

Weekly Update

Texas, October 22 - Average retail gasoline prices in Texas have fallen 7.9 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.42/g yesterday. This compares with the national average that has fallen 9.0 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.67/g, according to gasoline price website TexasGasPrices.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Texas during the past week, prices yesterday were 12.9 cents per gallon higher than the same day one year ago and are 16.0 cents per gallon lower than a month ago. The national average has decreased 14.2 cents per gallon during the last month and stands 20.1 cents per gallon higher than this day one year ago.

"Only one other time in the last few years have we seen the national average drop so significantly in the course of just a week, and that other time was in May 2011," said GasBuddy.com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan. "Looking back at our data, we only see that prices dropped considerably more in autumn 2008 when the economy slipped into a recession. Given the circumstances with this latest weekly decrease- that it has nothing to do with recession- is significant," DeHaan said.

4-H Livestock Judges Place 1st at Tri-State

Continuing their preparations for the national contest at the American Royal in Kansas City, the Hansford County 4-H livestock judging team competed at the Tri-State Fair contest held in Amarillo.

Before I get to those results, I'd like to say a big thank you to the parents, coaches, teachers, families, and friends of the senior team for being so understanding while we train them for nationals. The kids have all pretty much given up their normal lives until November 2nd so they can do well at this very important contest. They've already traveled many miles, been gone many days, and seen a whole lot of livestock, with much more to go. Please continue to be patient during our preparations. We want to do our very best and make Hansford County proud. Also thank you to my fellow coaches, their families and employers. They are working

Now, to the Tri-State contest. The senior team had an impressive day, winning first in cattle, sheep, and swine while finishing second in reasons. Hansford had the high team overall, with Hermitage County (the reigning Arkansas state champion), placing second.

In the individual awards, Travis Stedje placed 2nd overall. He also received honors for 2nd in cattle, 3rd in swine, and 9th in both sheep and reasons. Callie Stedje finished 3rd overall, placing 2nd in sheep and 3rd in reasons. Audrey Lieb won /th overall with a 3rd place finish in cattle and a 9th in swine. Jennifer Crowl placed 4th in swine. Jaci Burgin was recognized for 1st in sheep, 8th in swine and 10th in reasons. Rayel Anderson placed 4th in cattle and 6th in sheep.

In the junior division, Hansford County had seven students make the trip. The junior team placed 1st in sheep, 2nd in swine, 4th in cattle, and 2nd place overall team.

Individually, Jonathon Crowl kept his medalist streak alive, winning 1st in sheep, 3rd in cattle, 10th in swine, and was named the high individual overall for the third contest in a row. Tyler Stedje placed 3rd in swine, 9th in cattle, 10th in sheep, and 3rd overall. Kaycee Anderson was recognized for 9th in sheep. Reed Anderson won 12th in swine. Maggie Davis placed 7th in swine in her first contest. Carter Burgin and Kaitlyn Stedje also competed for Hansford County.

The team is coached by Bret Burgin, Nick Slough, and County Extension Agent Burt Williams.

tacked by two dogs in the south east part of Spearman. The victim sustained injuries to his

legs and arm, requiring treatment and Shots were fired at the dogs wounding

As of Saturday evening both of the dogs involved in the attack of the man near the soccer field were captured. One of the dogs is in the Spearman Animal Shelter, the other is at the Vet clinic. Both dogs are under a 10 day quarantine. The results of the investigation will be turned over to the Municipal Judge to determine the final disposition of the dogs.

The attack on Saturday is the second dog attack on a person here in Spearman within the last thirty days. Each reported dog attack has been from a dog that has a known owner, not a stray.

It is imperative that dog owners do everything possible to restrain their dogs. Do not take it for granted that your dog will not harm someone. Please get your animals vaccinated for rabies and other preventable diseases.

Animal Control Officer Mahaffe han dles 25 to 30 dogs a month, and handles an average of 250 calls from citizens a month. Unemployment

Texas Workforce Commission on Oct. 19 reported Texas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate fell to 6.8 percent in September, down from 7.1 percent in

August. Texas added 21,000 seasonally adjusted nonfarm jobs in September for a total of 262,700 jobs added since last year, the Commission reported, and the state's unemployment rate is down more than a point, from 7.9 percent a year ago.

"We saw encouraging signs in our state's labor market in September and a decrease in the unemployment rate last month," said Texas Workforce Commission Chairman Andres Alcantar. "Texas continues to add jobs and we now have a record number of people employed in our state.'

The U.S. Department of Labor Statistics calculated the national unemployment rate at 7.8 percent for the month of September.

Words from Faith & Grace

by Cecil R. Biggers, Lutheran Lay Minister

In the twenty-second week of the Season of Pentecost we learn something of God's redemption for all believ ers; we learn the author of that redemption is Christ; and, we learn that Christ can reverse our reality for the better. We study Jeremiah 31: 7-14, Psalm 126, Hebrews 7: 23-28, and Mark 10: 46-52.


Jeremiah is not an upbeat book but this week's lesson is from the "little book of consolation" (chs. 31-33) and is meant to give hope to the exiles in Babylon. Jeremiah assures the exiles that the Lord is going to lead them home; and, they will have an abundance of good things. God is preparing a second 'Exodus'. It is hard to remember that God is with you always when you are beat down and oppressed. But God's presence is always with us; we must learn to be aware even in despair.

The Psalmist sings a song of restoration. The Lord redeemed his people. The people feel as if they live in a dream. "May those who sow in tears reap with shouts of joy." God's restoration is a radical reversal of reality. It is right to praise God even when things are not so well with us; it is right to praise God when we live the dream.

The writer of Hebrews continues his description of Jesus The Christ as our great high priest. Our high priest is holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Jesus is the great high priest because he is not subject to death; Jesus offers salvation perpetually. Jesus is also 'sacrifice' because he sacrificed once for all times. Through God's grace in sending us Jesus The Christ to die for us, we are redeemed and our sins are forgiven. Christ was made 'perfect' in suffering. Learn from this that we can approach God boldly in prayer for Christ intercedes for us as the 'perfect' high priest.

Mark tells the story of Bartimaeus, the blind man. As Jesus journeys to Jerusalem, he passes through Jericho and Bartimaeus cries loudly, over and over, "My Teacher, let me see again!" Jesus calls for him and declares, "Go, your faith has made you well." Note that Bar-timaeus means son of Timeaeus (often in the gospels phrases from the Aramaic are translated again for the reader; hence, we have Bartimaeus, son of Timaeus.) Bartimaeus was persistent in calling on Jesus name, was immediate in his response to Jesus and when he was healed, he followed Jesus. A blind man recognized Jesus as the Messiah, is this a commentary on the lack of faith of those who were sighted?

May the Holy Spirit increase your faith that you may be restored and made whole so that you can lead others to our Lord.


