Small Businesses Have **Only Days Left To Apply** For Disaster Loans

SERVING HANSFORD COUNTY SINCE 1907

Businesses in some Oklahoma, Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, and Texas counties have until July 2, 2001 to file applications for low-interest disaster loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). The SBA's Economic Injury Disaster oans are available for businesses dependent on farmers and ranchers sustaining crop losses due to excessive heat and drought that occurred on July 1, 2000, and continuing. Farmers and ranchers are not eligible for these SBA loans. However, nurseries that are victims of drough disasters can apply. Businesses in Hansford county are eligible to apply.

If you now receive your mail on a rural route in Hansford County,





The fishing was good enough to keep it interesting for the regulars. The First Baptist Church of Gruver

had the shelter on Monday evening. The Morse Lions Club had it Saturday evening and the Spearman Methodist Church had it Sunday.

Saturday evening found 14 RVs on the North side and 8 on the office side. The Panhandle RV Club had five of the campers on the north side.

Saturday evening The Southern Monarchs, a motorcycle club, returned to the Dedication Park to set up their tents. They also have one RV that travels with them. Jim said there were 15 to 20 motorcycles. One man remarked that he was from Tulsa and another said he was from Oklahoma City. They like our Park. The Panhandle Bird Club had a

small group birding both sides of the Lake on Saturday of the Memorial Day Weekend. They felt that the big crowd of people had many of the birds in hiding. Some of the rarer birds they saw were Pectoral Sandpipers at the waters edge near the dam.

Rosemary Scott wrote in her column (Gardening for Birds) in the club newsletter about all the many beautiful wildflowers taking her mind off the birds. "We found del-

phiniums, penstemons, primroses, asclepias, gaura, yellow and blue flaxes, blue-eyed grass and many others. The best treat of all was in the picnic area where the ground was covered with beautiful red winecups, the biggest concentration I've ever seen.

Curiosity made me look up asclepias. They are milkweeds--antelope horns, white-flowered milkweed. and butterfly weed (orange milkweed). The gaura turned out to be a very fragrant little flower that I know as wild honeysuckle. It starts out with a white flower that turns pink later. I had thought there were pink ones and white ones!

Pat Dawson, who lives at the south edge of Gruver, had one of those unforgettable moments when she looked up from a cup of tea she was drinking and saw a deer at the edge of her yard. Spearman has had a deer visit, but this may be a first for Gruver.

Jim told me of seeing three bucks



with noticeable horns in the velver. Below the house he has seen two does with fawns. The whitetail deer have much redder coats at this stage than the mule deer.

Marguerite Nelson of Gruver spotted a prairie dog on her driveway last week. June seems to be a good time for these rodents to travel and hunt new territory.



The family suggests memorials be to Hansford Hospice, 707 S. Roland, Spearman, Tx, 79081.



Lubbock. Ring bearer was Hadley Martin, nephew of the groom, of Quitman, AR.


