

Tuesday evening... Blizzard conditions bring Hansford County to a halt

When the storm blew in on Monday night it gave no indication of the crippling effects it would have on Hansford County through the Thanksgiving holiday.

Though blowing snow greeted everyone on Tuesday morning most Hansford County residents started off the day as usual, Spearman and Gruver children were off to school and others were off to work. But it soon became apparent that the storm wasn't going to let up and Spearman and Gruver schools were let out around 11 a.m. Pringle-Morse C.I.S.D. had closed Tuesday morning before classes. All of the Hansford County schools remained closed on Wednesday.

As the storm persisted, more and more business throughout the county closed early and activity in Hansford County seemed to come to a halt by Tuesday Evening. That is all activity but that of the individuals that worked to try to keep the roads passable and other individuals that were trying to get to stranded motorist.

night on Tuesday trying to keep the main streets passable. He added that they didn't have a lot of success with the wind blowing the way it was. He went on to explain that they try to clean Seventh, 11th, Fifth, Third and Bernice (around the schools and hospital first because these are the streets that are the most travelled

When asked about the cleanup McWilliams said, "It's gone pretty well so far. It is just a slow recovery process." He added, "We are hoping that the weather holds and we don't get any more snow." He concluded that conversation by saying, "The public has been very good to us through this. We appreciate their cooperation.

McWilliams is not the only one who appreciated the publics help. Dwaine Weller, roadway maintenance supervisor three also committed, "The county helped us a whole bunch, as did individuals, the city, and just everybody. It was a community wide effort to get the streets cleaned up." He added, "The

help was greatly appreciated." Weller said that he had people running 24 hours a day from Tuesday to Saturday, and on Sunday everybody went home around 5 p.m. "We started again Monday and it's been a continuing process every since." Weller estimated that the worse part of the storm was in the south eastern part of the county. He ex-

plained by saying, "It was bad everywhere but that is where we got the biggest drifts at."

While the storm was still raging on Tuesday evening there were many, many other individuals trying to get to stranded motorists (one of which was me). Spearman Volunteer Firemen Mike Davis, Randall Sauer, Ron Antalek and Keith Goodman along with individuals Scott Davis and Truman Wright reach my stranded vehicle around midnight.

After following a county maintainer back into town and delivering me to safety, the Spearman Volunteer Firemen continued their rescue efforts throughout the night. According to Sauer they were out until after 5 a.m. on Wednesday morning. There were many other individuals who lent a helping hand to help neighbors and friends, according to various members of the community.

People were not the only thing effected by the storm. According to livestock owners in the area, the storm had a big impact on their animals.



Spearman Public Works Director Jim McWilliams estimated that drifts ranged from three to eight foot tall across the streets. "There were a lot for three and four foot drifts," he stated.

According to McWilliams there was crews out working most of the



Gruver Police Report During the reporting period from Wednesday, Oct. 28, to Monday, Nov. 30, the Gruver Police Department filed 25 reports.


These reports include four reports for unlocking vehicles, one report to unlock a home, two funeral escorts and one message delivered.





The HARD SAYINGS OF JESUS Matthew 5:27-48

Many people read, or hear quoted, the teachings of Jesus and marvel at their beauty and simplicity. This is especially true of the Sermon on the Mount. But Jesus did not speak to thrill our sense of the poetic and romantic, although He does. He spoke to reveal God, our hearts and our need for salvation.

If you thoroughly consider the Sermon on the Mount, you see that the demands of Jesus are much like a circus owner requiring a drunk, fat lady to ride a unicycle across the high wire in a strong windwithout a net. God's requirements for entering heaven are humanly impossible to achieve. There are 3 possible responses to Jesus's demands. Two of them are deadly. Only one leads to life.

First, like the Pharisees, we can think that our best is good enough for God. It's not. The Bible says our best performance is like a filthy rag, unacceptable to God. Or, like the woman caught in adultery (John 8). we can despair of ever being good enough, and let our natural wickedness drag us off to death.

The only response that leads to life is faith in the person and performance of Jesus. God will not lower the standards (perfection) to enter heaven. The difference between us and the tottering fat lady on the high wire is that we can operate with a safety net. We must "work out our salvation with fear and trembling," but we have a safety net, the mercy of God







GTE Southwest Incorporated (GTESW) and Contel of Texas Inc. (Contel) have filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to seek approval to provide two new private line services and to change rates for existing services. GTE's intraexchange DS1 Service will be offered pursuant to the rates proposed with this filing and will no longer be available through concurrence with GTE's interLATA access tariff rates which are lower. Contel's intraexchange DS1/DDS Service will be offered pursuant to the rates proposed with this filing and will no longer be available through Contel's current private line tariff rates Existing customers with DS1/DDS Services will not be affected by these rate changes. DS1 1.544 Megabits per second (Mbps) Service and Digital Data Service (DDS) will normally be used for the transmission of data comm or large volumes of voice communications between two locations. These services are optional and will not affect the existing rates of customers who do not order these services. The estimated annual effect on GTE-SW's revenues in the first year is \$1, 080, 567. The estimated annual effect on Contel's revenues in the first year are \$42, 383.

DS1 Service

DS1 Service is an intraLATA Private Line Service which provides a dedicated, high capacity channel which may be used for simultaneous two-way transmission of voice data or other digitally encoded customer information signals. DS1 Service provides a transmission speed of 1.544 Mbps and is designed to provide an average performance of at least 95 percent error-free seconds of transmission over a continuous 24-hour period.

DS1 Service is available in and between all exchanges of GTE-SW and Contel where digital facilities exist. DS1 Service is available on a point-to-point intraLATA basis between two Customer Designated Locations (CDL), between Serving Wire Center (SWC) and a CDL, between a CDL and a point of nection with another service provider or between two SWCs

IntraLATA DS1 Private Line Service is comprised of three rate elements: DS1 Local Loop, DS1 Transport and DS1 Transport Termination. Each element is described below.

DS1 Local Loop

This rate element is for the cable facilities from the CDL to the SWC. The customer has two payment options for the purchase of DS1 Local Loops. There is a month-to-month plan or term contract Optional Payment Plan (OPP).

The month-to-month payment basis allows the customer to establish and disconnect DS1 Services, without penalty, other than to meet the minimum service interval of one month's service, as needed. Under the month-to-month service, the additional DS1 Local Loop rate applies only when the additional DS1 Local Loop (s) is (are) ordered at the same time and between the same two CDLs as the first DS1 Local Loop.

The OPP plan allows the customer to select a term of service (1 YR, 3 YR and 5 YR) with lower monthly rates associated with longer term contracts. If the customer selects an OPP, additional DS1 Local Loops may be ordered and installed at the Additional DS1 Local Loop rate between any SWC and CDL covered by the OPP, at any time during the term of that OPP.

DS1 Transport

This rate element is for the mileage sensitive charges for transporting a DS1 signal between Serving Wire Centers. Transport occurs only when the two CDLs being connected are served by two different SWCs.

DS1 Transport Termination

As we approach the season of Advent, the four Sundays preceding Christmas, may we focus upon the significance of the two parts comprising this traditional sacred observance of Jesus Christ's coming.

The first two Sundays in Advent feature the second coming of Jesus, the King, in glory. The tone is vigilant, yet somber, as we are reminded of the execution of His disciple, John the Baptist, after he prophesied, "For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah . . ." (Matt.3:2-3).

In contrast, the third and fourth Sundays in Advent feature the miracle of Jesus' first coming . . . the humble Virgin Birth. "Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son . . ." (Matt.18:23). Expectation and joy mount!

Thus, through this holy season, with the lighting of the Advent candles, may we realize afresh the meaning of these words . . . "As Christ came once in humility, so he will come again in glory."
