Spearman 5-Year Gas Contract Saved Almost \$1 Million

Thanks to fortunate timing and foresight from the City Council of Spearman, city residents enjoyed gas prices much lower than market price since June of 1998, but unfortunately that excellent deal has ended.

West Texas Gas and the City Council worked together to procure a five-year contract at \$2.88 per MCF, which started in June of 1998 and ended the end of May 2003. This contract saved \$962,087.55 during its term compared to index pricing. (The city adds an additional \$1.15 per MCF for delivery, metering, personnel, dispatch and other gas related services.)

Current gas market prices are over \$6.00 per MCF on the NYMEX and, with transportation and the cities charges, pricing starting June 1st were over \$7.50 per MCF. At the expiration of the five-year contract, the City Council agreed to purchase gas from West Texas Gas at market price plus transportation, with the option to lock-in prices if the markets come down.

Current analyst projections show that natural gas could dip in the \$5.00 range later in the summer, at which time the city will probably lock in prices before winter price surges are expected. People budgeting their annual natural gas heating expense can expect to pay roughly double the cost for their heating needs this year.

"The city realizes this is going to be a shock to many budgets," stated Spearman City Manager Robert Patrick, "so we want to warn people early of this probable increase before it happens."

Most residents do not use large amounts of natural gas in the summer. The cities total sales for June through September only amount to 8% of the yearly sales. The cost of gas during these months does not impact budgets as much as when cold weather arrives.

Vicki Gibbs thinks a minute before explaining why she decided to take a leap of faith and record a compact disc of Christian music last summer.

"You know, it's something I thought about for many years, then a few years ago decided that if I was going to do it . . . Most recently it was something I prayed about.

"Honestly, it was something I had thought about for a long time. It always had been something I wanted to do 'someday.' Last summer I decided that if I was going to do it, now was the time.

"Then when it all came together, I knew it was the right time."

Mrs. Gibbs, who is assistant choral director at Plainview High School, visited a recording studio in Lubbock her husband, Russ, had done business with and was pleased with the quality of their work.

Still, it was an important decision knowing that she would be paying for all phases of the production.

"More people are doing this," she says, "producing their own recording. Today the cost is so much more reasonable than it was maybe 10 years ago and the quality is so much better for the cost."

Mrs. Gibbs adds that a lot of her production time involved taking care of the paperwork required for each song.

"It was important to me that everything was done the right way . . . paying for the copyright and leasing background orchestration on some of the songs. I did all of that myself."

Mrs. Gibbs grew up in Dumas and received a bachelor's degree in vocal performance from West Texas State University (WTA&M). She moved to Plainview five years ago when her husband went to work at Wayland Baptist University as vice president for development. The Gibbises have one son, Ryan, who is a junior business major at Baylor University.

Mrs. Gibbs grew up in a musically supportive family, explaining that she took piano lessons and sang in the church choir. Both her husband and son play the drums.

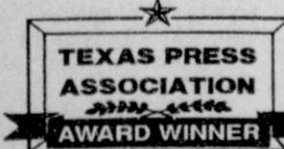

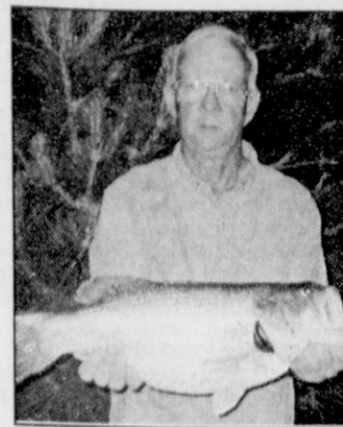
Lake Level--June 2, 2003--28.76 feet
