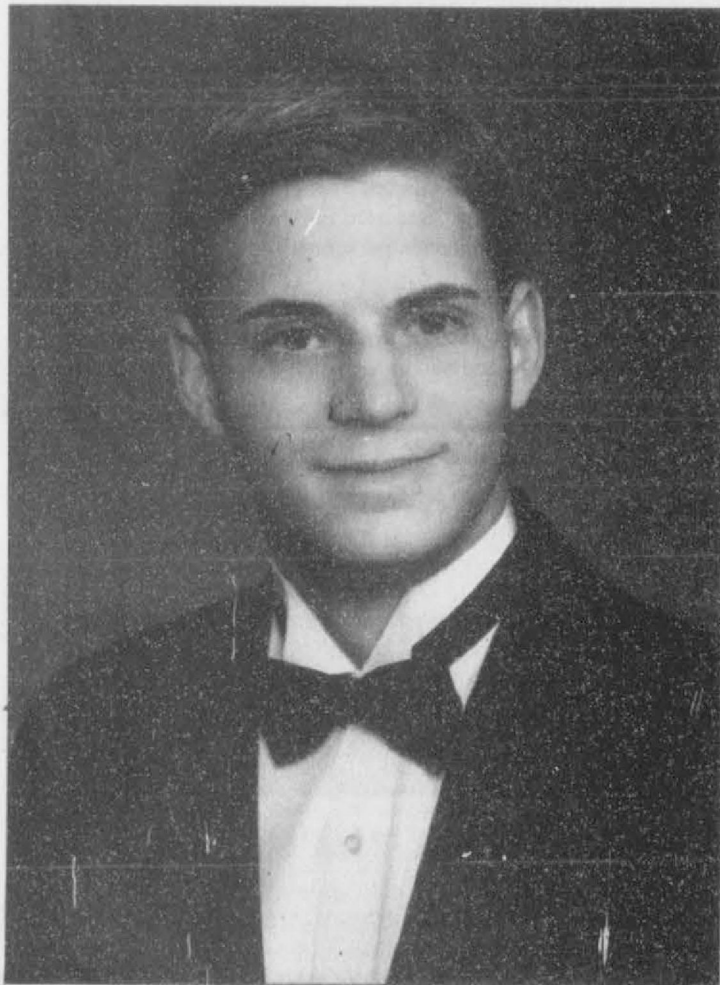

### Beedy Earns Bronze

For the third year in a row, Kristin Beedy competed in the Class 2A Girls Singles State Tennis Tournament in Austin.

Beedy had straight-sets in her quarterfinal victory over Rachel DeLaughter of East Bernard, 6-1, 6-1. But Beedy was eliminated by Whitney Nebgen of Mason in split sets, 4-6, 6-1, 6-3, in the afternoon's semifinals.

Nebgen went on to win the State Championship. Kristin received the bronze medal.

For the last three years Kristin battled Region I rival Makenzie McCravy, a senior from Eldorado. As a freshman, Beedy defeated McCravy for the State Championship. Last year, however, McCravy came back to claim the gold.

This year Beedy defeated McCravy in the Regional tournament. Both advanced to state, but McCravy was eliminated in the quarterfinals.

Kristin is a junior at Spearman High School. She is the daughter of Scott and Becky Beedy, and the granddaughter of Dodie and Brad Beedy, all of Spearman.

It was a gold medal performance and a leap into legend when Buster McLain topped the 15'3" mark in state pole vaulting competition this weekend.

"It feels like a roller coaster ride as you go up and over the bar, and then you kind of lose your stomach on the way down." This is how McLain describes the feeling of mastering the vault. No doubt, his next feeling was one of exhilaration.

The winning vault which outdistanced his nearest competitor, New Summerfield's Charlie Caskey whose best effort was 14' 9", gave Gruver's its first ever state gold medal in boy's individual competition. Two other golds have been won by Gruver athletes, Melanie Morris in girls high jump in 1985, and the 1600 relay team of

Steve Duncan, Steven Fry, Loyd Cator, and Mark Gilbreath in 1986.

According to Coach Frick and Coach Duncan, McLain's destiny came quickly as McLain and Caskey soon established themselves as leaders in the competition. McLain says his first indication of his dominance came when Caskey missed twice at 14 feet. From this point on, McLain's became the sole leader and the vaulter in command.

For McLain, the road to gold began in seventh grade when he was able to make opening height in his first time to pole vault. The seventh grader had an immediate love for the sport and became more serious in his pursuit for excellence in his freshman year in high school.

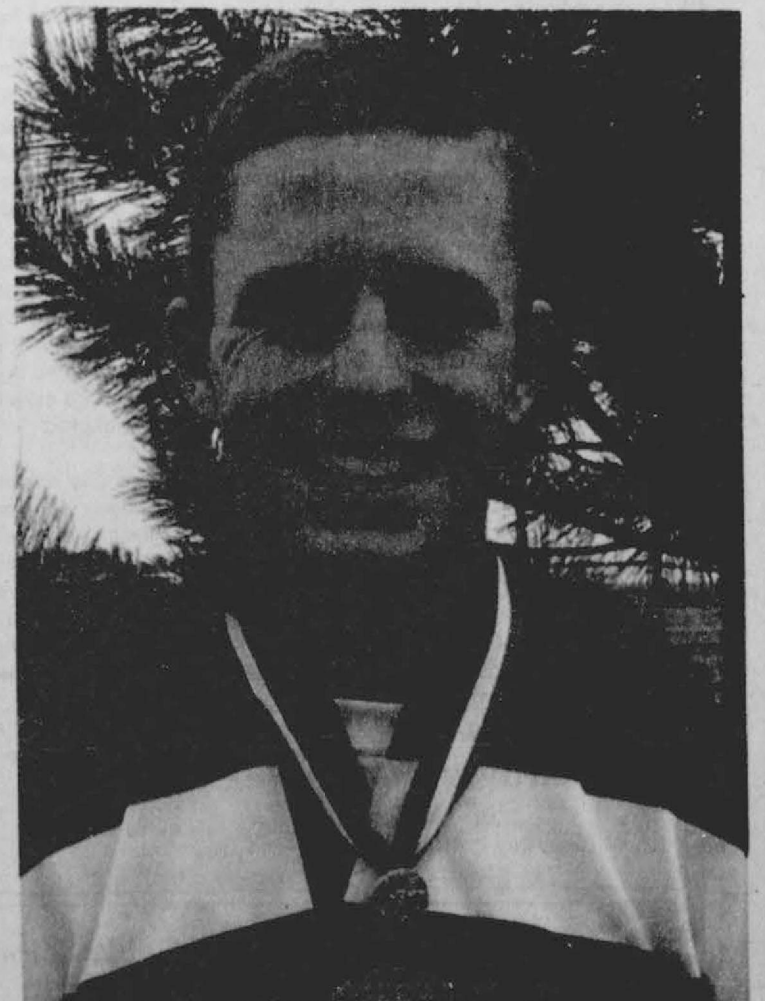
To improve his vaulting ability, McLain has spent many additional

hours in practice on his own and has devoted some of his summer time to the pursuit. As McLain states, "It takes a lot of hard work and extra practice time after workouts are over."

Due to a stellar year for the Gruver boys basketball team that extended far beyond the regular season, McLain was several weeks late in beginning pole vault competition this spring. This, however, did not hinder the senior's performance. "It just all came back after a week or so of practice," McLain comments.

McLain's gold-winning vault surpassed his silver performance in last year's state track meet of 14 feet by 15 inches. McLain credits his maturity and the fact that he was stronger and faster this season for his improvement.

Although McLain will be graduating Gruver High School in only a few days, his pole vaulting days are not over as he will be competing for Southwest Texas State University, a division I school, in San Marcos next year. And for Gruver, McLain's pole vaulting days will also live in legend for years to come.

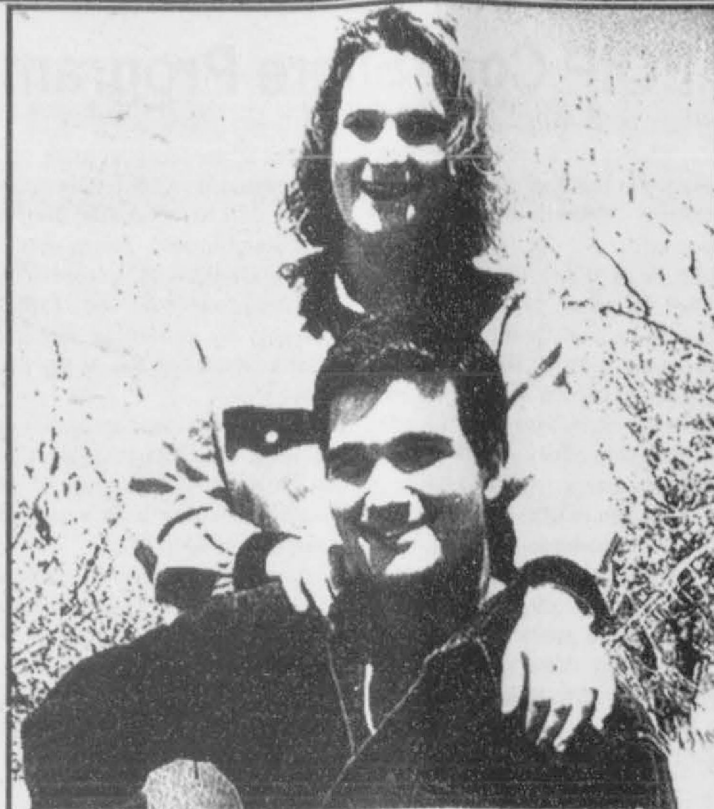

## EQIP Cost-Share Program

There is a new cost-share program that can give Hansford County farmers a ranchers a powerful tool for protecting and improving their natural resources. The program is called the Environmental Quality Incentives Program or EQIP. EQIP provides choices to farmers and ranchers who wish to enter into 5 to 10 year contracts to solve their natural resource concerns. This year over \$13 million has been allocated for financial assistance.

Applications will be accepted from May 4 through May 29, 1998. These applications will be ranked and those offers, which provide the greatest environmental

benefits at the least program cost, will be funded. Additional ranking periods will be conducted until all funds are obligated. The evaluation of applications is competitive. Applications will be ranked favorably by providing the most environmental benefits at the least cost.

Federal cost-share assistance for structural and vegetative practices can be up to 75 percent of the installation costs, with a contract maximum of \$50,000.
