Important Election Dates

May 12th Limited Election

The May 12th limited uniform election date will be held as usual. (This election is for cities and schools only). The last day to file for a place on the ballot was Monday, March 5th.

The City of Spearman has two Alderman positions up for reelection - Jon Garnett and Charles Elliott, as well as the Mayor. As of Monday, March 5, 2012, the following have filed: Mayor Brian Gillispie has filed for re-election. Alderman Jon Garnett has filed for re-election. Also filing for Alderman are Armando Martinez and Bryce Williams. Alderman Charles Elliott did not file.

Spearman ISD will not hold an election this year. They have two terms expiring -Maria Sibley and Glen Ray Mackie. Both incumbents were the only two people to

Weekly Update

Texas, May 7- Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 5.7 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.63/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has fallen 2.9 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.77/g, according to gasoline price website Texas-GasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were 20.2 cents per gallon lower than the same day one year ago and are 19.8 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 13.4 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 15.9 cents per gallon

lower than this day one year ago.

"I'd probably sound like a broken record at this point if I were to tell folks that crude prices breached and fell under \$100 late last week. I'm sure I'll be flooded with motorists asking why gaso-line prices haven't fallen yet," chuckled GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Either way, it's great news for motorists- but some hot spots may burn motorists before they see any sizable relief. When I mention hot spots. I'm thinking of the West Coast- where supply has dropped considerably, causing tightness and perhaps higher prices. The rest of the country, however, should see short term relief continue ahead of Memorial Day, easing unfounded fears of the national average hitting \$5/gal, or even \$4/gal," DeHaan said.

Texas Crop & Weather

The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors for May 8, 2012: Most of the region remained dry with aboveaverage temperatures. Rangeland and pastures began to dry out at a rapid rate due to hot and dry conditions. A few areas reported receiving some moisture. Parts of Collingsworth County received from 0.6 inch to 4 inches of rain. Flooding and erosion occurred in many fields where there were heavy downpours. Farmers continued planting corn and cotton. Wheat was in very poor to excellent condition, with most areas reporting poor to fair. Rangeland and pastures were in very poor to good condition, with most reporting poor. Cattle were reported in good condition.

Rib Cook-Off Rules

1. Meat prepared for judging must be pork ribs. The ribs must be pork-spare ribs.

2. No other cuts allowed.

3. Meat must be cooked on location over a fire of wood, charcoal, but no gas is allowed. Cookers may not dig pits. Smoker type barbecues are allowed. Par boiling, electric ovens or solar

ovens are not permitted. Electricity is will be provided on a first come first serve basis, and generators are allowed.

4. Pre-marinated ribs are NOT allowed. All ingredients used in preparing, seasoning, marinating, basting, or saucing ribs for the competition must be brought to the Cook-Off, and in your cooking area on display. But you may pre make your marinade or rub but it cannot be applied until cook-off begins.

5. The cooking period will be approximately 6 hours and will start at the end of the of the Cook's Meeting, held at 9:30 a.m. the cooking period will end at promptly at 4p.m., unless other otherwise stated. Delivering ribs to the judging area after the cooking period has concluded can be cause for disqualification, as well as late arrival to the Cook-Off.

6. Contestants will only be supplied a cooking area on a first come first serve basis. Contestants will be responsible for supplying ALL of their own supplies: utensils, ingredients, equip-

7. Contestants will be allowed to set up equipment from their oad-in time until 10 a.m. All vehicles must be removed from the cook off area prior to 10 a.m.

8. Each contestant must submit a 5 individually cut apart ribs for judging. Cookers can pass out "samples" to the general public after judging is completed, but cannot sell their ribs.

9. Ribs submitted for judging must be submitted on the platter provided at the Cooks' Meeting. Platters must contain only ribs. No garnish.

10. Sanitary conditions must be maintained at all times.

11. Ribs must be at 40 degrees upon arrival and must be at 140 degrees for serving.

12. All teams must have water or a fire extinguisher on site in case of fire. Fire must be completely out before leaving the designated area after cook off is over.

Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

SPECIAL DEADLINES:

For change of use (the Appraisal District informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change did not result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the Appraisal District or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before the taxes become delinquent (usually February 1). The ARB decides if it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.

*The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.

REVIEW BY THE DISTRICT COURT OR AN ARBITRATOR: After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you are not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. As an alternative and within the same time period, you may file a request for binding arbitration with the county appraisal district in certain cases.

TAX PAYMENT: You must pay either the amount of taxes due on the portion of the taxable value not in dispute or the amount of taxes due on the property under the order from which the appeal is taken.

MORE INFORMATION: You can get more information by contacting the Hansford County Appraisal District at (806) 659-5575 or 709 W 7th Ave, Spearman, TX 79081-3407. You can also get a pamphlet describing how to prepare a protest from the Appraisal District or from the State Comptroller's Property Tax Division, PO Box 13528, Austin, TX 78711-3528.

DEADLINE FOR FILING A PROTEST WITH THE APPRAISAL REVIEW BOARD*

USUAL DEADLINE:

Thirty (30) days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you.

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.

Late protests are due the day before the Appraisal Review Board approves the records for the year. Contact your Appraisal District for more information.

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the appraisal district to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You will receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening. Prior to your hearing, you may ask to review the evidence the appraisal district will use to uphold their determination. The appraisal district may ask you for a copy of the evidence you plan to present. The hearing will be informal. You or a designated agent may appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The appraisal district representative will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the appraisal district representative. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. The appraisal district has the burden of establishing the property's value by a preponderance of the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the Appraisal District office at 709 W 7th Ave Spearman, Texas 79081.

NOTE: You should not try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires the ARB members to sign an affidavit saying they have not talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures If you have a concern about:

- the market or appraised value of your Property
- the unequal appraisal of your property
- the inclusion of your property on the appraisal roll
- any exemptions that may apply to you the qualification for an agricultural or timber appraisal
- the taxable status of your property
- the local governments which should be taxing your property
- the ownership of property the change of use of land receiving special appraisal

any action taken by the chief appraiser, appraisal district or appraisal review board that adversely affects you

INFORMAL REVIEW: If you wish to have an informal review of your property with our staff, please come to our office in Spearman M-F. 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. except holidays.

REVIEW BY THE APPRAISAL REVIEW BOARD: If you cannot resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB),




