On Friday morning, Sheriff R.L. McFarlin and deputies Scott Davis and Pete Ochoa apprehended and detained a 16 -yearold juvenile, who was suspected of making the phone call. cerated at the Canadian iuveni cerated al Center
detention Cen
According to sheriff McFarlin speculation and gossip concerning the situation has led to the Spearman community receiving a great deal of disinformation. By 2:00 a.m., the Sheriff felt that the need to cancel school was not necessary. "Had we not quickly apprehended the suspect and determined that there was no immediate danger, it would have and do an extensive search school," commented Sheriff McFarlin.
"We didn't want a wholesale panic as a result of this situation. Had there been an indication that this was a serious threat, we would have called in help, but there was nothing there to indicate the need for these kind of
measures." The suspect's residence wa vehicle and computer. No evi-
dence of any weapons or explosive materials was discovered There was no evidence of plans or making explosives or any There was absolutely no indies. ion that this juvenile had the capability or intention of carrying through with this threat. Said McFarlin, "Whether he had the capability or the intenion or not, we are taking this illl bent very seriously. And it he be treated as such through chool courts and the school system."
Sheriff McF Sheriff McFarlin also stated that the parents of this juvenile erned and in disbelief that he made the call They also stated hat they realized that some meaures had to be taken and that he had to be punished.
According to the school system and the sheriff, this juvenile does or have a history of behavior problems.
he evegation unveiled that on jue evening of the incident, the uvenile had discussed with other people the idea that if a call was
made to the school, then school would probably be canceled and students would have a day of vacation.
"This prank was flat stupidity. but it still has to be punished. It is not something to joke about," "ommented Sheriff McFarlin. "We have the greatest bunch of kids on the whole that you can ind anywhere, and the majority
