## Some Pockets of Dryland **Crops Survive** the Drought

Though most dryland crops have failed due to the drought, there were scattered pockets of production, according to a Texas AgriLife Extension Service ex-

"There will be some dryland crops harvested in Texas," said Dr. Travis Miller, AgriLife Extension program leader and associate department head of the Texas A&M University soil and crop sciences department, College Station. "The best areas are going to be from Corpus (Christi) north to Victoria and along the coast a little ways; and then from Hill County north and east.'

Miller predicted cotton yields in the area from Corpus Christi to Victoria will be in the 350- to 400-pound-per-acre range. Sorghum yields were reported as being in the 3,000- to 3,700-pound range, while corn yields were about 35- to 40bushels per acre.

But the situation varied widely not just from one region to another, but county to

county, he said. "If you get a little farther north, say to Matagorda County, they just missed those rains, and there's some 25- to 30bushel corn," Miller said. "Then Hill County and to the north had some pretty good rains. I think there was some 75bushel corn, and I believe there will be 3,800- to 4,000-pound sorghum. With the current price scenario, they can probably do a little better than break even on that.'

But for most of the state, the dryland situation was just plain dismal, he said. From Uvalde (South Central Texas) north to Spearman (the upper Panhandle), nearly all dryland crops have failed, he said. There is not going to be much of anything harvested on dryland fields in the southwest Texas area, the Edwards Plateau, the Rolling Plains and the High

It almost looks desert-like, he said. "You can't even tell they planted anything," Miller said.

#### Texas Crop & Weather

The following specific livestock, crop and weather conditions were reported by Panhandle Extension directors: THot, dry and windy weather continued. A few southeastern counties received some moisture in isolated areas, but accumulations weren't significant. Soil-moisture levels in most counties were very poor. Water-demand by crops was very high, and irrigators continued to divert water to other crops and fewer acres. Corn was in poor to very poor condition. Mite populations in corn were rising because of the hot, windy conditions. Cotton was in poor to very poor condition in most counties. Rangeland and pastures further declined. Reduction of herds by producers was ongoing.

### Pampa Social Security Office to Begin Closing at 3:30 p.m.

Effective August 15, 2011, the Pampa Social Security office will be open to the public Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. – a reduction of 30 minutes each weekday.

While agency employees will continue to work their regular hours, this shorter public window will allow them to complete face-to-face service with the visiting public without incurring the cost of overtime. Congress provided Social Security with nearly \$1 billion less than the President requested for the budget this fiscal year, which makes it impossible for the agency to provide the amount of overtime needed to handle service to the pub-

lic as we have in the past. Most Social Security services do not require a visit to an office. For example, anyone wishing to apply for benefits, sign up for direct deposit, replace a Medicare card, obtain a proof of income letter or inform us of a change of address or telephone number may do so at www.socialsecurity.gov or by dialing our toll-free number, 1-800-772-1213. People who are deaf or hard of hearing may call our TTY number, 1-800-325-0778.

Texas, July 25- Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have risen 2.6 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.60/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has increased 2.0 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.69/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were \$1.05/g higher than the same day one year ago and are 13.7 cents per gallon higher than a month ago. The national average has increased 9.9 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 94.4 cents per gallon higher than this day







## Words from Faith & Grace

by Cecil R. Biggers, Lutheran Lay Minister

In the seventh week of Pentecost, we study Isaiah 55: 1-5, Psalm 145: 8-9, 14-21, Romans 9: 1-5, and Matthew 14: 13-21. We learn of God's utter faithfulness and the effect of God's Word on our lives.

Isaiah relates a call to the people to come and buy milk and wine without money and without price. Yet, he criticizes the people for spending their money on things that do not satisfy. What goes on here? God's grace has been given to his people. God provides them with all that they need to live, but they must act upon God's Word which has also been given to them. When we pursue our own paths and ways, we spend our lives, often on things that do not ultimately satisfy us. If we listen to God's Word, act upon it, then we are 'fed' with all that is necessary for us.

The Psalmist sings of the goodness of God. In this final Psalm of David, we hear of Yahweh's dominion and rule over his creation and Yahweh's nurture and care for all those who rely on him and his nurture and care for all creation. The psalm ends with a call for the individual, the community, and all to praise God for his steadfast love.

Paul, a Jew, trained as a rabbi, loved his people. Israel is loved of God. God gave to Israel the Torah, God's law, God's instruction for living. God gave to Israel the worship of the temple where a believer could experience the presence of God. God gave to Israel through Abraham, Isaac, Jacob covenants to be his people. God gave Israel the traditions passed down from generation to generation about the relationship of God to Israel. Yet, most of the people of Israel in Paul's day could not accept or believe in Jesus as the Christ, while the Gentiles eagerly accepted the teachings. Paul, like Moses, wishes that he could be accursed if it would lead the rest of his people to Jesus the Christ. The first century church was not anti-Semitic, it prayed for the ability to convert all of Israel.

Jesus teaches the disciples what it means to follow him, as we see the story of the feeding of the five thousand. Jesus had withdrawn to the less populated area of Galilee, but the crowds followed him. The crowd listened to his teachings and the hour grew late. The disciples were concerned for the crowd's needs and asked Jesus to send them home so they could get something to leat. Jesus asks the disciples to feed the people but they only had five loaves and two fish. Jesus prays, breaks the bread and tells the disciples to distribute the food. They do. Five thousand men and the accompanying women and children are fed. The disciples collected twelve baskets of broken pieces after the crowd was fed. We can view this a pure miracle; we can view this as a 'sacrament', everyone received a little something, but it was enough to sustain them; we can view this as a miracle of changing selfish people into sharing people. Each Jewish man of the period carried a small bag which would contain a little bread, a little cheese, perhaps a little dried fish, to sustain him on his work day. Perhaps the disciples' action in distributing their little bit of food prompted others to share. Regardless of how you view this event, it is a miracle. It teaches us that if we would live the disciple life then we must reveal Jesus the Christ to others in our everyday living.

May the Holy Spirit assure you of the steadfast love of God and enable you to reflect Jesus the Christ in your daily life.
