Groundwater half of the annual cost of the Board of Directors voted to begin an educational/informational program on weather modification and cloud seeding. This meeting was also amended by the Board of Directors of the Panhandle Ground Water Conservation District in anticipation of initiating a weather modification program simultaneously for both Districts, thereby saving both Districts money. At the same meeting, three members from the North Plains Groundwater Conservation District (NPGCD) and three members from the Panhandle Ground Water Conservation District were appointed to a joint weather modification program committee. The joint committee organized meetings across both Districts in an effort to inform and educate the public about weather modification programs and associated costs.

Not only does field bindweed over over 600,000 acres of Texas oss of over $\$ 50$ million a year, bui it's also a significant problem on lawns, roadsides, and abandoned sites across the state.
