Texas Department of Agriculture Joins with Local Entities To Promote Tourism

Agriculture Commissioner Susan Combs announced that the Texas Department of Agriculture is cohosting a tourism workshop at 6:00 p.m., Tuesday, September 18 at the O'Loughlin Center, 502 Brandt, in Spearman in partnership with the Spearman Chamber of Commerce and the Spearman Economic Development Corporation.

The open forum will provide farmers, ranchers, agribusinesses, small businesses and the community a chance to learn about the economic impact that tourism can bring to rural communities, such as

Spearman and surrounding towns. The workshop will show how everyone can work together to attract tourists to the area and encourage them to stay longer thus increasing the economic impact of tourism. Attendees will also find out how they can benefit from and make the upcoming International Windmill Trade Fair that will be held in Spearman next year, a successful endeavor.

Applicants Denied 1998 Crop Loss Disaster Assistance May Now Be Eligible Request," written on the fax cover Producers who previously did as well.

not qualify for benefits under the 1998 Crop Loss Disaster Assistance Program (CLDAP) may now be eligible, according to Steven Orr, Hansford County Executive Director. Eligibility for CLDAP benefits under the multiyear option required crop losses by producer identification number in at least three of five years from 1994 through 1998.

The revised legislation gives individuals previously ineligible for multi-year program payments the opportunity to submit their application and potentially receive CLDAP benefits," said Orr.

The deadline for applicants to submit a completed CCC-540MY, Crop Loss Disaster Assistance Program Application form for multi-year benefits is September 14, 2001. No applications for benefits will be accepted after this date. Completed forms should be submitted to: USDA/Farm Service Agency, Room 3643-S, STOP 0517, 1400 Independence Avenue, SW Washington, DC 20250-0517. Envelopes with applications enclosed should have "Multi-year Revised Eligibility Determination Request" legibly and boldly marked on the front. As the program deadline nears, applications can be faxed to (202) 720-4941 and must have "Multi-year Revised Eligibility Determination

Applications will be accepted from individual producers only. Joint operations or entities are not eligible. The revised eligibility requirements provide that producers that otherwise would have qualified for the 1998 CLDAP multi-year benefit in the absence of restructuring of their farming operation, or may have operated under multiple entities in the years 1994 through 1998, may qualify for program benefits. As the program deadline nears, applications can be faxed to (202) 720-4941 and must have "Multi-year Revised Eligibility Determination

Eligible producers include those that either previously filed an application and did not meet eligibility requirements; or producers who received a payment for single-year losses, but did not initialqualify for multi-year benefits. Additionally, producers who restructured their business or changed their farming operations from an individual to an entity, changed identification (ID) numbers, or had crop losses, but operated under different ID numbers in the years 1994 through 1998, and did not meet the minimum crop loss history requirement necessary to receive a multi-year benefit

might qualify for CLDAP benefits

According to Orr, "Recalculation of payments to producers who received multi-year payments under the prior CLDAP allocation is not an option under these new program provisions."

Applicants will be required to provide proof of crop insurance indemnities received for each farming operation identified in the qualification process. The applicant must also provide evidence of ad hoc disaster payments and Noninsured Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) benefits received during the 1994 through 1998 time frame. Payments issued under the 1998 CLDAP are not to exceed \$80,000 per "person" and are subject to a national payment factor of

"FSA recommends that any producer who suspects that he or she might qualify for CLDAP program benefits contact the office immediately to confirm their eligibility, considering the window of opportunity for application is very short," said Orr.



Superintendent's Corner

How many of you have actually heard of the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) of 1974? It is also known as the Buckley Amendment and was designed to protect the privacy of a student's educational records. This law applies to all public schools receiving federal funds.

Basically all educational records are private and can not be released without the parent's permission and or the student after they have reached their 18th birthday. There are some exceptions like access to those educational records that are maintained and used by school personnel in the scope of their obs. These records can be viewed by school personnel with the need to know but are also considered to be private and can not be released to the public. In addition, schools may disclose "directory" type information to anyone requesting that information and who has followed proper procedures to request that information unless it has been restricted by the parent or

If you have a child in school, every year when handbooks are issued parents are provided the opportunity to restrict directory information that can be released to the public. But what is considered directory information? Directory information includes basic information about a student that is often found in a school yearbook or athletic publications such as the picture of the student, and height and weight of athletes. But directory information also includes other information such as student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, photography, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, grade level, enrollment status, honors and awards received in school, most recent previous school attended, and school e-mail address. Directory information does not include a student's grades, social security number and his or her class rankings.

The concern that many have is they don't want their child's

the selling of personal information to for profit businesses who include this type of information in a data base. For the record we do not sell information about our students and staff to anyone! These are legitimate concerns; however, I can tell you that very seldom do we receive a request for this type of student records. The requests most often come from local or area newspapers wanting honors and awards received by district students. Other requests may come after hours from a desperate parent wanting the phone number of a fellow classmate of their child in order to find them; not a call from a pedophile or pervert wanting personal information about a child in order to prey on them. The district is unable to pick and choose which party to release this information to and must rely on the parent's wishes on what information that they want to be released or restricted.

Generally, when a request for directory type information is received the district must first decide whether or not the informais confidential Remember it is the school district's direct responsibility to protect the privacy of student records! All educational records besides directory information are confidential can not be released. Procedures are in place for someone requesting directory or public information. They must first submit a written request including enough description and detail about the information requested to enable the district to accurately identify and locate the items requested. The district has ten working days to produce the requested information and can charge an established cost for any written documents. If the district has reason to question the request, they can seek the Texas Attorney General's opinion on whether or not there is a compelling reason not to release the information as requested. As you can see it is not as easy as you might think to walk in off the street and get directory information about a student. However, it may not be uncommon for a local business to want the names and mailing addresses for address and phone number all graduating seniors in order to

released to anyone off the street or send them a mail out. Unless this information is restricted, we will release the information if the requester has followed the proper procedures.

Another concern that parents have now days is information that might be put on the district's web page such as pictures and other identifiable information. With worldwide access to the Internet this also becomes a legitimate concern. I hope I can eliminate some of your concerns by saying that we are not putting on the web a data base of all our students which includes directory information (grade level, addresses, and phone numbers). We are not nor will we ever do this! But what we do is put information about our school on our web page. Often times it may include pictures of students and their accomplishments. In other words general information about our schools in order to inform the public of the good things that are going on in our schools. This type of information would also be considered directory and be included in our web pages unless restricted by a parent or guardian.

Every year via our school handbooks our parents are given the right to restrict directory information about their own child. This is not a new law nor the school district's procedures but a requirement if we receive federal funds. To comply with this law, on the 'Acknowledgement Form" that the parents and student signs and are

required to return to school to be kept on file, the parents are given the right to cross out those directory items that they want to be restricted. We are trying to be a little more parent friendly and instead of making it the parent's responsibly to notify the school in writing of the directory information that they want to restrict, as has been the case in the past, this year we have provided parents with a list that all they have to do is cross out what information they want restricted. All this sounds simple but when it comes to a parent's concern about their child there are often many questions.

By all means I am not an expert on this subject; however, what I am asked to do is to comply and implement FERPA as it relates to the privacy of student's educational records. I would ask that anyone having a question about this subject or about student records to please contact my office (659-3233). When it comes to student records the general rule of thumb is to handle them with extreme caution and approach each on a case-by-case basis. I hope this week's article has further explained what is considered directory information and the rights of a parent and/or guardian when it comes to educational records and other information that can be released to the public.


were 13 or 14 each night. In addition at various places around the Lake, there were tent campers and RVs that did not choose to use the
