Summer TAAS and **TEAMS Tests Scheduled**

The 1999 Summer TAAS (Texas Assessment of TAAS or the TEAMS to fulfill graduation require-Academic Skills) and the TEAMS (Texas Assessment of Minimum Skills) exit level tests will be given in July at Spearman High School, 403 East 11th Street, for 10th-, 11th, and 12th-grade students as well as out-of-school students who have not passed some or all portions of those tests.

Dates for the TAAS are: Writing, July 13th; Math, July 14th; Reading, July 15th. The test will be given in the high school teacher's workroom at 8:30

Dates for the TEAMS are: Math, July 14th, English Language Arts, July 15th.

Only students who are not currently enrolled in Spearman High School who still need to pass the ments must preregister for the tests.

Registration packets are available from the counseling office at SHS and the Region XVI Education Service Center. Testing site addresses and times are listed in a directory included in each regis-

The registration form must be completed and returned in the pre-addressed envelope and must be received in Iowa City, Iowa, no later than 5 p.m. on June 12, 1999. The forms should be sent by registered mail. Students preregistering for the TEAMS or TAAS must have a picture identification for each testing day in order to be able to take the tests.
