

## Mike Schnell Named TBA Chairman



Spearman banker Mike Schnell was named chairman of the Texas Bankers Association last week at the association's annual meeting held in Austin

Mike Schnell, president and CEO of First State Bank, Spearman, was named chairman of the Texas Bankers Association during its 119th Annual Convention in Austin last week. Schnell will serve on TBA's Board of Directors and Executive Committee.

Schnell began his banking career in 1975 as a credit analyst at Texas Bank and Trust in Dallas. In 1978, he moved to Citizens Bank in Richardson to organize a credit department. In 1979, Schnell returned home to Spearman to join First State Bank as a loan officer. He was elected president and CEO in 1995.

First State Bank was founded in 1917 as the Guaranty State Bank in Hansford. In 1919, the town and the bank were moved to Spearman, where the railroad would soon be located. Schnell is a third-generation banker. His grandfather, C.A. Gibner, began his banking career at the Guarantee State Bank, working his way up from cleaning spittoons in 1919 to becoming president in 1952. Schnell's mother, Verna Lee Shirley, began her banking career at FSB in 1959 and retired in 1997. His father, Bob Schnell, who is now deceased, was also a banker. His banking career in the Panhandle spanned more than 30 years.

Schnell is active in his community. He is a Little League coach and has served on the City of Spearman Airport Board and Spearman Economic Development Corp. He is a past president of the Spearman Rotary Club, North Panhandle Bankers Association and Hansford County Shrine Club. Serving Texas bankers since 1885, TBA is the largest and oldest state bankers association in the country and can be found on the web at www.texasbankers.com.


# County Homeowners, **Renters**, Businesses **Eligible For Disaster Relief**

The US Small Business Administration (SBA) has extended the filing deadline for businesses to apply for low-interest disaster loans located in the states of Oklahoma, Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, and Texas. SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loans are available for businesses dependent on farmers and ranchers sustaining crop losses due to excessive heat and drought that occurred on June 1, 2001, and continuing

It is common for many states to request via the Secretary of Agriculture (USDA) and have disasters declared separately for each individual crop year with "and continuing' designations, which ultimately results in filing deadlines within a few months after the incident period. However, with some of these declarations, the economic injury period of the agriculture dependent business does not always end before the filing deadline, due to varying business cycles and/or the time in which the disaster was declared. This situation is most notable with drought declarations beginning with the 2001 crop year. In an effort to allow equitable treatment of all agriculture dependent businesses regardless of when the 2001 crop year was declared, SBA will allow all businesses applying for assistance under a "2001 and continuing" drought declaration an extended application deadline.

This loan program will cover the impact of 2001, 2002, and 2003 crop losses as a result of the continuing drought experienced by non-farm, businesses in the affected areas. This special 60 days extension will be effective from April 7 - June 6, 2003 and will include all "2001 and continuing" Secretary of Agriculture declarations with filing deadlines in 2002 and 2003. Farmers and ranchers are not eligible for these SBA loans. However, nurseries that are victims of drought disasters can apply. Businesses in the following Texas counties are eligible to apply: Childress, Clay, Collingsworth, Cooke, Dallam, Fannin, Gray, Hansford, Hardeman, Hemphill, Lamar, Lipscomb, Montague, Ochiltree, Sherman, Wheeler, Wichita and Wilbarger.

# Words Women Use

Memorial Weekend is coming up, but Jim said he did not have many reservations yet. It is usually a big one at the Lake.


The cliff swallows that build such beautiful little adobe apartments may be seen at both the bridge and the intake tower. It seems odd to be keeping up with three kinds of swallows this

**The Fast and Furious** Gruver Reports Storm Damage, Spearman Suffers Electrical Outage

#### by Harletta Carthel

A quick-moving thunderstorm in which several funnels were spotted hammered the western edge of Gruver Thursday evening, May 15, and left Spearman without electrical power overnight.

The storm which hit Hansford County was part of a large storm system which plagued the upper Panhandle in the late afternoon and evening Thursday.

Gruver's emergency warning system was sounded at approximately 8:25 p.m. Thursday when a tornado was reported six miles south of Gruver. While no damage was reported from the funnel, a second funnel was spotted by Jake McCullough of the Gruver Fire Department weather watchers, approximately 30 minutes later at his location, three miles north and three miles west of Gruver.

"I didn't see the funnel touch the ground, but it was going up and down," McCullough said.

• While it cannot be determined if the second funnel sighting or strong winds associated with the storm did damage north and west of the Gruver city limits, the results of the storm were costly.

Hardest hit was a mobile home owned by Florenteno Melendez. Only the north wall of the home was left standing with the floor remaining on the rest of the home. Melendez, his wife, and pre kindergarten daughter who were in Colorado returned to salvage their belongings on Friday.

The Melendez family had only recently purchased the home and had no insurance on it or their belongings.

A mobile home only yards east of the Melendez home and a brick home on the west received only minor damage.

Several irrigation sprinklers were partially or completely

turned over by the storm. Those known to have sustained damage were on land farmed by Les Barkley, Rick Barkley, Pat Patterson, and Kevin Holt.

A large Blue Spruce planted in 1967 near the home of Violet Lee who lives north of Highway 15 was also uprooted in the storm.

Les reported that her locked front door was blown open in the storm although the storm door sheltering it did not open.

A similar incident was reported by Jim Traylor, who also lives north of Highway 15. Traylor's front door was blown inward into his home.

Spearman lost electrical power between 9:30 and 10:00 p.m. Thursday when three transmission poles were damaged. One of the poles was located west of Spearman and two of the poles were west of Waka.

Line crews from Borger and Perryton worked through the night to restore power by 6:45 a.m. Friday, according to Craig Vinson of Xcel Energy.

Gruver received an official 1.70 inch of rain while Spearman reported .65.

A record 26 tornadoes were reported in the Panhandle Thursday, May 8. Since the count only included funnels which were spotted on the ground, the Gruver twisters were not included in the count.
