At the same time, CRC protects producers against loss from either/or/both low yields and low prices. Bankers and financial managers that understand the CRC program enthusiastically endorse this product. The MPCI program as it stands is not well designed for irrigated corn in the Texas Panhandle. The CRC program would offer a major improvement to MPCI as we know it and offer additional risk management strategies for irrigated corn farmers at a nominal cost.
