If the adult who signs the application does not have a social security number, the household member must indicate that able by writing the word "NONE" The application must be signed by an adult household member.
Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy food service director will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians dissatisfied with the ruling of the official may wish to discuss the decision with malbasis.
