripped with the wonder of it all, he continued: "Folks, when I tried on the glasses, it was as though they had been custom-made just for me! I want to thank you for being a part of that."

The people listened, happy for the miraculous glasses. But the missionary surely must have confused their church with another, they thought. There were no glasses on their list of items to be sent overseas.

But sitting quietly in the back, with tears streaming down his face, an ordinary carpenter realized the Master Carpenter had used him in an extraordinary way.

This year is the beginning of my tenth year here at the Hansford County Library, and I am not at all sure where the time has gone. There have been many changes during that time not only to our library, but to libraries in general. While our library was automated back in 1987, computers were only used for circulation and on-line catalog searching when I started working here. We now have two public access computers with two more to be added shortly giving us much better Internet access. In 1990, Hansford County Library had only one full-time employee and a part-time worker who was asked to fill in when I had to be out of the library for any reason. We now have three people on staff which has enabled us to start staying open during the noon hour rather than closing as we had in the past. We have added a video collection and expanded our selection of audio books, books in Spanish and books on the Accelerated Reading lists at the elementary and junior high schools. I'm not too sure where the next ten years may take our library, but we will do our best to continue to provide the best possible service to this communi-

I wanted to remind everyone about our memorial program here at the library. We count on these funds to help augment our book budget each year. Proceeds were down by over 60% in this area during 1999 so I thought it might be a good idea to mention this program once again. If you want to remem-ber a friend or relative who has passed away, this is a wonderful way to do so. We put a bookplate in the front of each memorial book showing who it was given in memory of and who gave it. This is a lasting tribute to those you want to remember, and it provides the library with a larger collection to serve the community. We handle memorials in many different ways. If you want a certain book or a book on a certain subject, we will try our best to find an appropriate selection. If you don't have a preference, we will add to the collec-

tion in the area where the library may need additional or updated information. We will do our best to work with you on these memorials in any way possible. Jim 's Report: There was one camper and a group of Boy Scouts on the north side of the dam this weekend. There were very few visitors, and the fishing was not good.

The actual location of Charley Newell's adobe three room stockade has not been pinpointed. My idea that the water at the Turkey Track house south of Gruver was gyppy or strong of alkali has not proved out, although I still maintain it tasted bad to me. Sunday I was able to talk to Maudina May Fields of Tucson, Arizona. She had lived there from 1 929 to 1 936 when the Tom May family moved to Lubbock. Her memory of the

water was that it was good but very hard.

Loyall Turner, field man with the North Plains Water District, told me all the water in the county is alkaline. Most of us are familiar with the mineral deposits from it in a teakettle or pan that water is heated in or if drops are left when you wash a car. The Ogalala is invariably good, but some of the perch aquifer water has a different taste. This water was left in little reservoirs and will taste different but not necessarily bad. It usually is pumped out by a windmill after some years

Joel Lackey told me of a well his Aunt Vera Wroten had drilled over by McKibben that the water was so alkaline that it made a sieve out of a new galvanized tank after a

few years. It was bad tasting, but improved a little after it pumped a few years. Then it was pumped dry.


Other clues we have for the location are 1. In 1881 it was called the Hanna Ranch. 2. In 1 884 Jim Cator called it the 777 Hanna Ranch. 3. It was north of Bob and Jim Cator's ranch. 4. There was a hackberry grove between them. 5. It was 25 miles from Adobe Walls. 6. It was 30 miles from the Rifle Pits.

Some adobe and sod houses of great age in the county are still around, but they have all been stuccoed or protected in some manner. Generally adobe houses are built on a rock foundation, but here we don't know if this was the case. The Indiana trio (Clark, Shideler, and Sam Hanna) and Fanny Owens told of the dirt floors. Gunny sacks were popular for carpet.

Any help at finding this location would be appreciated.

Ushers were the groom's cousins, Will Winborne of Borger and Kirk Stokes of Amarillo.


